

Walker Todd, outspoken banking insider

- Todd raised an early red flag about the oversight of dubious lending practices and the threat to U.S. taxpayers prior to the economic crisis.
- An attorney and economic consultant in private practice, Todd also serves as a research fellow and conference organizer for the American Institute for Economic Research.
- For many years, Todd was a legal officer at the Federal Reserve Bank of New York and a legal and research officer at the Cleveland Federal Reserve Bank.
- Walker Todd, Ph.D., J.D., authored numerous publications on banking, central banking, monetary and property rights topics, including those related to international debt, the International Monetary Fund and the regulation of the banking system and financial markets.



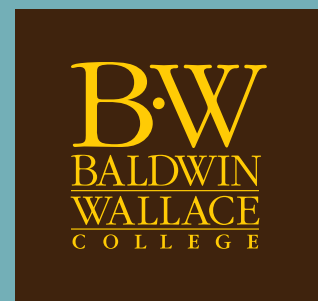
