Required Exams for Initial Teaching License:

State Teachers Examination (Praxis II): *Principles of Learning & Teaching*

American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL): *Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI)*
Writing Proficiency Test (WPT)

Students who intend to teach a foreign language are required to spend at least one academic semester or a total of 15 weeks abroad studying the language for which they seek licensure. Although we suggest spending the entire time in one extended visit, students may combine visits to reach the total as long as one visit is a minimum of 8 weeks long. The program and projected plan of study should be approved by the student's academic advisor in the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures prior to enrolling in a program.

Prescribed courses as listed for this license represent B-W "Model Program" for license. Two common exceptions to this model program include: (1) If a student seeks a college major in German then additional course work may be required. (2) Substitutions in the model program may be approved only by the Chairman, Division of Education, Baldwin-Wallace College.
