Also, students are <u>not</u> required to take a course in each 300-level category. Any combination of courses with the numbers 305, 308, 316(I,D), 335I, 336(I,D), 463(I,D) satisfies the "Advanced Studies" requirement.			
*If ENG 305 or ENG 308 was used to fulfill the Writing requirement, it may not be used to fulfill the Advanced Studies requirement as well.
