2009 NCAA DIVISION III MEN'S AND WOMEN'S CROSS COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS QUALIFIERS

INDIANAPOLIS---The NCAA Division III Men's and Women's Track and Field Committee announced today the team and individual qualifiers for the 2009 Division III Men's and Women's Cross Country Championships.

In order to be eligible to participate in the championships, teams and individuals must qualify in their respective NCAA regions.

Thirty-two teams were selected to participate in each championship. The top two, seven-person teams automatically qualified from each of the eight regions, for a total of 16 teams. Sixteen additional teams were selected at-large.

Fifty-six individuals, the first seven athletes from each region who are not a part of a qualifying team, were selected to participate in each championship.

Baldwin-Wallace College will host the championships, November 21, at Highland Hills Golf Course in Highland Hills, Ohio. The women's race will begin at 11 a.m. Eastern time followed by the men's race at noon Eastern time.

In 2008, the State University of New York at Cortland men's team captured its first championship, hosted by Hanover College. They finished with 80 points to defeat runner-up North Central College, which finished with 115 points.

On the women's side, Middlebury College defeated Calvin College to win their fifth championship. Middlebury totaled 179 points to Calvin's 237.

Individual honors went to Marie Borner of Bethel University (Minnesota) who won the individual title, finishing 9 seconds ahead of Amherst College's Elise Tropicano. In the men's championship, individual honors went to Peter Kosgei of Hamilton College. Kosgei, who finished second in 2007, finished 10 seconds ahead of Willy Kaul of the University of Wisconsin, Oshkosh.
