The **BALDWIN-WALLACE COLLEGE YELLOW JACKET** men's basketball team travels to Meadville, Pennsylvania for its third straight road contest of the season when it plays the Gators of Allegheny (Pa.) College in a non-league game in the David V. Wise Center at 8:00 p.m. This is the second game of a women's and men's doubleheader.

RADIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, broadcasts all Yellow Jacket men's and women's games, home and away. The games also can be heard via the WBWC's Internet Web site at www.wbwc.com. The pregame show begins 15 minutes prior to tipoff. Pre-game Setup -- The Baldwin-Wallace College men's basketball team will look to improve to 3-1 when it travels to Meadville, Pennsylvania to play the Allegheny College Gators.

The Yellow Jackets enter this game at 2-1 overall following their 78-39 win against Waynesburg (Pa.) University on November 22 in Waynesburg. B-W opened its season by beating the Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University, 73-60, on Nov.. 15 in Berea, and then lost at Bethany (W.Va.) College, 72-65, on Nov.. 18.

Allegheny enters this game 2-4 overall following a 99-75 loss to host the University of Rochester (NY.) on Nov.. 27 in the Championship Game of the Rochester Holiday Inn Airport Tournament. The Gators opened the tourney with a 65-48 win against Elmira (N.Y.) College. In addition, AC lost its season-opener to Bethany, 80-62, on Nov. 15 in Meadville, beat Pitt-Bradford (Pa.), 79-53, on Nov.. 18 in the first round of its own tournament and then lost 91-89 to NAIA rival Point Park (Pa.) University in the finals.

The All-Time Series Between B-W and Allegheny -- This is the fourth all-time meeting between B-W and Allegheny in men's basketball. The Gators lead the all-time series, 2-1. The Gators won the first two meetings in the series, including a 97-88 win in the first round of the 1998 NCAA Division III National Tournament in Berea. B-W won the last meeting between the two teams, 89-66, on November 26, 2005 in Meadville.

In the Last B-W versus Allegheny Game on Nov.. 26, 2005 in Allegheny: B-W -- 89, Allegheny (Pa.) -- 66 -- The last time these two teams faced off was on November 26, 2005 in the first round of the Allegheny Tournament. The Yellow Jackets defeated the Gators, 89-66, as junior Division III All-American forward Tori Davis scored 19 points.

The Baldwin-Wallace College Starters and Information -- B-W returned 10 lettermen and four starters from its 2010-11 team.

Look for Head Coach Duane Sheldon to give 10-to-12 players court time. He will start 6'6" sophomore **Kyle Payne (Brunswick)**, 6'2" junior **Ben Umbel (Poland/ Seminary via Youngstown State University)** and 6'7" sophomore **Tyler Ferrell (Brunswick)** at the forward positions. In the backcourt, look for senior All-OAC point guard **Promis Cabbil (Elyria/ Senior)** and 6'4" sophomore **Kevin Krakowiak (Valley City/ Parma Heights Holy Name)** to start. **Payne** leads the team in scoring with 13.3 points-per-game and shares the lead in rebounding with 6.0 rpg. **Krakowiak** is second with 12.3 ppg., grabs 2.7 rpg. and has five three-pointers. **Ferrell** scores 6.3 ppg. and grabs 5.7 rpg. **Cabbil** scores 3.3 ppg., grabs 1.3 rpg. and is tied for second with seven assists. **Umbel** scores 5.3 ppg., grabs 5.0 rpg., also has seven assists and tops the team with nine steals.

Off the bench, Sheldon has played 6'0" red-shirt freshman guard **Jaron Crowe (Mentor)**, 6'6" junior forward **Chris Ameen (Broadview Heights/ Walsh Jesuit)**, 6'8" sophomore center **Aaron Selmek (Delaware/ Columbus St. Francis DeSales)**, 6'1" sophomore guard **Grant Fairhurst (Ashland)**, 6'3" junior guard **Brandon Schmidt (Wellington)**, 6'3" junior forward **Scott Branchick (Mentor)** and 6'5" junior forward **Sean Rothermel (Delaware/ Hayes)**. **Crowe** scores 6.0 ppg., grabs 2.5 rpg. and has a team-leading nine steals. **Ameen** scores 6.3 ppg. and is tied with Payne for the most rebounds with 6.0 rpg. **Fairhurst** is third with 8.3 ppg. and has a team-leading eight triples.

Allegheny (Pa.) Information and Probable Starters -- After six games, Allegheny scores 72.0 ppg. and allows 73.3 ppg. for a minus 1.3 ppg. differential. The Gators grab 33.3 rpg. and allow 33.5 rpg. for a minus 0.2 rpg. differential. The Gators shoot 49.7 percent from the floor (164-of-330 attempts), including 40.0 percent from three-point range (40-of-100) and 66.7 percent from the foul line (64-of-96).

Look for Head Coach Jim Driggs to start 5'10" sophomore D'Andre Corbin and 6'0" junior guard Devone McLeod in the backcourt and 6'4" sophomores Bobby Theiss and Ryan Stanko and 6'6" senior James Ness at the forwards. To date, Ness tops the Gators in scoring at 17.7 ppg., rebounding 7.7 rpg. and blocked shots with three. He also shoots 66.1% on 39-of-59 attempts and 75.7% from the foul line on 28-of-37 attempts. McLeod is second at 13.5 ppg., grabs 2.7 rpg., second on the team with 23 assists and has recorded one steal and shoots 34.5% from three-point land on 10-of-29 attempts. Stanko scores 12.0 ppg., grabs 3.8 rpg. and has a team-leading 16 three-pointers. Corbin scores 7.8 ppg., grabs 2.8 rpg. and leads the team with 34 assists. Theiss scores 3.0 ppg., grabs 2.7 rpg., also has two steals.

Off the bench, Driggs has played 6'3" freshman guard David Dibernardi, 6'3" sophomore forward Clark Tritto, 6'5" freshman forward Brandon Smith, 6'1" junior guard Kyle Murphy, 5'8" freshman guard Justin Bilyk, 6'0" sophomore guard John O'Donnell and 6'3" sophomore forward Marco Corona. Dibernardi scores 5.4 ppg., grabs 1.8 rpg. and has three steals. Tritto scores 3.5 ppg. and grabs 3.3 rpg. Smith scores 3.5 ppg. and has one blocked shot.

Yellow Jacket Chatter

Yellow Jackets Heading to Kentucky During Winter Break -- The Yellow Jackets travel to Lexington, Kentucky the week before Christmas to participate in the Transylvania (Ky.) University Don Lane Classic. B-W plays Wasbash (Ind.) College on Dec. 20 at 5:30 p.m. and then play either Transylvania (Ky.) or Hendrix (Tenn.) College on Dec. 21 at 5:00 or 7:00 p.m.

B-W Picked to Finish Seventh in OAC -- B-W is picked by the Ohio Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Coaches to finish seventh this season.

Early Road Games -- The Yellow Jackets play eight of their first ten games on the road. After a season opening win at the "friendly confines" of the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium in the Lou Higgins Center in Berea on Tuesday, November 15 versus Case Western Reserve University, the Yellow Jackets hit the road for three non-conference matchups. B-W opens OAC play at home on Saturday, December 3 versus Marietta at 3:00 p.m.. After that game, the Yellow Jackets will be on the road for five games. B-W will not play at home until Friday, December 30 when they host non-conference opponent Alma (Mich.) College at 7:00 p.m.

Two Doubleheaders to be Televised by SportsTime Ohio -- Two B-W women's and men's basketball doubleheaders will be televised this winter on regional cable television giant SportsTime Ohio. The two DHs are the Saturday, January 28 doubleheader versus Wilmington College and the Saturday, February 18 Seniors' Day doubleheader versus Ohio Northern University.
