Yellow Jacket Sports Report

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College fall sports season is going very well. The 10 Yellow Jacket fall teams have a combined 156-76 record with a solid .672 winning percentage entering tonight's action. Nine of our 10 teams have winning record with four of the teams having completed fall action. They are the men's and women's tennis and men's and women's golf squads.

The women's soccer team was 8-7 overall and 1-4 in the Ohio Athletic Conference prior to last night's match with the University of Mount Union. Sophomore forward **Heather Keller (Parma)** has a team-best-tying four goals and five assists for 13 points to lead the team in scoring. Senior midfielder **Lindsey Cooper (Westererville/ New Albany)** and sophomore **Rachel Gokey (Seville/ Lodi Cloverleaf)** are second on the team with nine points each. The next home match is this Saturday, October 22 when the team hosts the Quakers of Wilmington College in the first game of an OAC and SportsTime Ohio doubleheader at 4:30 p.m.

The football team, 5-1 and 4-1 in the OAC, defeated Ohio Northern University, 20-6, last Saturday on Homecoming. Senior linebacker **Brett Thompson (Shelby)** was named the *Frank Rapollo Player of the Game* after setting the school and The George Finnie Stadium-record with a 95-yard interception return for a touchdown. Senior defensive end **Derron Hamilton (Euclid)** leads Division III in quarterback sacks with 11. Junior running back **Tyler Lohr (Kent/ Roosevelt)** leads the team in rushing with 641 yards and had his third straight 100-yard plus game against Ohio Northern. The team returns to action this Saturday, Oct. 22 when it will travel to Wilmington to play the Quakers of Wilmington College at Townsend Field in Williams Stadium at 1:30 p.m. The next home game is on Saturday, Oct. 29 when B-W hosts the Fighting Muskies of Muskingum University on Professor Appreciation Day at 1:30 p.m.

The volleyball team was 14-11 overall and 2-3 in the OAC prior to its match last night at Mount Union. Junior outside hitter **Amanda Sawicki (Mentor/ Lake Catholic)** leads the offense and is second in the OAC with 309 kills. Junior setter **Natalie Emmons (Ashland)** anchors the defense and is third in the OAC with 479 digs. The next home match is on Tuesday, Oct. 25 when the team hosts cross-town rival John Carroll University in its annual "Dig Pink" match in the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium in the Lou Higgins Center at 7:00 p.m.

The men's and women's cross country teams competed in its fifth meet of the season at the Oberlin College Inter-Regional last Saturday. The men finished 16th of 34 schools and the women were sixth of 33 teams. Junior **Ken Janosko (Mentor)** led the men and placed sixth of 315 runners. He has led the Yellow Jackets in each of their five meets this fall. Junior **Lauren McGaughey (Allison Park, Pa/ Hampton)** paced the women with a 22nd place finish. It was her first team top finish this season. Each team returns to action on Saturday, Oct. 29 when they travel to Ada to compete in the 2011 OAC Championship Meet hosted by Ohio Northern at 11:00 a.m.

The men's and women's swimming and diving teams open their season next Saturday, Oct. 29 when the teams play host to the Quakers of Wilmington College in an OAC dual meet at 4:00 p.m.

The Yellow Jacket wrestling team begins action under first-year Head Coach Jamie Gibbs with a dual match against Case Western Reserve University on Nov. 11 at 7:30 p.m. in the Ursprung Gym.

The men's and women's basketball seasons kickoff on Tuesday, Nov. 15 with a doubleheader in the Ursprung Gym at 6:00 (men's game) and 8:00 p.m. (women's game), respectively.

Yellow Jacket Men's Soccer Team Hosts Mount Union In OAC Showdown

BEREA, OHIO -- The 20th-ranked (*D3Soccer.com*) Baldwin-Wallace College men's soccer team, 13-2 and 4-1 in the Ohio Athletic Conference, plays host to the University of Mount Union Purple Raiders, 7-5-2 overall and 2-1-2 in the OAC, in an OAC match on the Tressel Field at the George Finnie Stadium.

The Yellow Jackets enter this match ranked fourth in the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region. B-W won a school-record 13 straight matches before falling last Saturday to Ohio Northern University, 2-1. During the 13-match winning streak, B-W outscored their opposition, 40-9, including four shutouts in five matches.

B-W is led by **Carlin Vandendriessche** with a team and OAC-best 12 goals, 28 points and six game winning goals. **Vandendriessche** is also tied for 16th and 18th nationally in goals and points respectively. **Pat Brennan** and **Kirk Graf** are second on the team with seven goals apiece. **Brennan** lead the team and OAC with a career-best seven assists and he ranks second on the team and fourth in the OAC with 21 points. **Graf** is currently third on the team and sixth in the OAC with a career-best 19 points. He has career-highs in goals and assists (5) on the season.

The defense is anchored by netminder **Ryan Hulings**, who has started in 14 matches and has a record of 12-2, with 43 saves and four shutouts. He has allowed 1.05 goals per game to rank fourth in the OAC.

Mount Union comes into the match after splitting a pair of OAC matches last week. The Purple Raiders fell to John Carroll, 2-1, on October 12 and shutout Heidelberg University, 1-0, last Saturday.

Mount Union is led by Thomas Beck with 24 points on 10 goals and four assists and Chris Motley with 10 points on four goals and two assists.

In net, Jon Critell has appeared in all 14 games with 64 saves and a 1.04 goals-per-game average.

The Yellow Jackets will conclude their home portion of the schedule on Saturday, October 22 when they will host the Quakers of Wilmington College on Seniors' and Parents' Night at 7:00 p.m.

B-W conclude the regular season schedule with matches at John Carroll University on Tuesday, October 25 at 4:00 p.m. and then at Muskingum University on Saturday, October 29 at 3:00 p.m. Enjoy tonight's match!
