In 2008, Pete helped B-W to tournament titles at the Penn-State Behrend and at Ohio Athletic Conference versus Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association Challenge. He has appeared in 44 career matches, scored two goals for four points and has taken 10 total shots. Pete scored his first career goal against Mt. St. Joseph's during his junior season and added another goal this season. During his four seasons in the Brown & Gold, the Yellow Jackets have compiled a 51-20-6 record. He is the son of Mike and Ellen Childerson of Alliance.



**Noah Eubanks** is a pre-physical therapy/pre-med and exercise science triple major from West Bloomfield, Michigan and is a graduate of West Bloomfield High School. He is a forward who will earn his fourth varsity letter this fall. Noah has been a valuable four-year starter. As a freshman, Noah helped B-W to tournament titles at the Penn-State Behrend and OAC/MIAA Invitational. Noah scored a career-high two goals and three assists during his junior season. He has appeared in 69 career matches, scored four goals, had six assists, tallied 14 career points and has taken 63 total shots. **Leanne Kasburg** is a political science major from Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio and a graduate of Cuyahoga Falls High School. She will earn her fourth varsity letter this fall as a forward. As a sophomore in 2009-2010, Leanne had her best season as a collegian as she played in a career-high 19 matches, took seven shots and scored two goals. For her career, she has appeared in 63 matches, taken 17 shots and scored two goals. Leanne is an outstanding student who carries a 3.53 grade point average and is a candidate for both Academic All-OAC and CAPITAL ONE Academic All-District IV honors. **Sean Maloney** is a finance, broadcasting and mass communications double major from North Versailles, Pennsylvania and is a graduate of East Allegheny High School. He will earn his his third varsity letter this fall as a midfielder/ defender. He has played in 35 career matches with an assist and he has taken six shots. Sean is an outstanding student who carries a 3.66 grade point average and was an Academic All-OAC choice a season ago. This fall, he is one of nine Yellow Jackets who are both Academic All-OSAC and CAPITAL ONE Academic All-District IV nominees. He also is a member of the Chi Alpha Sigma Honor Society and the Dean’s List and is a student assistant in the sports information office. Sean is the son of David and Cathy Maloney of North Versailles, Pennsylvania.



**Andy Thompson** is a business administration and economics major from Huron, Ohio and a graduate of Huron High School. He is a midfielder/ defender who has been a key member of the varsity the past four years and will earn his fourth varsity letter this fall. He enters tonight’s match tied with teammate Carlin Vandendriessche for the most matches played in a career (78). Andy has played a role on a Yellow Jacket defense that has recorded five shutouts and 14 wins this season to tie the school record for victories in a single season. As a junior in 2010-2011, Andy was selected second-team All-Ohio Conference. He played in all 22 games and scored one goal and added six assists. His top scoring season came as a sophomore when he had three goals and three assists for nine points. For his career, he has played in 78 matches, taken 69 shots, scored six goals and added 14 assists for 26 career points. Andy is the son of Chuck and Linda Thompson of Huron.



**Carlin Vandendriessche** is a international business and finance major from Medina, Ohio and a graduate of Medina High School. The high-scoring forward will earn his fourth varsity letter and probably his fourth All-Ohio Athletic Conference honor this season. Carlin enters tonight’s match as the most prolific scorer in Yellow Jacket history and is tied with Andy Thompson for the most matches played in school history with 78. He is B-W’s all-time leader in goals scored with 43 and career points leader with 95. He also has taken 227 career shots. Carlin needs one more goal and six more points to become the single-season record-holder in each category. Carlin is the son of Patrick and Sandra Vandendriessche of Medina.
