Mount Union and Capital advance to the NCAA Football Playoffs

Austintown, OH- Mount Union and Capital have advanced to the 2006 NCAA Division III Football Championship, beginning on Saturday, November 18. The 32-team bracket was announced Sunday, November 12.

Mount Union, who has won its 15th consecutive and 18th overall OAC Regular-Season title in 2006, is making its 15th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Playoffs. Overall, the Purple Raiders have made 17 trips to the NCAA Championship since 1985, resulting in eight national championships ('93, '96, '97, '98, '00, '01, '02, '05). The Raiders will look to defend their national title as they host Hope (MI) in the first round of the playoffs on Saturday, November 18 at noon.

Capital has earned one of the seven national at-large bids to the NCAA Division III Championship. The Crusaders ended the regular season 9-1 for the first time in school history and claimed second place in the OAC. Capital is making its second straight and third overall appearance in the NCAA playoffs. Capital will host Wittenberg in the first round of the playoffs on Saturday, November 18 at noon. Capital defeated Wittenberg in its season opener 57-7.

The winner of the Mount Union/ Hope game will face off against the winner of the Mount St. Joseph/Wheaton game, while the Capital/Wittenberg winner will face the Concordia/North Central winner in the second round of the playoffs on Saturday, November 25.

Heidelberg, Ohio Northern and Mount Union Men's Cross Country Teams Advance to Nationals

Austintown, OH- Heidelberg men's cross country team finished second of 31 teams competing at the 2006 Great Lakes Regional Championships on Saturday, November 11 at the L.S. Ayers Athletic Complex in Hanover, Indiana. The Regional was hosted by Hanover College. A total of 32 teams have advanced to the National meet on Saturday, November 18 at the Voice of America Park. The national meet will be hosted by Wilmington College. The top-35 finishers this past weekend have earned All-Region honors.



This will mark Heidelberg's fourth appearance at the national championship. Crossing the finish line for the Berg were All-Region performers **Scott Lasch (Huron)** who was sixth (25:49), **Dan Simpson (Leetonia)** who was ninth (25:57.7), **Jeremy Wysocki (Toledo/Central Catholic)** finished 19th (26:21.7) and **Devin Butcher (Bowling Green)** finished 25th (26:33.9).

Ohio Northern received one of the 16 at-large bids to compete at the national meet. This is Ohio Northern's first bid since 1977. The Polar Bears placed third of 31 teams. Ohio Northern had two runners earn All-Region honors, sophomore **Paul Lewis (Medina)** who was 13th (26:06) and sophomore **Thomas Adam (Cuyahoga Falls/Walsh Jesuit)** was 24th (26:31).

Mount Union also earned one of the 16 at-large bids to compete in the national meet. Mount Union placed fourth of 31 teams. The Raiders had three runners earn All-Region Honors, junior **Brian Bernard (Stow)**, who was 21st (26:24), sophomore **Dustin Ford (Canton/Perry)**, who placed 27th (26:35) and senior **Ryan Garro (Mogadore/Lake)** who was 33rd (26:47).

Ohio Northern Women's Cross Country Team Advances to Nationals

Ohio Northern women's cross country team received one of the 16 at-large bids to compete in the National meet held Saturday, November 18 at the Voice of America Park. The national meet is hosted by Wilmington College. This is the first time the Ohio Northern women's team has qualified for the NCAA championship. The Polar Bears finished fourth of 31 teams. The top-35 finishers have earned All-Region honors, including Ohio Northern senior **Elizabeth DiNino (Beavercreek/Carroll)** who finished 12th (22:57), senior **Darci Walthew (East Bethany, N.Y./Notre Dame)** who finished 15th (23:09) and senior **Jackie Kessler (Attica/Seneca East)** who finished 32nd (23:43).

Baldwin-Wallace's Scullion and Otterbein's Keesee Qualify for Nationals

In addition to the 32 teams being selected to advance to the NCAA Division III Women's Cross Country Championship hosted by Wilmington College on November 18 at the Voice of America Park, 52 individuals were also selected. Among those 52 individuals is Baldwin-Wallace sophomore **Ashley Scullion (Kentwood, MI/East Kentwood)** and Otterbein senior **Melinda Keesee (Dublin/Scioto)**. Scullion placed 16th (23:10.4) and the team placed ninth of 31 teams. Keesee placed ninth (22:47.1) and the team placed 13th of 31 teams. Both Scullion and Keesee have earned All-Region honors.

Four OAC Players Named 2006 AVCA All-Americans

Austintown, OH- The American Volleyball Coaches Association (AVCA) has announced the 26th annual AVCA All-American teams for NCAA Division III. The awards will be presented on November 15, 2006 at the NCAA Division III Women's National Championship banquet in Salem, VA.

Among the 2006 AVCA Division III Second-Team All-Americans is Capital senior outside hitter **Jordan Centers (Norwalk)**. Centers led the team in kills with 512 and was second in hitting percentage with .303. Center also earned Honorable-Mention in 2005. Capital junior middle blocker **Jessie Hampson (Lancaster)** has also been named 2006 AVCA Division III Second-Team All-American. Hampson is ranked 20th in the nation for her 1.48 blocks-per-game and led the Conference in hitting percentage with .338. Hampson also earned Second-Team honors in 2005.

Ohio Northern senior libero **Karlee Kanuckel (Warsaw)** and OAC Libero-of-the-Year earned AVCA All-American Third-Team honors. Kanuckel finished the season with 1,039 digs, which broke her own school record. Kanuckel also leads the country in digs per game with 8.54. She earned All-American honors in 2005.

Baldwin-Wallace senior setter **Angie Camp (Norwalk)** and OAC Sheila Wallace-Kovalchik Player-of-the-Year has earned All-American Honorable-Mention honors. Camp earned this honor in 2005. Camp is ranked seventh in the Conference with 1,176 assists and ninth for her .286 hitting percentage.

The above players also earned All-Great Lakes Region honors this season.

OFFENSE: Muskingum junior running back **Caleb Fuller (Fort Myers, FL/Dunbar)** rushed for a career-high 237 yards and two touchdown runs of 68 and 49 yards in the Muskies' 28-12 win over Heidelberg. Fuller also logged two kickoff returns for 71 yards.

DEFENSE: Ohio Northern junior linebacker **Lenny Trusnik (Macedonia/Nordonia)** had a team-high nine tackles, four of them solo tackles, one sack, and returned an interception 57 yards for a touchdown in the Polar Bears' 52-0 win over Wilmington.

SPECIAL: Baldwin-Wallace junior punter **Kevin Soflkiancs (Middelburg Heights/Midpark)** averaged 41 yards on four punts against Capital. Soflkiancs ended the season as the Division III punting average leader at 42.6.

Baldwin-Wallace senior **D.J. Mosiniak (Toledo/St. Francis De Sales)** was a three-time winner taking first in the 50 free (22.46), 100 free (51.17) and 400 free relay (3:24.78) versus Ohio Wesleyan. OAC ANNOUNCES 2006 WOMEN'S SOCCER SPECIAL AWARDS AND ALL-OAC TEAMS

Capital's Dwight Burgess Named OAC Coach-of-the-Year

Fifth-year Head Coach **Dwight Burgess** has been chosen by his peers as the 2006 OAC Women's Soccer Coach-of-the-Year. Burgess is the fourth Crusader to win this award. Burgess led Capital to its ninth OAC Tournament appearance this season as the number three seed with a 6-1-2 Conference mark and 11-7-4 overall record. Capital advanced to the championship, where the Crusaders claimed the automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament by advancing on sudden death penalty kicks over Otterbein. This was Capital's first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 1999.

Ohio Northern's Smith is Named OAC Forward-of-the-Year

Ohio Northern senior **Diana Smith (Fort Jennings)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Forward-of-the-Year. She is the first Polar Bear to win this award. Smith led the team in goals with 16, assists with eight and points with 40. Her 16 goals placed her at the top of the conference in goals, goals-per-game with .84, and with her eight assists she finished number one in the Conference with 2.11 points-per-game. Smith earned First Team All-OAC honors.

Wilmington's Fey is Named OAC Midfielder-of-the-Year

Wilmington junior forward **Nicky Fey (Pleasant Plain/Blanchester)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Midfielder-of-the-Year. She is the first Quaker to earn this honor. Fey is second on the team and seventh in the Conference in goals with nine and in points with 21. She is third on the team in assists with three and sixth in the Conference in goals per game with .50. Fey has also earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

Otterbein's Thompson is Named OAC Defender-of-the-Year

Otterbein senior **Lauren Thompson (Pickerington)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Defender-of-the-Year. She is the fourth Cardinal to win this award. Thompson and the Cardinal defense has lead the team to 14 shutouts on the season and a Conference high .28 goals-against-average (six goals). Thompson is also leading the team in points with 14 (five goals, four assists). She earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

Capital's Allan is Named the OAC Goalkeeper-of-the-Year

Capital senior **Courtney Allan (Sylvania/ South View)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Goalkeeper-of-the-Year. Allan won this award in 2004 and is the only Crusader to have garnered this honor. In 20 games and 1681 minutes of play, Allan was fourth in the OAC for her .96 goals-against-average and her .806 save percentage. She was also fourth in the OAC in shutouts with six. She earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

OAC ANNOUNCES 2006 MEN'S SOCCER SPECIAL AWARDS AND ALL-OAC TEAMS

Ohio Northern's Ridenour is Named OAC Coach-of-the-Year

Ninth-year Head Coach **Brent Ridenour** has been chosen by his peers as the 2006 OAC Men's Soccer Coach-of-the-Year. Ridenour is the second Polar Bear to win this award. This is also his second time winning this honor. Ridenour has led the Polar Bears to the OAC Tournament with a 6-1-2 Conference mark and a 15-2-5 overall record. The Polar Bears claimed their first-ever tournament title and have advanced to the NCAA Tournament for the first time.

Wilmington's Van der Sluijs is Named OAC Forward-of-the-Year

Wilmington senior **Alex Van der Sluijs (Dayton/Carroll)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Forward-of-the-Year. Van der Sluijs earned this honor in 2004 and is the only Quaker to have garnered this award. He leads the team and the Conference in points with 38, goals with 15, game-winning goals with six and assists with eight. Van der Sluijs also leads the Conference in points-per-game with 2.11, goals-per-game with .83 and is second in assists-per-game with .44. He also earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

Baldwin-Wallace's Rolko is Named OAC Midfielder-of-the-Year

Baldwin-Wallace senior **Louie Rolko (Hudson)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Midfielder-of-the-Year. This is Rolko's second straight time winning this award. He is the only Yellow Jacket to ever garner this honor. He is ranked eighth in the Conference in assists with five and helped to lead the Yellow Jackets to a 5-4 Conference mark and a 13-4-1 overall record. He earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

Otterbein's Mocas and Ohio Northern's Smith Are Named OAC Co-Defenders-of-the-Year

Otterbein junior **John-Mark Mocas (Bellbrook)** and Ohio Northern sophomore **Ryan Smith (Miamisburg)** have been named Co-Defenders-of-the-Year.

Mocas is the fifth Cardinal to win this award. He tallied three goals, one assist and seven points this season and helped lead the Cardinals to five shutouts. He earned First-Team All-OAC Honors.

Smith is the first Polar Bear to win this award. He helped the Polar Bears to their first OAC Tournament title and NCAA Tournament appearance. On the year, Smith led the team to 10 shutouts and a Conference high .60 goals-against-average, along with seven assists and seven points. He earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

Ohio Northern's Collins is Named the OAC Goalkeeper-of-the-Year

Ohio Northern sophomore **Aaron Collins (Dayton/Carroll)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Goalkeeper-of-the-Year. Collins is the first Polar Bear to earn this honor. In 15 games and 1389 minutes of play, Collins is at the top of the Conference for his .58 goals-against-average and his seven shutouts. He is second in the Conference in save percentage with .850. Collins has earned First-Team All-OAC honors.

According to the November 12th *Football Gazette* poll, Mount Union was first, Capital fifth, Baldwin-Wallace 34th...According to the November 7th AFCA poll, Mount Union was first, Capital ninth and Baldwin-Wallace received votes.

Baldwin-Wallace vs. Capital: L 19-7

7-3 Overall, 6-3 OAC; This Week: Season is complete; Last Week:: Lost to No.5-ranked Capital University, 19-7, at The George Finnie Stadium in Berea on Nov. 11: Notes: The Yellow Jackets had already clinched their 39th winning season in the last 40 years...Senior All-OAC and Academic All-OAC running back **Brandon Hedges (Oregon/ Clay)** finished second all-time in school history in rushing with 2,513 yards on a school-record 570 carries with 31 rushing touchdowns and 33 overall. He also caught 48 career passes for 430 yards and two TD. His 210 rushing attempts this season were second only to his single-season school-record 225 a year ago. Hedges ran for 1,162 yards and 13 TD as a sophomore...Sophomore middle linebacker **Paul Burger (Mentor)** led the team with 92 total tackles and gets a six-day break before he begins wrestling this Saturday at Olivet. Burger was a two-time high school all-american wrestler and competed at Division II Edinboro (Pa.) last winter...Junior All-American punter **Kevin Soflkiancs (Middleburg Heights/ Midpark)** won the second Division III punting title of his career with a 42.6-yard average. He also led Division III as a freshman with a 42.7-yard average. Soflkiancs also carries a 3.6 grade average in the classroom...Head Coach John Snell is 35-17 after his first five years as head coach.

Capital vs. Baldwin-Wallace: W 19-7

Capital University's football team posted its first 9-1 regular season in school history and locked up second place in the Ohio Athletic Conference with a 19-7 win at Baldwin-Wallace College Saturday in Berea... The Crusaders moved up to No. 4 in the national rankings, earning a second seed in the NCAA football playoffs and the right to host Wittenberg University at noon Saturday, Nov. 18 in Bernlohr Stadium...Capital defeated Wittenberg 57-7 in the opening week of the season, but the Tigers won eight out of their last nine games... In Saturday's regular season finale, senior quarterback **Rocky Pentello (Columbus/Westerville South)** threw for three first half touchdowns, two to senior **Mike Niedzwiecki (Norwalk/Norwalk-St. Paul)** and the third to senior **Dylan Kelly (Hilliard/Hilliard Darby)**... Senior running back **Charlie Smith (Westerville/Big Walnut)** had a career high 114 yards on 32 attempts and also caught five passes for 47 yards...Twin brothers **Kyle** and **Thom Hausler (Hilliard/Hilliard Davidson)** each had a team-high seven tackles and led a defense that held B-W 0-for-13 on third down and forced three turnovers...This marks the second straight postseason appearance for the Crusaders, who won a school record 10 games and advanced to the national quarterfinals last year.

Heidelberg vs. Muskingum: L 28-12

Heidelberg dropped its season finale at Muskingum, dropping its overall record on the 2006 season to 0-10 overall and 0-9 in the OAC ... Senior placekicker **Craig Smith (Rittman, Ohio / Rittman)** opened the scoring with a 32-yard field goal, while the defense added a safety and junior quarterback **Steve West (Huron, Ohio / Huron)** connected with sophomore **Lucas Bauer (Huron, Ohio / Huron)** connected late in the game for the final Berg score on the season ... For the game, West led Heidelberg in passing and rushing yards ... West completed 11 of 23 passes for 134 yards and one touchdown and had 13 rushes for 58 yards and a 4.5 yards per rush average ... Leading the Heidelberg defense was sophomore defensive back **Brian West (Huron, Ohio / Huron)**, who recorded six solo tackles and assisted on four others for 10 tackles total.

John Carroll vs. Otterbein: W 14-0

John Carroll, which held Otterbein to 21 yards net rushing and 107 yards total offense in a 14-0 win Saturday, posted its third shutout in the last four games. The last time John Carroll had three shutout victories over a four-game stretch was all the way back in 1962, when the Blue Streaks closed out the season with five consecutive shutouts ... Although the Blue Streaks had its run of winning seasons end at 19 consecutive with their fifth loss of the year last week at Mount Union, they extended a streak of non-losing seasons to 20 with their fifth win of the season today. Also extended was a 17-year run of top four finishes in the final OAC regular season standings – second longest in the league behind Mount Union ... Leading the defensive effort was **Andrew Provost (Naples, FL/St. John Neumann)**. In addition to leading JCU with nine tackles, his forced fumble and fumble recovery set up the first touchdown of the game -- a six-yard pass from **Rudy Kirbus (Willoughby Hills, OH/Cleveland St. Ignatius)** to **Joseph Konrad (Warren, MI/De La Salle Collegiate)** with 4:35 remaining in the opening period ... Konrad, whose touchdown was his school record-tying 13th of the season, led all receivers with seven catches for 65 yards. He finished the regular season as the OAC Leader in receptions (61), receiving yards (977) and tied for the lead in touchdowns (13) with Mount Union's Pierre Garcon ... **Matthew Divis (Avon, OH/Cleveland St. Ignatius)** had a career-high 111 yards on 19 carries to lead the ground attack ... Senior defensive lineman **Matt Lemke (Strongsville, OH/Strongsville)** was named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-District IV Football First Team. By being selected to the first team, Lemke will advance to the national ballot for a potential spot on the Academic All-American team. A Biology and Chemistry major with a 3.88 grade point average, Lemke has recorded 64 tackles, 6.5 tackles for a loss and 3.5 sacks during his career.

Marietta vs. Mount Union: L 45-17

Top-ranked and undefeated Mount Union College defeated Marietta College 45-17 on Saturday (Nov. 11) afternoon at Don Drumm Stadium. Before the game was over, however, Marietta (6-4, 5-4 OAC) accomplished a couple of feats. The Pioneers scored 10 points in the opening quarter, the first time Mount Union allowed a score in the frame. They also accumulated the most points by any team against the Purple Raiders this season. Marietta's quarterback **Jason Vrable (South Park, Pa.)** closed out his career by moving into sixth place on the OAC's single-season passing attempts list (375) and ninth on its single-season passing yards list (2,845). Vrable, the single-season and career record holder in every Pioneer passing category, finished the year by completing 12-of-33 passes and throwing for 173 yards. He had one touchdown and a pair of interceptions. For the season, Vrable went 202-of-375 (.539) and threw for 2,845 yards with 20 touchdowns and 15 interceptions. In his career, he completed 495-of-902 passes for 6,102 yards and 41 touchdowns. Senior wide receiver **Jason Curry (Akron/Springfield)** had one catch for 31 yards in the game and finished the season with a school-record 766 yards receiving and eight touchdowns on 46 catches. He concluded his career tied for the school record in touchdown receptions (19), while second in receiving yards (1,835) and third in receptions (122). Senior **Nic North (Madison, Wis./East)** had two grabs for 32 yards in his final game with the Pioneers. North wrapped up his career tied for fifth in receptions (118) with current Pioneer assistant coach Brian Haines and fourth in receiving yards (1,363). Sophomore running back **Garrett Banks (Barberton)** led the ground game with eight carries for 34 yards and the receivers with four catches for 54 yards. He also scored a touchdown both ways, running for a 15-yard scored in the first frame and pulling in a 21-yard TD in the fourth quarter. Defensively, Marietta was led by junior linebacker **Brian Hahn (Uppers Sandusky)** with a game-high 11 stops. Senior safety **Lonnie Meyers (Cumberland, Md./Fort Hill)** and juniors nose tackle **Clay Ream (Burbank/Northwestern)** and linebacker **Grant Cowell (Perrysville/Loudonville)** each added nine stops. Meyers also had a 35-yard interception return and Ream had two tackles for loss and two quarterback hurries. The Pioneers set five single-season team records in 2006 and finished in at three-way tie for fourth place in the OAC. Marietta set a new passing standard for attempts (380), completions (203), yards (2845), touchdowns (20) and first downs (119).

Mount Union vs. Marietta: W 45-17

Mount Union closed out the regular season with its 16th undefeated season since 1985. The Raiders have won an OAC record 18 conference titles. The Purple Raiders are 148-2 in regular season play since 1992. The Purple & White closed out the 2006 regular season having won 78 consecutive regular season road contests...Individually against Marietta on November 11, junior running back **Justin Wray (Vandergrift, PA/Kiski Area)** had a career-best 189 yards rushing on 19 carries. Teammate sophomore **Nate Kmic (Delta)** chipped in with 175 yards on 24 attempts. Mount Union set a new single-game team mark with 503 yards on the ground against the Pioneers.

Muskingum vs. Heidelberg: W 28-12

Muskingum Head Coach Jeff Heacock, who was promoted to Assistant Vice President of Student Affairs for External Relations last week, ends his Muskingum career with 109 victories. His 109 wins ranks in the top 30 all-time in Division III and ranks 11th all-time in the 104-year history of the Ohio Athletic Conference. Additionally, his 26-year stint ranks eighth all-time for active coaches across all divisions (NCAA I, II, III) for most years at the same institution...Junior running back **Caleb Fuller's (Fort Myers, Fla./Dunbar)** rushed for a career-high 237 yards and two touchdowns...He had touchdown runs of 68 and 49 yards...It marked the first time a Muskie has rushed for over 200 yards since 2002. He averaged 10.8 yards per tote on 22 carries and hauled in two passes for nine yards. Additionally, Fuller logged two kickoff returns for 71 yards...Sophomore quarterback **Andre Nash (Cleveland/Cleveland Central Catholic)** ended the game going 11-of-17 with one interception for 107 yards and one touchdown. He also carried the ball seven times for 44 yards and a score. Sophomore **Jack Murray (Alexandria/Northridge)** led the receivers with a career-high tying six grabs for 77 yards and one touchdown...Defensively, Muskingum was paced by junior linebacker **Sam Miller (Wingett Run/Monroe Central)** who recorded a game-high 12 stops with one assisted sack. Senior linebacker **Jack Junker (Parma Heights/Valley Forge)** logged nine tackles and one tackle for loss, while senior defensive end **Brett Maniaci (Hilliard/Hilliard Darby)** tallied six tackles, one assisted sack and 1.5 tackles for loss...As a team, Muskingum's 399 total yards of offense and 292 yards rushing were season-highs. Furthermore, Muskingum's spread attack offense averaged a season-best 7.3 yards per play and notched 18 first downs.

Ohio Northern vs. Wilmington 52-0

Ohio Northern ended its season on a high note, sending its 16 seniors out with a 52-0 victory over Wilmington at Dial-Roberson Stadium. ONU (6-4 overall, 5-4 Ohio Athletic Conference) posted its 11th consecutive upper division finish with the win. Senior **Adam Quirk (Saint Clairesville)** completed 8-of-25 passes for 113 yards and 3 TDs in his final game. He finishes his career ranked sixth all-time at ONU with 4,447 passing yards and fourth all-time with 4,921 yards of total offense...Junior **Jeff Busching (Findlay/Liberty-Benton)** ran 6 times for a career-high 155 yards and TD runs of 70 and 53 yards...Senior **David Delk (West Milton/Milton-Union)** caught six passes for 81 yards and hit first career TD...Sophomore **Mike Bonomini (Fort Thomas, Ky./Highlands)** also scored his first collegiate TD...ONU led 24-0 at the end of the first and second periods and 38-0 after three quarters...ONU out-gained WC 400-97 in total offense. ONU kept nine of its 10 opponents under 266 yards of total offense this season...Junior **Lenny Trusnik (Macedonia/Nordonia)** had 9 tackles (5 solo) a sack and returned an interception 57 yards for a TD to lead the ONU

defense. He ends the season as ONU's leading tackler with 80...Senior **Jason Trusnik (Macedonia/Nordonia)** had 6 tackles, a sack and recovered a fumble to lead another solid defensive effort by the Polar Bears. He ends the season with 60 tackles and team-highs of 11 sacks and 19.5 TFL. In his career, he is ONU's all-time career leader with 277 tackles and school records of 43 sacks and 85 TFL...Senior **Andy Brickner (Bascom/Hopewell-Loudon)** caught his first career pass in the game and turned it into a 43-yard TD play in the fourth quarter...The ONU defense is allowing only 208.5 yards per game, just 85.7 of which is coming on the ground...Junior **Ryan Roberson (Pickerington)** had an interception, a fumble recovery, a forced fumble, a PBU and two tackles.

Otterbein vs. John Carroll: L 14-0

Otterbein fell, 14-0, to John Carroll in a defensive battle played last Saturday in University Heights. The Blue Streaks secured the win on a 31-yard pass play for a touchdown with 6:42 remaining in the fourth quarter...Junior linebacker **Kieran Johnson (Columbus/Brookhaven)** turned in a career-day performance, making 12 tackles, six unassisted. He tallied 4.5 tackles for a loss of 29 yards, including three pass sacks. The linebacker also collected one interception and one forced fumble; and broke up one pass...Senior defensive end **Tyler Evans (Oak Hill)** made seven stops, including 3 tackles for a loss of 11 yards. He tallied 1.5 pass sacks.

Wilmington vs. Ohio Northern: L 52-0

In its season-ending loss at Ohio Northern, Wilmington got one final strong effort from several of its senior members. Free safety **Chad Otte (Maria Stein/Marion Local)** had eight tackles, two pass break-ups and an interception, his OAC-leading ninth of the season. Senior tackle **Jeremy Clingner** finished with seven tackles, two for loss and 1.5 sacks. Senior defensive end **Kevin Vidourek (Hamilton/Badin)** collected six stops for the Quakers. Freshman tailback **Louis Siegrist (Fort Loramie)** picked up 27 yards on eight carries and freshman quarterback **Billy Blackburn (New Vienna/East Clinton)** threw for 58 yards to finish the season with 1,188 passing yards. Junior receiver **Brandon Hiatt (Waynesville)** caught a pass, extending his string of games with a reception to 20.
