## NCAA Tournament Information



**Ohio Northern**, the 2006 Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) Volleyball Tournament champion will compete in the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Regional Volleyball Tournament taking on Hope at Calvin in Michigan, Thursday at 6:00p.m. **Capital** received one of 22 national at-large bids and will play Thursday against Coe (Iowa) College at Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri. Ohio Northern is making its 23rd overall NCAA Tournament appearance, while Capital, is making its second NCAA Tournament stop in school history.

### Men's Soccer



**Ohio Northern**, the 2006 OAC Regular-Season and Tournament champions, will play Transylvania (Ky.) at 5 pm on Friday at Ohio Wesleyan in the opening round of the NCAA Division III National Tournament. Ohio Northern (15-2-5) has earned its first-ever berth into the NCAA Tournament by defeating Wilmington 2-1, in the championship game of the Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament. The tournament title was also ONU's first in school history.

### Women's Soccer



**Capital**, the 2006 OAC Tournament Champions will play Kenyon on Wednesday in the opening rounds of the NCAA Division III National tournament. **Otterbein** received an at-large bid and will play Wittenberg in the first round of the NCAA Tournament on Saturday. This will be Otterbein's third trip to the NCAA Tournament.

## OAC Announces 2006 Volleyball Special Awards and All-OAC Teams

### Mount Union's Matesich Named OAC Coach-of-the-Year

First-year Head Coach **Leigh Ann Matesich** has been chosen by her colleagues as the 2006 OAC Coach-of-the-Year. Matesich lead the Raiders to an impressive 21-9 mark during the regular season and their 5-4 OAC record garnered the fourth seed in the OAC Volleyball tournament. The Raiders were picked sixth in the preseason OAC poll.

### Baldwin-Wallace's Camp is Named the OAC Sheila Wallace-Kovalchik Player-of-the-Year

Baldwin-Wallace senior setter **Angie Camp (Norwalk/St. Paul)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Volleyball Player-of-the-Year. Camp is the first Yellow Jacket to win this award. Camp was ranked sixth in OAC assists with 10.16 assists-per-game and ninth in OAC hitting percentage with .280% through games of October 30. Camp has earned First-Team All-OAC honors for the second time in her career.

### Ohio Northern's Schnelle is Named OAC Freshman-of-the-Year

Ohio Northern's **Liz Schnelle (New Bremen)** has been chosen by the league coaches as the 2006 OAC Freshman-of-the-Year. She is the third Polar Bear to be awarded this honor. Schnelle leads the team in kills with 484 (4.10 kpg) and is second on the team in blocks with 76 (.64 bpg). She also was ranked second in OAC hitting percentage with .327% and in OAC kills with 440 (4.04 kpg) through games of October 30. Schnelle earned Second Team All-OAC honors.

### Ohio Northern's Kanuckel is Named OAC Witte-Zicha Libero-of-the-Year

Ohio Northern senior **Karlee Kanuckel (Warsaw/Rive View)** was selected by the OAC coaches as the 2006 OAC Libero-of-the-Year. This is Kanuckel's second straight time earning this honor. She was also named to the All-OAC First Team, capturing all-Conference honors for the fourth time in her career. Kanuckel is currently ranked number one nationally in Division III digs with 783 (8.16 dpg) as of October 22 and was ranked number one in OAC digs with 917 digs (8.41 dpg) through games of October 30. She also broke her own single-season digs record of 980 set in 2005, tallying 1008 (8.54 dpg) so far in 2006.

The OAC Player-of-the-Year award is funded by Sheila Wallace-Kovalchik, who was the head coach at Ohio Northern from 1973-90, and is maintained by Ohio Northern. The Libero-of-the-Year award is co-sponsored by Ohio Northern Head Coach Kate Witte and Muskingum Head Coach Bea Zicha.

# 2006 OAC VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT

## Ohio Northern Captured its 15<sup>th</sup> OAC Volleyball Tournament Title

The number one seed Ohio Northern volleyball team won its 15<sup>th</sup> OAC Tournament title with 3-game sweeps over Muskingum (30-24, 31-29, 30-21) on Saturday, November 4. The Tournament title was the ninth for head coach Kate Witte in her 16 seasons at the helm.

Senior libero **Karlee Kanuckel (Warsaw/River View)** led the Polar Bears with 91 digs in the tournament. Kanuckel has set a new school-record by recording 1,008 digs this season and added to her school-record for career assists, now with 3,641. Kanuckel also leads the nation with 8.54 digs per game. Sophomore setter **Katie Weininger (Sycamore/Mohawk)** had 130 assists last week and now has 1,559 assists on the season. Sophomore middle hitter **Liz Schnelle (New Bremen)** had a team-high 44 kills last week and had a .268 hitting percentage. Junior outside hitter **Laura Vuyk (Oregon/Toledo Central Catholic)** has recorded a double-double in 14 of her last 15 matches. She has a total of 26 double-doubles on the season.



Ohio Northern has qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the 23<sup>rd</sup> time in school history and for the seventh consecutive season. The Polar Bears will take on Hope (Mich.) Thursday, November 9 at 1 p.m. in the opening round of the NCAA Division III National Tournament hosted by

### BALDWIN-WALLACE VS. MUSKINGUM: L 21-30, 30-22, 31-29, 32-30)

26-7 Overall, 8-1 OAC (Regular Season Co-Champions; This Week:: Season is complete; Last Week: 0-1 overall record; Lost to Muskingum, 3-1, on Oct. 31 in the quarterfinals of the OAC Tournament in Berea; Notes: Despite the Yellow Jackets won their third OAC regular season title or co-title since 2001, the team was snubbed by the NCAA Division III National Committee for a spot in this year's NCAA Tournament...B-W had its 19th season of 20 or more win season since 1979 and its ninth in 12 years with Vicki Brault as its head coach...The Jackets' were ranked as high as 19th in this year's AVCA Coaches Top-25 and were ranked as high as second by the NCAA Division III North Region Selection Committee...Vicki Brault is now 323-197 in her coaching career and 253-147 at B-W.

### CAPITAL VS. MARIETTA: W (30-24, 30-25, 30-15)...vs. MUSKINGUM: L 3-1 (23-30, 30-26, 30-22, 30-21)

Despite falling in the OAC Tournament Semifinals, Capital's volleyball team earned an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament, marking its second straight NCAA appearance... The Crusaders (25-9) are in the Central Region and have a Nov. 9 first round match up with Coe (Iowa) College, who has a 26-7 record... Last year, Capital earned its first bid into the NCAA Tournament after winning the OAC Tournament and lost in the opening round against Millikin (Ill.) University... Junior middle hitter **Jessie Hampson (Lancaster/Lancaster)** led the team with 18 kills and a .439 hitting percentage in Friday's semifinal loss against Muskingum College...Senior outside hitter **Jordan Centers (Norwalk/St. Paul)** continues to lead the team with 478 kills on the season while Hampson ranks second with 414... Senior libero **Marie Zumberger (DeGraff/Fairlawn)** tallied 29 digs against the Muskies, giving her a team-high 851 on the season... Sophomore setters **Kara Guster (Orrville/Orrville)** and freshman **Jenna Zumberger (DeGraff/Fairlawn)** have 545 and 432 assists, respectively...Coe plays in the Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference and also earned an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament after losing in their conference tourney's semifinals.

### MARIETTA VS. CAPITAL: L 3-0 (30-24, 30-25, 30-15)

The sixth-seeded Marietta College volleyball team's season came to a close Tuesday (Oct. 31) evening following a 3-0 (30-24, 30-25, 30-15) loss to third-seeded and 25th-ranked Capital University in the quarterfinals of the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) Tournament. The loss ended one of the most successful seasons in the Pioneers' 31-year history. Under third-year Head Coach Tom Symons, Marietta, who finished with an overall record of 20-8, reached the 20-win plateau for just the ninth time, and the 2006 squad set a new standard for regular season winning percentage (.741). Four seniors—Paige Burton (Fairlawn/Archbishop Hoban), Ellen Doolittle (Louisville, Ky./DuPont Manual), Jaymi Stephens (Hilliard/Hilliard Davidson) and Mattie Unger (Peninsula/Woodridge)—closed out their Pioneer careers Tuesday. As a team, Marietta finished the year with the second-most solo blocks (163), the third-most blocks assists (282) and the fourth-most service aces (236) in school history. Doolittle, the Pioneers' all-time leader in blocks, tied the single-season school record for block assists with 88. Doolittle also peppered the single-season top-five lists. She was fifth in kills per game (3.57), third in block solos (59), second in blocks per game (1.55), fourth in service aces (78) and fifth in service aces per game (0.84). She finished her career first in blocks (364), second in aces (207) and fourth in kills (966). Junior defensive specialist Casey Davis (Amanda/Clearcreek) had the second most digs in a season (522) and second best dig per game average (5.5). Sophomore setter Caity Shirk (Middleburg Heights/Midpark) finished with the fifth most assists (991) and second highest assists per game average (10.54) in a season.

### Mount Union vs. Otterbein: W 3-1 (30-20, 30-24, 20-30, 30-27) ...vs. Ohio Northern: L3-0 (30-24, 31-29, 30-21)

Mount Union (22-9), the #4 seed, defeated #5 seeded Otterbein (22-10) in opening round action of the Ohio Athletic Conference Volleyball Tournament on Tuesday, October 31 at the Timken Gymnasium in Alliance, Ohio. The Raiders won 3-1 (30-20, 30-24, 20-30, 30-27) and will advance to the tournament semi-finals.

Top performers for Mount Union were junior/outside hitters **Amanda Kohler (Uniontown/North Canton Hoover)** and freshman **Melissa Mahnke (North Royalton)**, who had 24 and 13 kills respectively. Freshman outside hitter **Kalie Rock (Wooster/Triway)** contributed 10 while sophomore defensive specialist **Alexi Sawayda (Chagrin Falls/Kenston)** tallied a team-best 34 digs. Rock added 19, freshman defensive specialist **Nicole Baka (Streetsboro)** tallied 10 and junior setter **Tracy Reschke (Suffield/Field)** had 18. Reschke also totaled 60 assists...The Raiders (22-10), the #4 seed in the Ohio Athletic Conference Volleyball Tournament, saw their season come to an end with a 3-0 loss (18-30, 27-30, 22-30) to #1 seed Ohio Northern (26-8), ranked #20 in Division III by the American Volleyball Coaches Association of America (AVCA), in the tournament semi-finals on Friday evening in Ada, Ohio. Despite the loss, Mount Union posted its 10th season all-time of 20+ wins under first year Head Coach Leigh Ann Matesich...The Purple Raiders were led by outside hitter **Amanda Kohler** with 13 kills and teammate middle hitter **Jessica Ehmer** added nine. Kohler also paced the team in digs with 25 and outside hitter **Kalie Rock** contributed 16. Setter **Tracy Reschke** totaled 35 assists.

### Muskingum vs. Baldwin-Wallace: W 3-1(21-30, 30-22, 31-29, 32-30)...vs. Capital: W 3-1 (30-23, 30-26, 30-22, 30-21)...vs. Ohio Northern: L 3-0 (30-24, 31-29, 30-21)

Muskingum entered the OAC Tournament as the seven-seed and beat second-seed and 21<sup>st</sup>-ranked Baldwin-Wallace and third-seed and 25<sup>th</sup>-ranked Capital University to advance to the OAC Tournament Championship match for the first

time since 2002...Against B-W, Senior setter **Jessica Gromes (Navarre/Canton Central Catholic)** recorded 56 assists and 12 digs, while senior libero **Elizabeth Guinsler (Zanesville/John Glenn)** registered 28 digs. At the net, senior middle hitter **Amanda Hawkins (Olmsted Falls)** smashed 14 kills and tallied six blocks and sophomore outside hitter **Allie Buckohr (Clinton/Northwest)** added 14 spikes and 15 digs. Freshman middle hitter **Brittany Gadd (Galion)** rounded out the Muskies' strong net presence with 11 kills and five blocks...Against Capital, Gromes recorded a season-high 69 assists and team-high 24 digs. Hawkins notched 25 kills to pace the net attack, while Gadd and senior outside hitter **Jill Weinstein (Swanton)** recorded 17 and 16 kills each, respectively. Guinsler chipped in 22 digs to help lead the defensive effort. The Muskies recorded 82 kills for the match and registered a .307 team hitting percentage...Against ONU, Gromes led the attack for the Muskies with 41 assists and 17 digs. Adding good support behind Gromes was Guinsler who had 23 digs, while Buckohr chipped in 11 kills. Hawkins finished with 12 kills...Gromes ends her career as Muskingum's all-time career assist leader with 4,898 and is second all-time in career digs with 1,629... Guinsler ends her career as Muskingum's all-time career digs leader with 1,801 and also set the school single-season record for most digs in a year with 860 and most digs per game with her 7.29 dpg average...Hawkins ends her tenure with 973 career kills which ranks seventh all-time at Muskingum.

## 2006 OAC MEN'S SOCCER TOURNAMENT

### Ohio Northern Earned its First OAC Tournament Title

The Ohio Northern men's soccer team won its first OAC Tournament with victories over John Carroll in the semifinals and Wilmington in the finals. With the win, ONU earns its first ever NCAA Tournament berth.

Freshman **Dan Otanicar (Wadsworth)** scored both goals in the championship match. His first goal tied the game and his second goal, was the game-winner. Otanicar has a team-leading 10 goals and eight assists for a total of 28 points. Sophomore goalkeeper Aaron Collins (Dayton/Carroll/Univ. of Cincinnati) made 13 saves in the two tournament games and recorded his seventh shutout of the season against John



Carroll. Junior midfielder **Nick Farnwald (Danville, Ky./Boyle County)** scored the first goal against John Carroll, which was his seventh on the season. He is second on the team with 19 points. ONU set a school-record with their 10<sup>th</sup> shutout of the season against John Carroll.

Ohio Northern will take on Transylvania (Ky.) on Friday, November 10 in the opening round of the NCAA Division III National Tournament,

hosted by Ohio Wesleyan.

This will be the third meeting all-time between ONU and Transylvania. Earlier this season, the two teams battled to a 1-1 tie in Lexington, Ky.

## 2006 OAC WOMEN'S TOURNAMENT

### Capital Claims OAC Tournament Title

Freshman forward **Molly Sheils (Centerville/Centerville)** sent in a sudden death penalty kick to give the Capital University the 2006 Ohio Athletic Conference Women's Soccer Tournament championship in a 0-0 tie over Otterbein College Saturday in Westerville, Ohio and a bid to the NCAA tournament.



After 90 minutes of regulation, a pair of 10 minute overtimes and each team converting 3-of-5 penalty kicks, the teams remained in a scoreless tie and moved to sudden death penalty kicks. Otterbein missed its first shot before Sheils nailed the game winner handing the Crusaders their first OAC Tournament Championship since 1999.

Aside from her heroics in the shootout, senior goalkeeper **Courtney Allan (Sylvania/Northview)** had eight saves for Capital.

The Crusaders also claims the OAC's automatic bid to the NCAA Division III Championships. It will mark Capital's first NCAA appearance since 1999. They will take on Keyon College Wednesday at 1:00 p.m. in the first round.

Despite Otterbein loss in the second round of penalty kicks, the Cardinals are set to make their third trip to the NCAA Division III Women's Soccer Tournament after receiving an at-large bid by the NCAA selection committee Sunday. They will take on Wittenberg on Friday, November 10.

## SOCCER OAC TOURNAMENT/ WEEKLY NOTES

### MEN

#### BALDWIN-WALLACE

13-4-1 Overall; 5-4 OAC; This Week: Season is complete; Notes: B-W's 13 wins this season were one shy of tying the school single-season for victories (14) that was set in 2004 (14-5-1) and tied a year ago (14-6-1)...In the last three years, Reid Ayers' Yellow Jackets are 41-13-3 overall...B-W placed second at the OAC/MIAA Shootout with a 2-0 record. The Jackets' are 4-0 in two OAC/MIAA Shootout appearances...B-W had eight shutouts and allowed a school-record-low 0.71 goals per game...B-W outscored its opponents, 35-13...Other '06 season highlights include its highest-ever rank of 15th in the NSCAA poll (National Soccer Coaches Association of America), winning the Tri-State (Ind.) University season-opening tournament and Head Coach Reid Ayers becoming the winningest men's soccer coach in school history. Ayers now has a 58-34-5 career record.

#### CAPITAL VS. WILMINGTON: L 2-1

Capital University's men's soccer team finished their season last week with a 2-1 loss to Wilmington College in the OAC semifinal round Wednesday. Capital's goal came from freshman forward **Steven McCarthy (Centerville/Kettering Alter)**, giving him a team-leading 15 goals for the season (along with three assists) for 33 points. Sophomore goalkeeper **John Snyder (Columbus/Thomas Worthington)** had 10 saves against the Quakers, giving him 96 saves for the season and a 10-5-4 overall record as keeper. The Crusaders finish the season 10-5-4 overall and 5-1-3 in the OAC; finishing behind McCarthy in points was sophomore forward **Joey Snyder (Columbus/Thomas Worthington)** with 13 points on five goals and three assists.

#### JOHN CARROLL VS. OHIO NORTHERN: L 5-0

John Carroll's league record 14<sup>th</sup> appearance in the OAC Tournament was short-lived thanks to a 5-0 loss to Ohio Northern in the semifinals ... The five goal loss was JCU's worst defeat in 24 league tournament games. Prior to Wednesday, JCU's largest margin of defeat was by two goals on four different occasions ... Putting John Carroll's OAC Tournament history into perspective, the Blue Streaks have made 14 appearances overall and eight consecutive dating back to 1999. No other team in the league has made more than nine OAC Tournament appearances.

#### WILMINGTON (12-6-1, 6-3-0 OAC) AT CAPITAL: W 2-1...AT OHIO NORTHERN: L 2-1

Late goals decided both of Wilmington's games in the OAC Tournament. Senior midfielder Chad Garman (Dayton/Chaminade-Julienne) scored with 30 seconds remaining in regulation to lift the Quakers over Capital in an OAC semifinal. ### Baldwin-Wallace vs. Otterbein: W 42-31

7-2 Overall, 6-2 OAC; This Week: Host Capital University at 1:30 p.m. in Berea at The George Finnie Stadium; Last Week:: Won at Otterbein, 42-31, in Westerville at Memorial Stadium: Notes: B-W stay the same in the North Region rankings this Tuesday...The Jackets' were seventh last week and were one of six in the regional to claim victories and the other was idle...Junior quarterback **Mickey Mental (Olmsted Falls)** had his second career 300-yard passing day as he completed 18-of-27 passes for 67 percent with 306 yards and five touchdowns and NO interceptions...Senior wide receiver **Drew Beichler (Orrville/ Smithville)** was on the receiving end of two of Mental's TD tosses...Senior running back **Brandon Hedges (Oregon/ Clay)**, who ran for 80 yards in 22 attempts at Otterbein with a TD on a two-yard run, now has 2,451 career rushing yards to rank third all-time in school history. He is 206 yards shy of the school's all-time mark of 2,657 yards which was set by Mark Anders (2001-2003). Hedges has 30 career rushing TD to rank second all-time and has scored 32 overall...It is Professor Appreciation Day and Seniors' Day at B-W this Saturday. Each Yellow Jacket football student-athlete will recognize a member of the College faculty who has made a difference in his B-W experience...The Yellow Jackets have already clinched their 39th winning season in the last 40 years

### Capital vs. Muskingum: W 52-14

Capital University's football team, ranked No. 5 in the nation, maintained its hold on second place in the Ohio Athletic Conference with a 52-14 win over Muskingum College Saturday in Columbus ... Capital senior quarterback **Rocky Pentello (Columbus/Westerville South)** was 17-for-23 for 240 yards with two touchdown passes in the first half. His 240 yards passing moved him into fifth place in NCAA Division III history with 11,287 yards ... His favorite target was **Mike Niedzwiecki (Norwalk/Norwalk-St. Paul)** who had a seven catches for a game-high 97 yards, while **Charlie Smith (Westerville/Big Walnut)** had a game-high 46 yards rushing on five carries. **Luke Schnittger (Cleveland/Lutheran West)** had a team-best eight tackles to lead a defense that held Muskingum to 181 total yards.

### Heidelberg vs. Ohio Northern: L 47-3

Heidelberg dropped its final home game of the year to Ohio Northern at Frost-Kalnow Stadium ... The Heidelberg defense made two fourth and short stands, including one at the goalline, but it was not enough ... Sophomore defensive back **Branden Jakubcin (Huron, Ohio / Huron)** led the defense with nine tackles, including seven for loss ... With the Student

Princes trailing 20-0 right before intermission, the offense gained some momentum with two third-down conversions and junior quarterback Bryan Prorok (Baltimore, Ohio / Liberty Union) found sophomore wide receiver **Kenny Sims (Garfield Hts., Ohio / Garfield Hts.)**, who broke a tackle and gained 39 yards up the left sideline to the Ohio Northern 14. ... Three plays later, senior kicker **Craig Smith (Rittman, Ohio / Rittman)** booted a 27-yard field goal for the lone 'Berg score of the game ... Prorok connected on five of 15 passes on the day for 102 yards and one interception ... Sophomore running back Chris Cola (Strongsville, Ohio / Strongsville) led all Heidelberg rushers with 22 carries for 82 yards.

#### **John Carroll vs. Mount Union: L 31-14**

For the first time since the season opener, John Carroll was out gained by an opponent, as Mount Union amassed 393 yards of total offense to the Blue Streaks' 222 in the Purple Raiders' 31-14 win Saturday. On the plus side, the Blue Streaks held Mount Union's vaunted offense to 21 points below its scoring average, 123 yards below its total offense average and 97 yards below its rushing average. Nate Kmic, the OAC's leading rusher, was held to 75 yards on 19 carries for a season-low 3.9 yards per carry ... **Mark Petruziello (Mentor, OH/Lake Catholic)** completed 16-27 passes for 166 yards and two touchdowns ... **Peter Spachner (Arlington Heights, IL/John Hersey)** had a team-best five receptions totaling 31 yards, while **Joseph Konrad (Warren, MI/De La Salle Collegiate)** had four catches for a team-high 48 yards and one touchdown ... The defense was led by **Mike Nettling's (Stow, OH/Cuya. Falls Walsh Jesuit)** nine tackles and eight each from **Carlo Melaragno (Highland Heights, OH/Notre Dame-Cathedral Latin)** and **Manny Andreoulakis (Naples, FL/Gulf Coast)** ... Melaragno, who had John Carroll's lone turnover with an interception in his third consecutive game, also had two kick returns for 38 yards. Melaragno has four interceptions this season to lead the Blue Streaks.

#### **Marietta vs. Wilmington: W 27-14**

The Pioneers (6-3, 5-3 OAC) clinched a winning season with a 27-14 victory at Wilmington. Marietta set five individual single-season school records, three team single-season records and three individual career records in the game. Senior quarterback **Jason Vrable (South Park)** broke the school record for individual passing attempts (also a team record) and tied the mark for touchdown passes in a season. The lefty completed 23-of-43 passes and threw for 297 yards with two touchdowns. Vrable, the school record holder in every career passing category, now tops the list in every single-season category as well. This season, he has completed 190-of-342 passes, while throwing for 2,672 yards and 19 touchdowns (also a team record). For his career, Vrable is now 483-of-869 for 5,929 yards and 40 touchdowns. Marietta wide receivers **Jason Curry (Akron/Springfield)** and **Chad McDaniel (Wooster/Triway)** also set records Saturday. The duo each broke the school's previous single-season record for receiving yards, which were 720. McDaniel, who caught four passes for 58 yards against the Quakers, now holds the record with 741 receiving yards. Curry, who pulled in seven receptions for 135 yards, is right on McDaniel's tail with 729 receiving yards. Curry also tied Marietta's career record for receiving touchdowns (19) with a 73-yard reception in the second quarter. The senior, who is currently second on the all-time list for receiving yards, also moved into third place on the receptions list after Saturday's game. Curry also set two new standards with his foot, as the punter is now the Pioneers' all-time leader in punts (202) and punting yards (7,355). Marietta's defense forced a pair of fumbles and picked off three passes in the game. Senior **J.J. Wheeler (Zanesville/Maysville)** led the team in tackles with 11 and picked off two passes, including one in Marietta's own end zone. Junior Brian Hahn (Upper Sandusky) added eight tackles and a fumble recovery, while junior **Grant Cowell (Perrysville/Loudonville)** had one interception, which he returned for 34 yards to set up the Pioneers' second touchdown. Its special teams also made a huge impact, blocking a field goal and scoring a TD. Freshman **Rich Castagna (McMurray, Pa./Peters Township)** returned a kickoff 86 yards for the touchdown to give the Pioneers the lead for good, 20-14. It was Marietta's first kick return for a TD since 2004.

#### **Mount Union vs. John Carroll: W 31-14**

The Purple Raiders (9-0, 8-0 OAC) closed the home portion of regular season play with a 31-14 win over conference rival John Carroll University. The victory clinched the Raiders at least a share of an unprecedented 15th consecutive Ohio Athletic Conference Championship and 18th overall... Sophomore/quarterback **Greg Micheli (Upper Sandusky)** finished 8-of-11 for 78 yards passing and had a career-high 77 yards rushing. Sophomore/tailback **Nate Kmic (Delta)** had 75 yards rushing on 19 attempts and three touchdowns while junior/wide receiver **Pierr Garcon (West Palm Beach, FL/John Leonard)** had five receptions for a game-best 96 yards. Defensively, junior/linebacker **Matt Rees (Dover)** had a team-best six hits and two sacks.

#### **Muskingum vs. Capital: L 52-14**

Sophomore running back **Steve Mamak (Elma, N.Y./Iroquois)** led the Black & Magenta ground attack with 20 yards on 18 carries. Sophomore quarterback **Andre Nash (Cleveland/Cleveland Central Catholic)** ended the game 9-of-13 for 64 yards with one interception and one touchdown, while freshman quarterback **Marcus Boggs (Jackson)** went 3-of-8 for 90 yards and one touchdown. Sutton led the receivers with three receptions for 30 yards and a score and Sophomore wide receiver **Jack Murray (Alexandria/Northridge)** hauled in a team-high 77 yards on two catches with a score... Defensively, sophomore defensive back **Caleb Rich (Croton/Northridge)** paced the Muskies with eight tackles, one tackle for loss, one pass break-up and one sack. Sophomore linebacker **Anthony Carson (Belmont/Union Local)** and junior defensive back **Jordan Rhodes (Somerset/Sheridan)** logged eight stops and seven stops each, respectively. Carson also had one tackle for loss and one interception, while Rhodes forced one fumble.

#### **Ohio Northern vs. Heidelberg: W 47-3**

Ohio Northern won its final road contest of the season Stadium. ONU (4-4 overall, 3-4 Ohio Athletic Conference) is now

10-4 on the road under third-year head coach Dean Paul...Sophomore **Jeff Pankratz (Sagamore Hills /Nordonia)** completed 11-of-12 passes for 156 yards and 2 TDs and ran 5 times for 18 yards and senior **Adam Quirk (Saint Clairesville)** was a perfect 7-of-7 for 64 yards and ran 5 times for 54 yards and a TD...Junior **Trevis Stephens (Cleveland Heights)** ran 12 times for a career-high 77 yards and the first three TDs of his ONU career...Sophomore **David Delk (West Milton/Milton-Union)** caught six passes for 81 yards and hit first career TD...Sophomore **Mike Bonomini (Fort Thomas, Ky./Highlands)** also scored his first collegiate TD...ONU led 20-3 at halftime and 34-3 after three quarters....ONU out-gained HC 485-211 in total offense. ONU has now kept eight of its nine opponents under 266 yards of total offense this season...Junior **Lenny Trusnik (Macedonia/Nordonia)** had 12 tackles (11 solo) a sack and returned an interception to the HC 3-yard line to set up a score and Senior **Jason Trusnik (Macedonia/Nordonia)** had 8 tackles and 1/2 a sack to lead another solid defensive effort by the Polar Bears...The ONU defense is allowing only 220.9 yards per game, just 90.9 of which is coming on the ground...The Polar Bears will wrap up their season Sat. at Dial-Roberson Stadium.

#### Otterbein vs. Baldwin-Wallace: 42-31

Otterbein generated a season-high 425 yards of total offense in a 42-31 loss to Baldwin-Wallace last Saturday at home in Westerville. The Cardinals led, 31-21, with 12:58 remaining in the game...Sophomore quarterback **Robbie Rosner (Dublin/Watterson)**, making just his second start at Otterbein, posted career single-game passing highs for attempts, completions, yards and touchdown passes thrown in the loss. He completed 24 of 37 pass attempts for 312 yards and two touchdowns....Junior wide receiver **Scott DeLong (Van Wert/Crestview)** and freshman wide receiver **Ryan Rowley (Grove City)** combined for 14 catches. DeLong caught seven for 94 yards, including a 10-yarder for a TD. Rowley made seven receptions for 90 yards...Sophomore running back **Tyrone Morgan (Columbus/Northland)**, making only his fourth start of the season, rushed for 90 yards on 23 carries. #### Wilmington vs. Marietta: L 27-14

Wilmington racked up 393 total yards, but five turnovers helped limit the Quakers to just two touchdowns in their loss to Marietta. Senior quarterback **Dustin Strayer (Germantown/Valley View)** threw for 259 yards before leaving the game in the fourth quarter with an injury. Freshman quarterback **Billy Blackburn (New Vienna/East Clinton)** threw for 96 yards and a touchdown. Junior fullback **Brent Scherz (Wilmington/Clinton-Massie)** had 10 catches for 141 yards and a touchdown and junior receiver **Brandon Hiatt (Waynesville)** caught nine passes for 139 yards. Senior free safety **Chad Otte (Maria Stein/Marion Local)** had career-high three interceptions for the Quakers and returned one of the picks 27 yards for a touchdown. Otte leads the OAC with eight interceptions. His 15 career interceptions rank third on the all-time Wilmington list. Otte, the OAC's third-leading tackler, finished with six stops. Senior cornerback **Taylor Clark (Morrow/McCallie, Tenn.)** led Wilmington with 11 solo tackles.
