Anjee Beard Beaston '00



Anjee Beard, the left-handed Lady Yellow Jackets starter, was one of the most outstanding women's basketball players in B-W history.

Over her four-year career at B-W, Anjee started every varsity game possible, lettered all four years, and claimed three school records. She stands fifth on the all-time scoring list with 1,198 career points and fifth on the all-time rebounding list with 644 caroms. Anjee set a then B-W career record with 114 games played and a .579 career field goal percentage. She owns the B-W and OAC record and tied an NCAA record with 18 straight-made field goals over a four-game span in 1999-2000. Anjee was named All-OAC forward three times, was team captain, and won B-W's Outstanding Senior Female Athlete Award.

With her teammates, the Lady Yellow Jackets compiled an incredible four-year record of 100-15, won back-to-back Ohio Athletic Conference regular season and OAC Tournament titles twice, and advanced three times to the OAC Tournament Championship Game and four times to the NCAA Division III National Tournament. With Anjee's assistance, the basketball team advanced to the "Elite Eight" in the NCAA Division III Tournament in 1999-2000. As a senior Anjee was a WBCA and DIII News Division III All-American.

Anjee was a sport management major and earned a Master of Education in Curriculum and Teaching degree. Currently, Anjee and her husband Bill are both health and physical education teachers. They have two children, Logan and Lexi. In 2004, Anjee was inducted into the Tiffin Columbian Hall of Fame.

Shannon Lakatosh Chung '99



As an exceptional student-athlete, Shannon Lakatosh was a member of B-W's cross country, indoor and outdoor varsity track teams and was one of the fastest runners in the College's history.

While majoring in elementary education, Shannon carried a 3.6 grade point average and was both an Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference and GTE Academic All-District IV selection three times.

She was an All-American in the indoor 400-meter dash in 1998 and 1999, an All-American in the outdoor 4x400-meter dash in 1998, indoor Most Valuable Performer in the OAC in 1998 and 1999, and a National Qualifier in the 4x100-meter four times and the 4x400-meter three times. In addition, she was All-Conference running in the 100-meter, 200-meter, 400-meter, 4x100-meter, 4x200-meter, 300-meter and 4x400-meter in track. She still holds two B-W track records, one as a member of the outdoor 4x400-meter relay team and individually indoors in the 200-meter dash.

Shannon is a very spiritual person and was a member of Campus Crusade for Christ, the Newman Center, Community Outreach and Fellowship of Christian Athletes, and served as a Bible Study leader. She was on the Dean's List, a member of Kappa Delta Pi Honor Society and earned a National Teacher's Scholarship.

After teaching for six years, Shannon now stays home with her son Luke. She and her husband Roy enjoy serving at their church in the inner city.

Laura Mench D'Amato '93



Laura Mench excelled in athletics along with academics and graduated *magna cum laude* with a 3.9 grade point average. She was a multi-event track athlete and one of the best female long jumpers in B-W history. For 13 years, she held B-W's

long jump school record and also set school records as a member of indoor and outdoor relay teams.

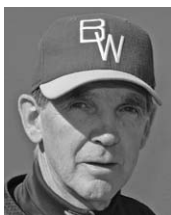
She was a three-time varsity letter winner in long jump and sprints, a five-time Division III national qualifier, two-time NCAA All-American athlete for the 4x100 meter relay in 1991 and the outdoor long jump in 1992, and has earned numerous first place OAC finishes in the long jump and on relay teams. Laura earned B-W's Outstanding Jumper Award in 1992, Academic All-OAC

from 1992-1993, Academic All-American in 1992, and the 1993 female nominee Clyde Lamb Scholar/Athlete Award. In addition to the Dean's List, she was a member of Dayton C. Miller, Kappa Delta Pi and Phi Alpha Theta honor societies.

After earning a Bachelor of Science in Education degree, Laura went on to earn a Master of Library Science degree from Kent State University and worked as a school librarian and volleyball and track coach.

Today, Laura reviews children's books for Library Media Connection and is enjoying being a stay-at-home mom.

Dr. Robert Fisher '63



Professor Bob Fisher spent 42 outstanding seasons as B-W's head baseball coach and 35 years as the defensive coordinator for B-W's football team. He retired as a professor of Health Promotion and Education and served as faculty chair of the Men's Division of Health and Physical Education. As baseball coach, he won the honor of winningest head coach in the history of the College for any sport, with a career record of 700 wins (700-641-14 overall).

Over the last four decades, Bob built the Yellow Jacket program into one of the best in the Ohio Athletic Conference, Midwest Region of Division III and NCAA Division III. Under his leadership, B-W's baseball team tied the school record in 1991 and 2002 for record wins in a season at 25 (a record set by his 1985 OAC championship team). The team had advanced to NCAA Division III Regional's four times and had made it to the OAC playoffs 16 times. Bob was named OAC's Coach of the Year four times for baseball.

Bob received his bachelor's degree, graduating *cum laude*, at B-W in 1963, a master's degree from Kent State University in 1968 and a doctorate in Health Education from The Ohio State University in 1988. As a teacher and coach, Bob has made an everlasting impression on B-W's men's athletics and has had a celebrated career at his alma mater.

Tim McCaig '90



Tim McCaig played multiple sports at B-W and was an outstanding football player and track thrower from 1986-1990, and one of the best javelin throwers in the State of Ohio.

On the football field, Tim was an anchor on the offensive line from his tackle position. He helped the Yellow Jackets succeed in four winning seasons and compiled an impressive 27-12-1 overall record, including the 1988 Ohio Athletic Conference title with an 8-2 record.

In track, Tim was an excellent thrower and competed in the shot put, discus, hammer, weight throw and javelin. Tim was a two-time OAC champion (1989 and 1990) and a four-time NCAA Division III All-American national qualifier in the javelin. In four appearances at the National Championship Meet, he placed eighth in 1987, fifth in 1988, third in 1989 and second as a senior in 1990 with a throw of 221-feet and seven inches.

As a freshman and sophomore, Tim battled for OAC and Division III supremacy with teammate and fellow Hall of Famer Tom Scholato '88. But, as a senior, he finally broke loose and beat Scholato's school record. Twice, Tim was named as the Yellow Jacket Outstanding Thrower.

Sadly, Tim passed away from an aneurism when he was 30. He is remembered by head track coach Bill Taraschke as not only a great athlete, but also, "a great teammate who was instrumental in our team unity."

William "Max" Newill '98



Max Newill was one of the finest left-handed baseball pitchers to ever wear the Brown & Gold. He was a four-year letterman and team captain in 1997 and 1998.

During his pitching career, Max was an OAC Pitcher of the Week five times (the most times ever awarded to a B-W player). Each year in school, Max's pitching advanced and he

earned many awards. Starting as a freshman, he was B-W's Freshman of the Year in baseball. This streak continued, and he was awarded B-W's Pitcher of the Year twice, The Yellow Jacket Award and B-W's Most Valuable Player. He also received All-OAC and Academic All-OAC honors, the Lee Tressel Scholarship in 1997 and the Kenneth Steingass Award as the Outstanding Male Athlete in 1998.

On the baseball diamond, Max finished his career by setting three B-W school records in wins, starts and complete games. Currently, he still holds the school record of pitching 21 complete games. His career record is 20-13, four saves, 2.71 ERA, 242 1/3 innings pitched, 242 strikeouts and walked only 67 batters.

Following graduation, Max signed a professional baseball contract and played for the Albany Colonie Diamond Dogs. He then went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Ohio University in 2000. Today, Max is the head varsity baseball coach at Bridgewater-Raritan High School in Bridgewater, New Jersey, where he teaches business and economics.

Mark Tinney '97



Mark Tinney was one of the finest wrestlers to ever compete for Baldwin-Wallace College. The elementary education major, who graduated with a 3.1 grade point average, was a National Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar All-

American in 1997 and qualified three times for the NCAA Division III National Championship Meet.

As a four-year letterman, Mark compiled a then school-record of 111 victories at B-W with a cumulative mark of 111-31. He was a three-time OAC champion at 197 pounds, who twice earned the John Summa Most Valuable Wrestler Award (1995-96 and 1996-97). Mark placed in the top four at 20 tournaments in which he participated, including winning seven tournament titles, finishing second eight times and taking third place three times. When Mark was a senior in high school, he was the OHSAA State Runner-up at 171 pounds.

Following graduation in 1997, Mark served one season as an assistant wrestling coach to B-W's current head coach Rich Fleming. He earned his Master of Education degree from Youngstown State University in 2002 and currently teaches seventh grade math for Riverside Local Schools. Over the years, he has coached cross country, track and wrestling for Roehm Middle School in Berea and Riverside High School. Mark and his wife Juliann Szasz have two children, Christian and Ella, and reside in Painesville Township.

Steven Varga '84



Steve Varga was one of the most prolific placekickers in Baldwin-Wallace College, the Ohio Athletic Conference and NCAA Division III history. His biggest claim to fame was kicking the winning field goal in the 1983 OAC Championship Game as B-W defeated rival Wittenberg University, 17-14.

Steve was a four-year B-W letterman (1980-83), three-year outstanding specialist at B-W (1981-83), three-year All-Ohio Athletic Conference first-team selection (1981-83), Chevrolet Most Valuable Player of a nationally televised B-W game (October 3, 1982), Kodak College Division III All-American selection (1983) and Pizza Hut Division III first-team All-American (1983). Steve's statistics at B-W were impressive. He made 32-of-54 field goals and 77-of-87 extra points for 173 career points to rank second all-time in kick scoring in the school's history. Steve's longest field goal was a soaring 47 yards in his junior season.

After graduation, Steve went on to play professional football with the New England Patriots.

Over the last 15 years, Steve has worked for the Department of Defense and has lived overseas with his wife, Valerie, and their two sons, Marko and Nicholas. Recently, Steve relocated his family back to Northeast Ohio and is looking forward to attending B-W football games and meeting old friends.
