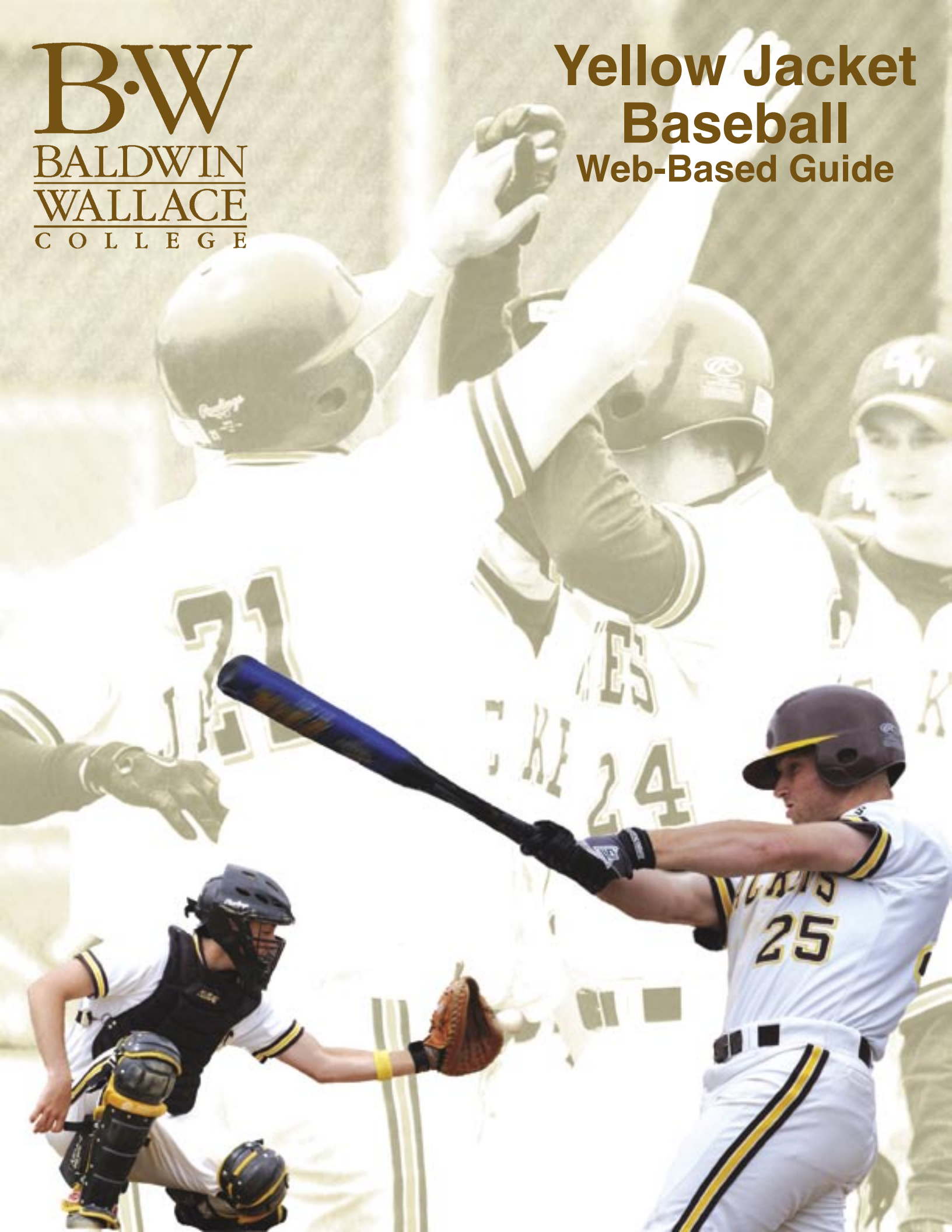

In 2004, **Turchan** batted .383 and led B-W in at-bats (128), base hits (49), triples (four), homeruns (eight), RBI (40), slugging (.727) and was second in runs scored (30) and third in doubles (12) and on-base average (.444). On the mound, he compiled a 5-2 record with a 2.83 ERA and 45 strikeouts in 54 innings pitched. He started eight games and had five complete games. For his efforts, **Turchan** was a first-team All-OAC selection as a utility player.

Last Season, **Pajakowski** appeared in 28 games at catcher, including 25 starts. He batted .246 (17 of 69) with 11 runs scored, two homeruns and 10 RBI. He also had a .948 fielding average and threw out 14 of 36 base runners attempting to steal. For his efforts both on the field and in the classroom, **Pajakowski** was tabbed as an honorable mention Academic All-OAC player.

Head Coach Bob Fisher



On March 8, 2005 in Ft. Myers, Florida, Baldwin-Wallace College veteran Head Baseball Coach Bob Fisher won the 600th and 601st games of his 38-year coaching career as the Yellow Jackets swept Dominican (Ill.) College, 9-4 and 4-0, on its annual spring break trip. For Fisher, who graduated from B-W in 1963, it was the latest milestone in an outstanding teaching and coaching career at his alma mater.

With his two wins on March 8, Fisher improved his career record to 601-528, but the wins and losses are just a small part of his career that has spanned 39 years in Berea.

In the classroom, Fisher has developed a reputation as an outstanding instructor and he spent a number

of years as the faculty chair of the Division of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance.

In terms of athletics, Fisher has been the leader of the baseball program the past 39 years. Prior to his retirement from the football field four years ago, Fisher served as a coach and then Defensive Coordinator of a B-W defense that was nationally recognized year-in and year-out.

On the baseball diamond, Fisher has led the program to be among the elite in NCAA Division III. He also is regarded as one of the finest coaches in the Midwest Region of Division III. He was selected by his fellow OAC coaches as the 1996 Ohio Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. It was the fourth time in his career that he has been honored with the award.

Under Fisher's direction, the Yellow Jackets have established a reputation for sound fundamental baseball. Having passed the 500-win plateau in 2000, Fisher has compiled a

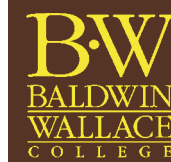
career record of 601-528-12. He is the winningest baseball coach in B-W history. This includes a 346-208-12 mark against Ohio Athletic Conference teams. The last 30 Fisher-coached squads have won 10 or more games while 14 teams have won 20 or more contests. Both his teams of 1991 and 2002 set and then tied the school-record for wins in a season with 25.

During the past 20 years, Fisher's teams have 389 victories, including 234 wins against OAC foes. B-W has advanced to the NCAA Division III Regional Tournament four times and the OAC Playoffs 16 times.

Fisher received his master's degree from Kent State University in 1968 and his doctorate in health education from The Ohio State University in 1988. A professor of health education and chairman of the Men's Department of Health and Physical Education, Fisher is a member of numerous professional associations in health promotion and education.

Joe Kilburg is the hitting and catchers coach at Baldwin-Wallace College. Before joining B-W's staff, he coached high school baseball at Cleveland Central Catholic for 20 years and was named North Coast Conference Coach of the Year three times.

For the past 25 years, Coach Kilburg has coached summer teams at all levels of amateur baseball. He is currently an assistant coach with the highly successful Parma MSI Baseball Club. In addition to his coaching assignments and his work as an instructor at the well-respected Phil Bova Baseball Camp, Coach Kilburg is an asso-

ciate scout with the Cleveland Indians.

As a biology and general science teacher at Cleveland Central Catholic High School, Coach Kilburg has been named Teacher of the Year and honored as a Teacher of Excellence by the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland. He has also been nominated for the Presidential Award for Excellence in Teaching and included in Who's Who Among America's Teachers. In 1995, Baseball America named Coach Kilburg, his wife Judy and their two sons Joe and Jim as Ohio's Amateur Baseball Family of the Year.

A 1996 graduate of B-W and a baseball alumni letterman, Ken Davenport has joined the Yellow Jacket coaching staff. Davenport has been an assistant varsity baseball coach at Cleveland Heights High School the past four years while also

teaching baseball skills at summer camps and clinics. A native of Falconer, New York, Coach Davenport was a four-year letterman at B-W who pitched in more than 30 games and played first base and served as a designated hitter. He will be B-W's Outfield

Coach and work with the freshman pitchers. Coach Davenport earned his Master's in Education degree from Kent State University and is currently a special education teacher at Strongsville High School. He lives in Fairview Park with his wife, Felicia, and their two-year-old daughter, Mar-

Coach Cook is the pitching coach and will assist Coach Fisher as the recruiting coordinator.

In 23 years as the head coach at Bay Village High School, Cook compiled an impressive 437-241 career record and was named the Southwestern Conference Coach of the Year seven times. also at Bay

High School, Cook won seven SWC, six sectional and four district titles and led his squad to a state runner-up finish in 1989. That season, Cook was also tabbed as the Greater Cleveland Coach of the Year.

Ken Ciolek joined the B-W coaching staff as infield coach after 22 years as the head baseball coach at Lakewood High School.

During his tenure at Lakewood, Coach Ciolek compiled a .724 winning percentage and never had a losing season. He was named Lake Erie League Coach of the

Year eight times and Northeast Ohio Coach of the Year four times as he led the Rangers to 20 or more wins in 11 seasons and eight LEL championships.

A past president of the Greater Cleveland Baseball Coaches Association, Coach Ciolek was inducted into the Lakewood Sports Hall of Fame

Coach Howard came to B-W from Wilmington College, where he played second base and outfield after an outstanding high school career at Springfield Northwestern.

After graduating from Wilmington, he stayed on at the Ohio Athletic Conference school as an assistant baseball coach. A standout defensive back in high school and college, he also coached

football at Wilmington and joined B-W's football staff in 2002 as secondary coach. Coach Howard was promoted to Defensive Coordinator in 2003 and was selected as the OAC "Assistant Coach of the Year."

Dave Painter, an all-conference second baseman for B-W in the mid-1990s, works closely with B-W's middle infielders and is the team's bunting and base-running instructor. He is Coach Howard's top assistant with the junior varsity team. Coach Painter has been coaching B-W players for several seasons while coaching youth baseball teams each summer

and teaching at numerous skills camps in the Greater Cleveland area.

Coach Painter is the assistant recreation director at B-W. During his senior season at B-W, he was named a national Arthur Ash Scholar Athlete.

Wooster High Grad Pat Gallagher Set to Have a Fantastic Senior Season for the Baldwin-Wallace College Yellow Jacket Baseball Team

BEREA, OHIO — It has been said that behind every good man is a great woman. In terms of baseball, behind every good pitcher has to be a great catcher.

For the Baldwin-Wallace College baseball team, 5-3 overall entering a Saturday (March 26) doubleheader at Ohio Athletic Conference rival Mount Union College, the man behind the plate is senior catcher and Wooster High School graduate Pat Gallagher.

Gallagher, a 22-year-old native of Wooster, is currently batting .273 with a .385 on-base percentage and split time behind the plate with fellow senior Adam Pajakowski (South Bend, Ind.). He has three hits and scored a run for the Jackets who will host nonleague rival The College of Wooster at Heritage Field in Berea on Thursday, March 31. When Gallagher has led off an inning, he is hitting .750.

Gallagher's defense has also been strong for the Brown & Gold. He has 13 putouts and five assists against zero errors.

He has also thrown out the only two runners who have attempted to steal on him while B-W was on its annual spring break trip to Ft. Myers, Florida.

Gallagher's passion for the game of baseball began a long time ago.

"I have loved the game [of baseball] for as long as I can remember," Gallagher said.

He took this love of baseball to Wooster H.S. where he experienced much success. During his freshman year at Wooster, the Generals made it to the OHSAA (Ohio High School Athletic Association) State Final Four. As a member of the Generals, Gallagher participated in two sports, football and baseball.

He played both sports for four seasons and earned three varsity letters in football and four in baseball. In addition to these honors, Gallagher was a second team All-Federal League pick in baseball as a senior.

Gallagher enjoyed his high school days

and when he was a junior, he had one of his fondest high school memories.

"I got the chance to play a lot of games and learn about the game," Gallagher stated. "My junior year, I really enjoyed hitting a towering home run off my current teammate, Matt Wilson, from Canton Jackson High School."

Gallagher not only shined on the field, but in the classroom as well. He was a member of the National Honor Society and was selected as a Scholar-Athlete.

His statistics and style of play attracted the attention from the B-W coaching staff.

"We felt he was a good high school catcher out of Wooster," said 39-year veteran Yellow Jacket Head Coach Dr. Bob Fisher, who won his 600th career game on the recent trip to Florida. "You are always looking for good middle defenders. Catching, middle infield, and centerfield are the

kids that make or break your team.

The thing that stands out about Pat is his outstanding ability to lead," said Fisher, who was a catcher himself many years ago. "Pat leads by example and is a vocal leader. When he wants something done, he let's you know about it."

Since Gallagher's graduation, the Generals moved from the Federal League to the Ohio Cardinal Conference.

When it came time for him to choose a college, Gallagher looked several colleges including Dartmouth, Mount Vernon Nazarene and the Ohio State University. However, Baldwin-Wallace's location seemed like a good fit.

"I chose B-W because I did not want to be too far from my family," said Gallagher. "This gives my family a great opportunity to see me play and it is not too far if I want to go home for a day or more. I have felt very comfortable here."

Gallagher played on the junior varsity team his freshman year and made many new friends.

"I felt it was very easy to make plenty of friends," Gallagher stated.

As a sophomore, Gallagher got the call up to the varsity. When he played, Gallagher started four games and participated in 17. In the field, he tallied 30 putouts and six assists against two errors. He was second on the team in runners caught stealing. Gallagher threw out five runners while giving up just two stolen bases.

The statistics he put up caught the attention of his teammates and coaches.

"Pat is dedicated to making the team better," said B-W junior second baseman

Kevin Brown. "Pat puts his teammates in front of himself and genuinely loves the game of baseball."

"Pat is the kind of guy that every team needs," stated senior outfielder and relief ace Nick Slater, a resident of Wooster and a graduate of Norwayne High School. "His ability to be the leader behind the plate is hard to find."

"Pat is a terrific catcher," said Fisher. "I think all of the pitchers like throwing to Pat."

"Pat's leadership is key [to the team]," Fisher added. "Some of that [leadership] comes from his practice attitude and his enthusiasm."

As a junior, Gallagher had better numbers in the field. He totaled 59 putouts and 12 assists. He was tied for first on the team in fielding percentage with a 1.000 mark. Gallagher did not commit an error the entire season. He also caught six runners trying to steal a base. On the offensive side of the ball, Gallagher registered six hits, six runs scored, and drove in five runs.

The younger members of the team have grown to appreciate Gallagher's abilities on and off the field.

Gallagher lists a former baseball coach, Dan Wyand, as one of his biggest influences in the game.

"Coach Wyand is one of the most competitive men I have ever met," Gallagher said. "I think my strong desire to win comes partly from him."

As the season continues, Gallagher has set goals for himself and the team.

"I want to have tons of fun and maybe be seen by a scout or two," he said. "I want to see our team win the Ohio Athletic Conference regular season and OAC Tournament titles and move on to the NCAA Division III National Tournament. We have plenty of talent, but it may come down to pitching, and a catcher can have a great influence on a team's pitching. I am looking forward to the challenge of both playing Wooster and the OAC schedule."

"Wooster is an outstanding program," said Gallagher. "Each time we play the Fighting Scots, it is special to me and Nick (Slater). In addition, the OAC is such a balanced league and every team is good. You cannot play a game and overlook an opponent. It is a great baseball conference."

Anyone who has known Gallagher knows he loves the game of baseball. He gets a lot of enjoyment out of the game.

"I am motivated by the way I feel when I am playing the game," he said. "Not many things make me happier."

"Pat is very smart," said freshman catcher Dominic Palmucci of West Holmes High School. "He is always willing to help anyone with homework or anything they need."

"He has helped me out many times so far this year," Palmucci added. "It is disappointing that he won't be around next season. The team will not be the same without him."



Gallagher has played in 36 career games including 12 starts during his two-year varsity career. He played his first season as a member of the junior varsity team as a freshman in 2002. Gallagher will again split time with fellow senior and catcher Adam Pajakowski (South Bend, Ind./Saint Joseph's) this season.

The Ohio Athletic Conference; the third oldest conference in the nation

Entering its 102nd year, the Ohio Athletic Conference will look to continue its prominence during the 2004-05 year. In 2003-2004, the OAC was once again represented well at the national level, both academically and athletically.

During the 2003-04 season the OAC advanced 11 teams to the NCAA Division III "Sweet 16", including Wilmington College winning the National Title in women's basketball. Mount Union College finished runner-up in football and the John Carroll University men's basketball squad finished third. Three teams finished in the "Elite Eight" at the NCAA's: Ohio Northern University in volleyball, Muskingum College in softball and Wilmington in indoor track and field; and five teams ended their seasons in the "Sweet 16": Baldwin-Wallace College in football, Wilmington in women's soccer, JCU in men's soccer and wrestling and Otterbein College in men's golf. Individually, Mount Union's Eddis Singleton and Wilmington's Emily Herring both became national champions in their respective events, the 50-yard freestyle in swimming and the high jump in track and field.

Individually, the Conference was repre-

sented by 56 All-Americans, 32 men and 24 women, and 13 Academic All-Americans to go along with a bevy of regional and national honors for our student-athletes and coaches. The Conference also had an athlete earn CoSIDA Academic All-America Team Member-of-the-Year honors in her respective sport.

The OAC, the third oldest conference in college athletics, is predated only by the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1888) and the Big Ten (1895). The Conference is older than the World Series and even the NCAA itself and has survived two world wars, the Great Depression, the Korean War and the Vietnam Conflict. From a modest beginning of six charter members in 1902, the OAC grew to as many as 24 members in the mid-1920s.

Through the years a total of 30 colleges and universities at one time or another have been members of the OAC. Currently the Conference consists of 10 members, including Baldwin-Wallace College, Capital University, Heidelberg College, John Carroll University, Marietta College, Mount Union College, Muskingum College, Ohio Northern University,

Otterbein College and Wilmington College. Wilmington became the 31st OAC member school, on July 1, 2000.

In the OAC's first year of existence, 1902, the first Conference champion was crowned. Case Tech won the football title with a 5-0-0 record. Outdoor track was added a year later and a third sport, cross country, became a Conference sport in 1914. More sports were steadily added to the OAC's repertoire throughout the years, culminating in the addition of women's sports in 1984. The Conference currently sponsors championships in 21 sports, 11 men's and 10 women's.

The enrollments at the 10 OAC institutions range from 1,200 to 4,500. All of the schools were founded in the 19th century and have long and outstanding academic reputations. While maintaining these high academic standards, Ohio Athletic Conference athletic teams and athletes have consistently enjoyed a great deal of success on a regional and national level. The athletic competition is viewed not as an end in itself, but as an extension of the educational programs.

Two Baldwin-Wallace College Student-Athletes Earn CoSIDA Academic All-District IV Honors in Baseball

BEREA, OHIO -- Two Baldwin-Wallace College baseball student-athletes earned CoSIDA Academic All-District IV honors. The teams are voted on by 308 college and university division sports information directors from CoSIDA District IV which includes the states of Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, Tennessee and Alabama.

The two Yellow Jackets chosen are junior third baseman Mike Turchan (Mayfield) and senior designated hitter/ first

baseman Ryan Petraitis

Turchan was a first-team selection and will advance to the national CoSIDA Academic All-America ballot. He carries a 3.409 grade point average in sports medicine and would like to be an athletic trainer. Turchan batted .383 with 12 doubles, four triples, eight homeruns and 40 runs batted-in for the 20-14 overall Yellow Jackets. He also had a 5-2 pitching mark with 2.78 earned run average with 45

strikeouts in 54 innings pitched. Petraitis was a second-team selection who ended an outstanding three-year varsity career with a .329 batting average with 23 doubles, two homers and 56 RBI. He hit .320 or better each of his three seasons on the varsity and helped B-W have three straight 20-win seasons. Petraitis carries a 3.3 grade average in mathematics.

Five Baldwin-Wallace Players Named to the All-Ohio Athletic Conference Team

Five Baldwin-Wallace College baseball players have been named to the 2004 All-Ohio Athletic Conference honor squad.

Named to the first-team as its utility player was Yellow Jacket junior third baseman and pitcher Mike Turchan

(Mayfield). At the plate, Turchan was second on the team in batting average at .383 and led the team in at-bats (128), base hits (49), triples (four), homeruns (eight), runs batted-in (40), slugging average (.727),

was second in runs scored (30) and third in doubles (12) and on-base average (.444). On the mound, Turchan compiled an impressive 5-2 record with a 2.78 earned run average with 45 strikeouts in 54 innings pitched as the number two starter in the rotation.

Named to the second-team were senior pitcher Dale Koler (Brunswick), sophomore designated hitter Mike Farrell (Wickliffe) and sophomore right fielder Dan Melito (Massillon Washington).

Koler became just the third B-W player in school history to earn All-OAC honors in baseball all four years. He ended his career as B-W's all-time leader in wins (23). As a senior, Koler had a 5-1 record with a team-leading 1.78 ERA and 81 strikeouts in 60 and two-thirds innings pitched. His 11.9 strikeouts per game ranked ninth in

Division III. Farrell led B-W in batting average at .389 and tied Melito for the team lead with 13 doubles. In addition, Farrell had 42 base hits, scored 25 runs and had four homers, 25 RBI and had a team-leading .468 on-base average. Melito hit .342 with 13 doubles, five homers and 33 RBI.

In addition, junior shortstop Jason Albright (Camp Hills, Pa./ East Pennsboro) earned honorable mention All-OAC accolades. Albright hit .363 with five doubles, a triple, a homer and 19 RBI. More importantly, he had an outstanding .954 fielding average at ss with just six errors in 131 chances.

The Yellow Jacket baseball team finished the 2004 season with a 20-14 overall and 9-8 OAC record and placed fifth in the

Applying to Baldwin-Wallace



Admission to B-W is offered on a selective basis. Each application is reviewed independently on its own merits, with careful consideration of course work, class rank, grade point averages, recommendations, test results (SAT or ACT) and extracurricular activities. To apply for admission, we encourage you to complete the application between **September** and **March** of your senior year.

A good high school preparation for B-W includes four years of English, and at least three years of math, social science and natural science, two years of foreign language, and three years of additional academic electives.

Candidates are considered as soon as all application requirements have been met, with notification usually within four to six weeks after their credentials are received.

An Exceptional Value

B-W is committed to making college affordable. In fact, your chances of receiving some form of financial assistance at B-W are excellent. Nearly two-thirds of our current students receive B-W need-based aid; and more than 90 percent receive assistance in some form.

Your first step in the financial aid process is to complete the F.A.F.S.A. (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). This should be completed no later than March 1st. After you have been admitted to B-W and the F.A.F.S.A. report has been received and processed, you will receive your award. Typically this will consist of gift assistance (need-based grant and scholarship), low interest federal loans and work study employment.

The Baldwin-Wallace College Baseball student-athlete is one of the best publicized in all of small college and NCAA Division III athletics. Several factors help this to happen.

Its location, its national and conference affiliation and philosophy of athletics, its administration and coaches and its support of the student-athlete all play large roles in telling others about B-W and the successes of its student-athletes.

Baldwin-Wallace College is a small, private, liberal arts college located 12 miles southwest of Cleveland, Ohio. While being in the small and progressive local community of Berea,

B-W student-athletes benefit from being close to a major urban area such as Greater Cleveland/Akron. B-W athletics receive support both in Cleveland and Akron and in the Berea community itself.

Being a member of the prestigious Ohio Athletic Conference and playing NCAA Division III athletics also is an advantage. Coaches who are teachers first forge a solid commitment to the Division III philosophy of the student-athlete. Baldwin-Wallace also is proud of its athletic heritage and the fact that it has produced the third most small college CoSIDA-GTE College Division Academic All-Americans since 1984. In 1997, B-W had three Academic All-Americans, including men's basketball player Kevin Braaten (Strongsville, Ohio) '97. The year prior, men's basketball player Brian Higley '96 (Stow, Ohio) was tabbed as a first-team Academic All-American. Overall, the Yellow Jacket men's program has produced four Academic All-American student-athletes since head coach Steve Bankson took over the program.

Support in terms of facilities, equipment and transportation and in staff provides the Baldwin-Wallace student-athlete with a luxury not enjoyed at many other schools.

One part of that support is in the area of sports information. A diligent staff of B-W sport information student assistants and sport management majors work with the director to publicize B-W and its coaches and student-athletes in 20 NCAA Division III sports.

The students learn first-hand about publicizing a program by updating the internet website, writing hometown press releases and doing feature stories, doing game and cumulative statistics as well as statistical analysis, game and special event programs, recruiting brochures and media guides, contacting local, state and

national media sources prior to and after each game and promoting and administering special events during athletic contests.

Each Yellow Jacket Men's Basketball student-athlete receives a preseason, mid-season and postseason hometown press release which is sent to the individual student-athlete hometown newspaper. When the student-athletes fill out a preseason questionnaire, each is asked to list his or her hometown newspaper.

After each men's varsity basketball game, the internet website is updated, a FAX is sent to B-W's base of local, state and national media that regularly cover or have requested B-W coverage. In addition, hometown facsimile messages about individual performances are also sent either the night of the contest or the next day.

The day following an athletic event, statistics are updated and made available to all requesting the information.

Campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, broadcasts all home and away football and basketball games as well as covering all other Yellow Jacket sporting events, press conferences or announcements on a selected basis. ***All Yellow Jacket men's and women's basketball games are also broadcast over the internet website at www.bw.edu/athletics.*** A number of former B-W student broadcasters have gone to successful careers in the Greater Cleveland area, both in radio and in television. In addition, the four local commercial television stations and numerous radio stations do game coverage and feature interviews on a selected basis.

The Baldwin-Wallace College student-athlete receives excellent local small college coverage both in terms of game coverage and hometown coverage by The Plain Dealer (Cleveland's major daily with a circulation of more than 500,000 homes), the Chronicle-Telegram (based in Elyria, Ohio), the Morning Journal (based in Lorain, Ohio), the Beacon-Journal (based in Akron, Ohio), the Medina County Gazette (based in Medina, Ohio), the Sun Newspapers (Cleveland's largest weekly newspaper serving the Greater Cleveland area) and a number of other daily and weekly publications in Northeast Ohio.

Overall, the sports information office at Baldwin-Wallace College offers the student-athlete the opportunity to receive maximum exposure at the small college level. In addition to giving the Yellow Jacket student-athlete the most comprehensive coverage available at the NCAA Division III level, the B-W sports information student assistant garners solid skills in writing, communications, marketing, promotion and publication layout and design. Overall, 14 former SID student assistants have gone on to sports information careers at either the NCAA Division I and I-AA level such as the University of Texas, Arizona State University, the University of Nebraska, the University of Arkansas, the University of Florida, Monmouth (N.J.), Kent State University, Eastern Michigan University and others. Others are involved with professional teams such as the Kansas City Chiefs of the NFL and the Cleveland Force of the MISL.
