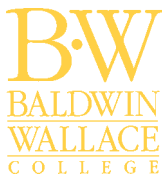

Head Coach Dr. William “Bill” Taraschke



Bill Taraschke, the 1999 NCAA Division III National Track Coach of the Year, has built winning programs for men and women in both cross country and track since coming to Baldwin-Wallace 20 years ago.

As a cross country, track and football coach at the College, Taraschke has tutored 73 All-Americans and Academic All-Americans, and led 39 Yellow Jacket teams to Ohio Athletic Conference titles.

In 2002 Taraschke lead the women’s cross country team to a eighth place finish at the 2002 Division III National Cross Country Championships.

The 2004 season will mark Taraschke’s 14th as men’s and women’s cross country coach. In addition to Taraschke’s women’s cross country team having won ten of the last 12 OAC crowns, his men’s team continues to build momentum and is set to challenge for an OAC title this fall.

In track, Taraschke has led 31 Yellow Jacket teams to OAC titles, including the men’s outdoor championship in 1995. That spring, Taraschke was the OAC Men’s Track Coach of the Year. Three years ago, Taraschke was the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region and NCAA Division III National Women’s Coach of the Year. Last year, Taraschke was the OAC Women’s Cross Country Coach of the Year, the OAC Women’s Indoor Track Coach of the Year and Women’s Outdoor Track Coach of the Year. It was the second straight year that he won all three OAC awards.

Taraschke is a member of the Ohio Cross Country Coaches Association and the president of the OAC Track Coaches. He is a member of both the NCAA Division III Track & Field and Cross Country coaches associations.

Taraschke gained outstanding coaching experience prior to coming to B-W. A native of Toledo, Taraschke began coaching at Milan (Ohio) High School in 1966 as head track and football coach. In 1969, he moved to the old Canton (Ohio) Oakwood High School before going to Brookside (Ohio) High School from 1971-75.

Prior to coaching at B-W, Taraschke served as the head track coach and the defensive coordinator for football at Chadron (Neb.) State College.

Taraschke earned his undergraduate degree at Ohio University and is a former two-time Mid-American Conference discus champion. He received his master’s degree from Southern Illinois in 1966 and his doctoral degree from the University of Toledo in 1984.

Assistant Coaches



Jeff Petersmeyer will be in his first season as an assistant coach back at his alma mater. Prior to returning to B-W, he most recently served as the assistant track and cross country coach and associate professor of physical

education at Columbia University (2002-2004). Prior to Columbia, Petersmeyer had assistant coaching stints at Northern Arizona University (1999-2002), Allegheny College (1998-1999), Fort Recovery High School (1997-1998) and Padua Franciscan High School (1996-1997).

While at B-W Petersmeyer earned All-America honors in the 400-meter intermediate hurdles and as a member of the 4x400-meter relay in 1996. He



is the school-record holder in the 400-meter hurdles with a time of 52.46 seconds. He was an eight-time Ohio Athletic Conference champion, 14-time All-OAC competitor and earned Academic All-OAC honors in 1994 and

1995. In addition, Petersmeyer was B-W’s Hurdler of the Year in 1993 and 1995, a Division III national qualifier his sophomore through senior years and a seven-time Dean’s List student.

Petersmeyer graduated from B-W in 1996 and received his master’s degree from Northern Arizona University in 2002.

Tim Budic will also bein his first season coaching at his alma mater. While at B-W, Budicearned four letters

each in both cross country and track. Budic missed his senior track season due to injury but received a medical medshirt and in 2003 he earned All-America honors for his runner-up finish in the steeplechase and set the school record (8:54.83).

In cross country, he earned All-OAC honors his sophomore and junior years for his second and seventh place finishes, respectively. His junior year he was the only B-W male competitor to run at the national meet where he finished 82nd. Budic graduated from B-W in 2002.

Yellow Jacket Cross Country Teams Complete 2004-2005 Season

Both the women's and men's cross country teams completed their 2004 seasons with the Division III Great Lakes Regional Championships on November 13 at Alma College in Alma, Michigan. The women finished eighth out of 26 schools while the men were 18th out of 30 schools.

The women entered the 2004 season without a returning runner who earned All-OAC honors the season before for the first time since 1991. Despite not having a returning All-OAC runner, the Yellow Jacket women posted an impressive third place finish led by senior Jamie Luketic

(Rootstown) who finished 11th overall individually amongst 106 total runners with a time of 24:05.

B-W had been led all season by senior Lisa Bartkiewicz (Berea) who finished as the team's top performer in five out of the eight cross country meets that B-W competed in. Bartkiewicz placed 12th individually behind Luketic at this year's OAC Championships with a time of 24:09. She also posted a season-best time of 19:17 at the annual Mel Brodt Invitational hosted by Bowling Green State University on September 11th.

Other top performers included senior Lindsay Bukovec (Willowick/Eastlake North) who had four top-ten finishes and ran a season-best time of 19:26 at the Mel Brodt Invitational. Freshman Molly Clauss (West Falls, N.Y./East Aurora) also had strong performances each week during the season for B-W. She had a top-ten finish at the Mel Brodt Invitational with a time of 19:31.

The men's team finished 18th out of 30 teams competing at this year's Division III Great Lakes Regional Championships. They also posted a fifth place finish at the 2004 OAC Championships.

Freshmen D.J. Hanigosky (North Royalton/St. Ignatius) and Ian Michalik (Sandusky/Perkins) led the way for the Yellow Jackets this season.

Hanigosky posted three top-ten performances including a second place finish in the Mel Brodt Invitational with a time of 26:14. Michalik had the top B-W time in four events this season including fourth place finish at the Mel Brodt Invitational (26:27) and a seventh place finish at the University of Rochester (N.Y.) Invitational (26:45).



Freshman Ian Michalik (Sandusky/Perkins) had four top-ten finishes for the Yellow Jackets during the 2004 season. He finished 13th overall individually at the 2004 OAC Championships.

Freshman Sean Wallace (Lorain/Southview) took top team honors in the Dickinson (Pa.) Invitational 4k by placing fourth individually in a time of 12:59.

Sophomore Chris Buhovecky (Brunswick/Padua) posted a season-best time of 25:57.0 at the Div. III Great Lakes Regional and finished 43rd overall.

The Yellow Jackets will return all but six runners in 2005-2006. The women will lose five runners to graduation, while the men will lose only one. With a strong core of returning runners, B-W will look to challenge for an OAC title which the women have not won since 2002 and the men since 1983.

Baldwin-Wallace Hosted the 2004 OAC Championship Meet at Wallace Lake in the Cleveland Metroparks System

BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College served as the host school of the 2004 Ohio Athletic Conference Championship Meet on Saturday, October 30. The event will take place on the Wallace Lake course which is in the Cleveland Metroparks System.

The B-W women's team posted an impressive third place finish led by senior Jamie Luketic (Rootstown)

who completed the the 6k course in a time of 24:05. She finished 11th individually out of 106 runners.

Meanwhile, the men finished in fifth place led by freshman Ian Michalik (Sandusky/Perkins) who ran the 8k course in a time of 27:29 and ranked 13th individually amongst 126 runners.

"The Wallace Lake course is absolutely beautiful," said veteran Yellow

Jacket Head Coach Dr. Bill Taraschke. "It blends a lot of different elements together that as a package makes for a great run.

Yellow Jacket Tradition of Individual Champions

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College women's cross country program has a rich tradition of producing out Ohio Athletic Conference Championship Meet individual champions.

In the 18 years since the OAC began sponsoring an OAC women's championship meet in cross country, the Yellow Jackets have won 14 team titles and produced 10 individual title winners, including three-time winner Hannah Purdy (Berea). In addition, Tina Lokar (1993-97) won the individual crown as a freshman in 1993 and then again four years later as a senior in 1996.

"We have had some really outstanding runners and women," said veteran Head Coach Dr. Bill Taraschke. "Each has been both an

outstanding student and competitor. They have emulated the goal of Division III athletics participation."

The other Yellow Jacket women's individual champions are Martha Dora in 1987, Lisa Winans in 1988, Jennifer Schafer in 1992, Shawn Conley in 1994 and Jessica Carmona in 1997. A

B-W runner was the OAC individual champion in five of six years (1992-97) and eight of 10 years overall (1992-2001).

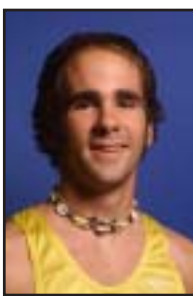

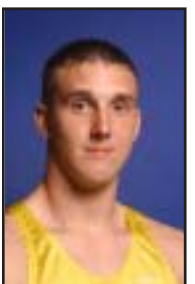

The Yellow Jacket Program is Annually Among the Finest in the Great Lakes Region

BEREA, OHIO --The Baldwin-Wallace College men's and women's cross country programs have long been among the finest in the Ohio Athletic Conference, the state of Ohio, the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region and Division III and nationally.

The B-W men were an OAC and Division III power in the late 1970s and into the 1980s. The Yellow Jackets won five OAC titles (1973, 1979, 1981, 1982 and 1983) and placed an all-time best sixth at the 1979 Division III na-

tional meet. Under the direction of legendary Head Coach Paul "Sparky" Adams, B-W yearly battled for supremacy in the region. Led by OAC individual champions Larry Coy (1976) and Marty Healy (1983), B-W set a standard for

excellence in the OAC which carried over to the national level.

Since the inception of women's athletics in the OAC in 1985, B-W has been a power that is unmatched. The Yellow Jackets have won 13 of the past 16 OAC crowns, including four straight. At both the annual All-Ohio Championship Meet and at the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region Championship Meet, the Yellow Jacket program has gained both regional and national acclaim as the best in Ohio.

Since 1986, B-W has finished in the Top 10 at the Great Lakes Region Meet, including four straight Top Two showings from 1999-2002. Each time, it led to B-W being invited to the NCAA Division III National Championship Meet.

"We have had outstanding success at both the All-Ohio and Great Lakes Region meets," said Head Coach Dr. Bill Taraschke. "Our goal each year is to make it to the national meet."

The Baldwin-Wallace College cross country student-athletes are some of the best publicized in all of small college and NCAA Division III athletics. Several factors help this to happen.

Its location, its national and conference affiliation and philosophy of athletics, its administration and coaches and its support of the student-athlete all play large roles in telling others about B-W and the successes of its student-athletes.

Baldwin-Wallace College is a small, private, liberal arts college located 12 miles southwest of Cleveland, Ohio. While being in the small and progressive local community of Berea, B-W student-athletes benefit from being close to a major urban area such as Greater Cleveland/Akron. B-W athletics receive support both in Cleveland and Akron and in the Berea community itself.

Being a member of the prestigious Ohio Athletic Conference and playing NCAA Division III athletics also is an advantage. Coaches who are teachers first forge a solid commitment to the Division III philosophy of the student-athlete. Baldwin-Wallace also is proud of its athletic heritage and the fact that it has produced 54 College Division Academic All-Americans since 1972. A year ago, B-W had two Academic All-Americans: football student-athlete Joe Harbour (Upper Sandusky, Ohio) and softball student-athlete Nicole Loudin (Sheffield Lake, Ohio).

"We feel that athletics participation is a part of the educational experience of our student-athletes, not apart from it," said Baldwin-Wallace College President Mark H. Collier.

"We are extremely proud of the success of our athletics programs and our student-athletes."

In 2003, Matt Kish, a football student-athlete attained the highest grade point average in the senior class and was awarded the Milton T. Baldwin Prize at graduation.

Support in terms of facilities, equipment and transportation and in staff provides the Baldwin-Wallace student-athlete with a luxury not enjoyed at many other schools.

One part of that support is in the area of sports information. A diligent staff of B-W sport information student assistants and sport management majors work with the director to publicize B-W and its coaches and student-athletes in 20 NCAA Division III sports.

The students learn first-hand about publicizing a program by updating the internet website, writing hometown press releases and doing feature stories, doing game and cumulative statistics as well as statistical analysis, game and special event programs, recruiting brochures and media guides, contacting local, state and national media sources prior to and after each game and promoting and administering special events during athletic contests.

Each Yellow Jacket Cross Country student-athlete receives a preseason, mid-season and postseason hometown press release which is sent to the individual student-athlete hometown newspaper. When the student-athletes fill out a preseason questionnaire, each is asked to list his or her hometown newspaper.

After each men's varsity soccer game, the internet website is updated, a FAX is sent to B-W's base of local, state and national media that regularly cover or have requested B-W coverage. In addition, hometown facsimile messages about individual performances are also sent either the night of the contest or the next day.

The day following an athletic event, statistics are updated and made available to all requesting the information.

Campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, broadcasts all home and away football and basketball games as well as covering all other Yellow Jacket sporting events, press conferences or announcements on a selected basis. ***All Yellow Jacket men's and women's basketball games are also broadcast over the internet website at www.bw.edu/athletics.*** A number of former B-W student broadcasters have gone to successful careers in the Greater Cleveland area, both in radio and in television. In addition, the four local commercial television stations and numerous radio stations do game coverage and feature interviews on a selected basis.

The Baldwin-Wallace College student-athlete receives excellent local small college coverage both in terms of game coverage and hometown coverage by *The Plain Dealer* (Cleveland's major daily with a circulation of more than 500,000 homes), the *Chronicle-Telegram* (based in Elyria, Ohio), the *Morning Journal* (based in Lorain, Ohio), the *Beacon-Journal* (based in Akron, Ohio), the *Medina County Gazette* (based in Medina, Ohio), the *Sun Newspapers* (Cleveland's largest weekly newspaper serving the Greater Cleveland area) and a number of other daily and weekly publications in Northeast Ohio.

Overall, the sports information office at Baldwin-Wallace College offers the student-athlete the opportunity to receive maximum exposure at the small college level. In addition to giving the Yellow Jacket student-athlete the most comprehensive coverage available at the NCAA Division III level, the B-W sports information student assistant garners solid skills in writing, communications, marketing, promotion and publication layout and design. Overall, 14 former SID student assistants have gone on to sports information careers at either the NCAA Division I and I-AA level such as the University of Texas, Arizona State University, the University of Nebraska, the University of Arkansas, the University of Florida, Monmouth (N.J.), Kent State, Eastern Michigan and others. Others are involved with professional teams such as the Kansas City Chiefs of the NFL and the MISL's Cleveland Force.
