## Fifth-Year Head Coach John Snell

Head Coach John Snell is the leader of the Baldwin-Wallace College football program.

In his first four years at his alma mater, Coach Snell has kept the Yellow Jacket program among the best in Division III and extended the school's seasonal winning streak to 38 years.

"We will work hard to help keep the B-W program one of the best in Division III," said Snell, who has an outstanding 28-14 record and .667 winning percentage. "Our goal is to win the Ohio Athletic Conference and NCAA Division III national titles. Both our players and coaching staff are dedicated and committed to making it happen.

"I have a responsibility to keep strong the tradition of excellence of the Baldwin-Wallace College football program," said Snell.

"We are all committed to continuing that tradition of excellence and look forward to the challenges ahead."

Snell is in his 13th season at his alma mater. He has previously served as an assistant coach in charge of quarterbacks and recruiting and was the Yellow Jacket offensive coordinator for five years. In the spring of 2001, Snell was elevated to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator.

Snell was hand-picked to take over the Yellow Jacket program by Packard, who ended his career as the winningest coach in B-W history.

In his first season as the head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Snell led B-W to an impressive 8-2 overall record and a ranking in both the North Region and na-

tional in Division III polls. For his efforts, he was selected as the OAC *Co-Coach of the Year* by his peers.

Snell's program went two steps further in 2003. He led the Yellow Jackets to a 10-2 overall record and his team received B-W's first NCAA Division III Playoff berth since 1991 and won its first playoff game since 1978.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Snell coached at the University of Rochester (1987-88 and again from 1992-94), at Rutgers University (1988-90) and the University of Buffalo (1990-92). Snell is a native of Albion, New York and graduated from Albion High School in 1983.

Snell and his wife, Shelly, reside in Strongsville and have a son named Matthew and daughter named Jamie.

# Assistant Coaches

**RON COSBY, JR.**, a native of Xenia, Ohio and most recently an assistant football coach at Cincinnati Hughes High School, will be in his second year on the Baldwin-Wallace College football coaching staff. He will coach the defensive backs and coordinate B-W's recruiting efforts with Coach Snell. Before being named to the Yellow Jacket staff, Cosby had worked previously as an assistant receiver coach (2001-2002) and assistant defensive back coach (2003) at his alma mater, Wilmington College. At Wilmington, Cosby also assisted with the offensive scout team and with kickoff and punt returners, weekly film breakdown, scouting reports, and recruiting. Cosby, a 2001 Wilmington graduate with a B.S. in physical education, was a four-year starter at wide receiver for the Quakers. As a senior, Cosby earned second-team All-Ohio Athletic Conference and Division III All-America honors by the USA Football All-America team. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Backs and Recruiting Coordinator

**KRIS DIAZ** will be in his ninth season as the Yellow Jacket quarterbacks coach. Diaz, a 1978 graduate of the College, returned to his alma mater after serving as the head coach at Elyria Catholic H.S. in 1996 and 1997. Prior to being at Elyria Catholic, Diaz was the head coach at Division II Bemidji State in Minnesota from 1989-96 and an assistant coach at Division II Moorhead State from 1983-89. He was also an assistant football and basketball as well as the head track coach at Friends University in Kansas from 1979-83. In addition to earning his undergraduate degree at B-W, Diaz has a Master's degree from the University of Akron in 1979 and a specialist's degree in educational administration from Moorhead State in 1994. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Offensive Line

**JAMIE FLEMING** is in his second season on the Yellow Jacket staff as an assistant football coach. The 1999 graduate of the College and former football player, football student-coach and four-year wrestling letterman, will work with the Yellow Jacket running backs. Fleming comes back to B-W following a six-year stint as an assistant football coach at local Middleburg Heights Midpark H.S. He served as the offensive coordinator for two years and worked with the running backs, punters, kickers and special teams. Fleming also coordinated Midpark's Kicking Camp. He also served as an assistant wrestling and track and field coach, where he worked with the sprinters and vaulters. Fleming graduated from B-W with a Bachelor of Arts degree in physical education. While at B-W, Fleming played wide receiver. Fleming is currently a health and physical education teacher at Midpark High School. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Running Backs/Kickers/Punters

**ADAM HOWARD** is in his fifth season as an assistant coach and fourth as the defensive coordinator at B-W. Howard was recognized for his efforts by receiving the OAC *Assistant Coach of the Year* award in 2003. A graduate of Springfield Northwestern High School in 1993, Howard received his Bachelor of Science degree from Wilmington College in 1997 and is currently pursuing his Master's degree from the University of Dayton. Prior to coming to B-W, Howard was the defensive coordinator and recruiting coordinator for the Wilmington Quaker football team. He also served as the head football coach in 2002 and as an assistant baseball coach from 1999-2001. Howard served as the defensive ends coach at the University of Dayton in 1998-1999. While at Wilmington, Howard played four years of football and earned four varsity letters as a defensive back. He was a two-time All-American Mideast Conference selection and earned *Football Gazette* All-North Region honors as a senior. Howard also served as a team captain as a senior at WC. In addition to football at Wilmington, Howard ran track as a freshman and played baseball as a sophomore and earned a varsity letter in each sport. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Coordinator

**RAY HRADEK** is in his third season as an assistant coach at his alma mater. The 1980 graduate and former B-W standout coaches the wide receivers. Prior to returning to B-W, Hradek served as an assistant coach at Brunswick H.S. (2000-2003). Hradek was also the head football coach at Middleburg Heights Midpark H.S. from 1988-99 and had a career mark of 73-47, including one state playoff appearance and two Pioneer Conference titles. Twice he was the *PC Coach of the Year*. Hradek also coached the west team to a victory in the 1995 Cuyahoga County East-West All-Star Game. In addition to coaching at both Brunswick and Midpark, Hradek also coached at North Olmsted H.S. (1986-87), Lakewood St. Edward H.S. (1984-85) and Mayfield H.S. (1981). He is a member and a past president of the Greater Cleveland Football Coaches Association. While at B-W, Hradek played football and was a member of B-W's Ohio Athletic Conference championship teams of 1977 and 1978, its NCAA Division III National Championship team of 1978 and served as the team captain in 1979 when the Yellow Jackets again advanced to the Division III Playoffs. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Wide Receivers

**DEAN LASLEY** is in his first season of working with the varsity defensive backs at his alma mater. Coach Lasley, a 1996 graduate of the College, comes back to B-W after coaching at Parma Senior High School for the past eight years. He also served as an assistant coach at Macedonia Nordonia H.S. following graduation. Coach Lasley also earned a Master's of Arts Education degree from B-W in 2002 and currently teaches social studies at Parma Senior H.S. He also coached on the West squad in the annual East-West All-Star Game in 1994. While at B-W as a student-athlete, Coach Lasley was a three-year letterman and served as a team captain in 1995. He was an OAC Defensive Player of the Week in 1994 and helped the Yellow Jackets win an OAC co-title that season. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Varsity Defensive Backs

**RAY MOHR** is in his first season on the Yellow Jacket staff and will served as the Freshman Offensive Coordinator.

**ROY MOORE** begins his 21st season on the Yellow Jackets' staff and 19th coaching the outside linebackers. Coach Moore is the senior member of the staff. He is a 1972 graduate and football letterman at B-W. He received his Master's degree from B-W in 1993. Moore coached for 12 years at Midpark High School in the football, basketball and track programs. During his last six years at Midpark, Moore served as defensive coordinator. Moore is a computer science teacher and curriculum coordinator at Berea High School. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Outside Linebackers

**GUS PATOUHAS** enters his 13th season at his alma mater and is in charge of the defensive line. Patouhas, a 1993 B-W graduate, was a three-year starter at defensive end. He earned *Football Gazette* NCAA Division III All-American honors and was B-W's Dick Van Almen Award winner in 1992. In 2002, Patouhas was inducted into the Keystone H.S. Athletic Hall of Fame. At B-W, Patouhas was an Academic All-OAC selection. In 2002, he graduated with honors with a Master's of Education degree from Cleveland State University. He currently teaches physical education in the Berea School System. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Line

**IAN SHOEMAKER** begins his first season as the Offensive Coordinator and quarterbacks coach at B-W. Coach Shoemaker comes to Berea following a successful three-year stint at Kenyon College. At Kenyon, Coach Shoemaker served as the Assistant Head Coach, Offensive Coordinator and Recruiting Coordinator. Before taking on duties at Kenyon, Shoemaker spent three years at Minot State (N.D.) University as an offensive coach and its head baseball coach. A native of Graham, Washington, Shoemaker also coached football and was the head baseball coach at St. Mary (Kan.) College and coached football and fast-pitch softball at Western Washington University from 1997-1999. A graduate of Grinnell (Iowa) College, Shoemaker where he was a four-year starter in both football and baseball. The psychology major was the football Most Valuable Player and Offensive Back of the Year and set school records for homeruns in a season and career in baseball. Coach Shoemaker received his master's degree in physical education, health and recreation from Western Washington in 1999. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks

**MIKE SMITH** starts his 16th season as a member of the Yellow Jacket coaching staff. Smith, a 1979 graduate of Miami (Ohio) University, coaches the tight ends. Following graduation, Smith served as a coach at the high school level and Oberlin College. At B-W, Smith has coached the offensive line, running backs and now the tight ends. Smith has served as an offensive line coach at the University of Michigan and The Ohio State University summer camps. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Tight Ends

**RON SKELLELY**, a 1971 graduate of the College, is in his third season at B-W. He will work with the freshman linebackers and is the freshman team defensive coordinator. He received his Master's Degree in Education from B-W in 1982. In addition, Skelley was the head football coach at Parma Senior H.S. from 1993-2003 and the head football coach at Parma Normandy H.S. from 1987-1993. In addition to his coaching duties, he is a social studies teacher at Parma H.S. and was the 1986 Parma Public Schools and Ohio House of Representatives Outstanding Teacher. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Freshman Defensive Coordinator

**GARY WRUBLEWSKI** is in his second season on the Yellow Jacket staff and will work with the linebackers, help to coordinate the special teams and assist with strength and conditioning. Wroblewski comes to B-W from Cleveland Heights High School, where he served in a number of capacities since 2000. Previously, he worked with the Cleveland Browns from 1986-1991 as an assistant strength and conditioning coach. Wroblewski also has served as an assistant coach at the collegiate level at both John Carroll University and Columbia (N.Y.) University, in the high school ranks at Wickliffe H.S. and St. Peter Chanel H.S. and with the Cleveland Fusion of the Women's Professional Football League. While serving as a strength and conditioning coach, Wroblewski has worked with a number of players at the high school and collegiate levels who have advanced to play for NCAA Division I football programs and professional teams in the National Football League (NFL). Wroblewski graduated from Bowling Green State University with a Bachelor of Science degree and was a member of the Scholar-Athlete Honor Roll. He is a certified strength and conditioning specialist by the National Strength and Conditioning Association and earned his Masters of Education in sport management and exercise science from Cleveland State University. Wroblewski currently teaches at Cleveland Heights High School. **AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY:** Defensive Lins, Special Teams and Strength and Conditioning.

## A Tradition of Academic and Athletic Excellence; B-W has produced 20 Academic All-Americans in football since 1972

**BEREA, OHIO** -- The Baldwin-Wallace College football program has a tradition of producing outstanding football teams and outstanding student-athletes.

During the 34 years that CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) have chosen a College Division Academic All-America team, B-W has produced 23 Academic All-Americans in football, including 2005 graduate and third-team pick Justin Andes. Andes carried a 3.9 grade average and was the Yellow Jackets leading tackler in the secondary as a senior.

A year earlier, offensive center Tom Kovacevich continued a run by Jacket offensive linemen. Kovacevich carried a 3.8 grade point average with

a triple major. Three years ago, Matt Kish '03 was a first-team Academic All-America pick for the second straight year and won the Milton T. Baldwin Prize at graduation as the senior with the highest grade point average. He was joined as an Academic All-American that year by then junior offensive tackle Joe Harbour '04. Harbour became a two-time honoree.

Overall, the total B-W athletic program has produced 62 Academic All-Americans in the last 34 years -- more than any other OAC school.

In the past three years, B-W has had 27 student-athletes named Academic All-OAC and 14 more tabbed as CoSIDA Academic All-District IV selections.

This year, B-W begins the fall with

31 football student-athletes with a 3.0 or better grade point average, including four returning Academic All-OAC players. They are senior running back Brandon Hedges (Oregon/Clay), senior offensive lineman Tom Lutz (Oregon/Clay), junior punter Kevin Soflkiancs (Middleburg Heights/Midpark), and senior safety Matt Stevens (North Canton/Glen Oak).

Below is a listing of the returning players who will qualify as both Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference (3.25 minimum grade point average) and *ESPN THE MAGAZINE/CoSIDA* Academic All-District IV and Academic All-America candidates (a minimum 3.20 G.P.A.).

# The Yellow Jackets Look to Challenge

**BEREA, OHIO --** The 2006 Baldwin-Wallace College football team will seek to return the Yellow Jacket program into the elite in the Ohio Athletic Conference and begin a new winning streak.

Fifth-year Head Coach John Snell will welcome more than 180 student-athletes to preseason camp in early August. Included in that group are 39 lettermen and 14 starters. The goals remain the same for Snell's Yellow Jackets: to win the OAC title, qualify for the NCAA Division III National Playoffs and win the Division III national title.

"Every year we have high expectations for our football program and its student-athletes," said Snell, a 1987 graduate of the College. "We want our young men to strive to be the best that they can possibly be in the classroom, on

sophomore season. If we can get him the ball and he stays healthy, he will again be one of the best rushers in the OAC," Snell said.

A year ago, Hedges ran for 571 yards in 132 attempts with seven TD. As a sophomore, he earned first-team All-OAC accolades when he ran for an OAC-best 1,162 yards in 225 attempts with 13 TD. He also is a solid receiver with 33 career catches for 304 yards and two TD. Hedges will also serve as a co-captain in 2006.

Complementing Hedges in the backfield will be juniors Brad Rhoden (Galena/ Sunbury Big Walnut) and Joe Koren (Brunswick). Rhoden ran for 315 yards and three TD, caught nine passes for 57 yards and added 295 punt and kickoff return yards to lead the Jackets' with 687 all-purpose yards last season. At fullback, senior Seth Whiting (Canal Fulton/ Northwest) will be battling with Koren for playing time.

The offensive line returns a solid group of guys. The line is led by Lutz. Fellow seniors Eric Foisel (Willowick/ Eastlake North) and Adam Laurell (Oregon/ Clay) along with junior Matt Scarl (North Olmsted) anchor a large group of guys that will compete for playing time this season.

"This year, we have more depth on the offensive line than in past seasons," said Snell. "I am really excited to get into camp and see these guys battle and to see who rises above the rest. As is always the case though, we need to keep these guys healthy and have a solid core of guys throughout the entire season to be effective."

Senior Tom Murphy (Richfield/ Revere) returns to lead the receiving corps and is joined by veterans Drew Beichler (Orrville/ Smithville), Vinny Latessa (Wickliffe) and Matt Lepley (Bellevue). Murphy caught 10 passes last

the field and on our campus. We want our young men to be leaders."

The offense is going to be the key for the Yellow Jackets in 2006. "We have a good group of returning starters who all have lots of experience. The only question is whether the offense can execute the way they are capable of," Snell proclaimed.

Back to lead Snell's offense in 2006 is junior quarterback Mickey Mental (Olmsted Falls), senior All-OAC and Academic All-OAC running back Brandon Hedges (Oregon/ Clay), a solid receiving corps and an offensive line that is led by All-OAC and two-time Academic All-OAC guard Tom Lutz (Oregon/ Clay).

Mental earned the QB job a year ago and will battle this fall with sophomore Lee Yoder (West Liberty/ West Liberty-Salem), junior Josh Heidebrink (Perrysburg/ Rossford) and sophomore transfer John DiFiore (Hubbard/ Warren J.F.K.) for the starting job.

"Mickey is the front-runner coming into camp, but he will have some tough competition to keep his spot," said Snell.

A year ago, Mental ran for 320 yards and completed 70-of-126 passes for 707 yards with four TD and six interceptions.

Hedges returns this fall with the possibility of being B-W's all-time leading rusher if he has a solid and injury-free season. He enters his final campaign in the Brown & Gold with 1,747 career rushing yards in 360 attempts with 20 TD.

"We look for Brandon to pickup where he left off his

season for 201 yards and two TD. Beichler caught 13 passes for 126 yards, Latessa grabbed seven for 130 yards and Lepley grabbed eight for 64 yards.

In addition, senior Rob Lewis (Castalia/ Margaretta)

is another target for Mental. The shift of Lewis a year ago from quarterback to receiver provides Mental a tall target to throw to. Lewis, in limited time while learning his new position, caught seven passes for 85 yards. Also look for tight ends Casey Fox (Huron) and Vinnie Sette (Clinton/Northwest) to contribute with both solid blocking and clutch pass catching. Fox grabbed 12 passes for 106 yards in 2005.

When the Yellow Jackets need to kick the football, Snell can call upon at least two reliable players for help in senior Mike Anthony (Conneaut) and junior Adam Wilburn (Bucyrus/ Wynford). A year ago, Anthony connected on 15-of-16 PATs and four-of-seven field goals to place second on the team in scoring with 27 points. Wilburn was a perfect one-of-one on field goal attempts last season.

Defensively, Coordinator Adam Howard will have a tough task in replacing graduated All-American end Ryan Lewis, All-American middle linebacker Joe George and three-time All-OAC outside linebacker Justin Princehorn. The trio were among the best to ever don the Brown & Gold and accounted for a combined 758 tackles.

“Our main goal on defense is to find someone to step up and fill the big shoes left by last years seniors. Once we find those people, the next thing we need to do is keep them healthy,” said Snell. “We had some injuries last year that really hurt our defense, but I have a lot of confidence in Coach Howard (Defensive Coordinator Adam Howard) and he will have our guys ready to play each week.”

On the line, Howard will return junior tackle Matt Leber (Norwalk/ Senior), who missed all of last year due to an injury. He will team with sophomore Joe Kowalski (Macedonia/ Nordonia), a starter last fall. Kowalski had the most tackles a year ago with 28 and added 2.5 quarterback sacks.

At the end position, look for juniors Dale Buckner (Berea) and Kevin Pozek (Middleburg Heights/ Parma Padua) to battle with juniors Andy Danford and Don Schroeder (Lakewood/ Senior) and sophomore Brent Remenaric (Navarre/ Fairless) for playing time.

According to Snell, “Getting Leber, Kowalski, Buckner and Pozek back from injury this season will hopefully add some depth and stability up front. Our main goal for the defensive line this season is keeping them healthy.” In addition, junior Austin Morrison (Alliance/ Marlinton) and a bevy of freshman will challenge for playing time on the defensive line.

The linebacking corps has some big shoes to fill. The three starting linebackers from a year ago were among the top five on the team in tackles. Leading the group will be senior Dave Brown (North Olmsted), junior Luke Chronister (Ashland/ Senior), sophomore Joe Hance (Barberton) and transfer Paul Burger (Mentor via Edinboro, Pa. State University). Chronister is the top returnee in terms of tackles after having 28 a year ago. Brown had 27. In addition, junior Nick Schubert (Dayton/ Oakwood) returns after spending last season away from football. As a freshman, Schubert saw considerable action at LB and on special teams and made 13 tackles. His return will be another key.

“Obviously losing all three starters from last season leaves a hole, but we have a good group of guys that will challenge for the spots and make for an interesting battle during camp,” said Snell. “Getting the two transfers will help too.”

The secondary all returns. Senior Jake Knipp (Amherst/ Steele) is one of the best in the OAC and returns

with fellow senior safety Matt Stevens (North Canton/ GlenOak). Cornerbacks Darren Cereshko (Medina/ Buckeye), a junior, and Jim Wochele (Richmond Heights), a senior, also return. Knipp led all tacklers in the secondary a year ago with 44 stops. He also intercepted a pass, broke up seven others and ran back a fumble 50 yards for a TD. Stevens had 41 tackles.

“We have a very experienced defensive backfield that should provide some stability,” said Snell. “I am excited to have these guys back and I am looking for some great things to happen in our secondary. Jake Knipp makes things happen. He is the leader of that group.”

In addition, junior “nickle back” Tim Botson (Brunswick), who had 36 tackles, and juniors Kyle Lednik (Hilliard/ Darby) and Dan Cereshko (Medina/ Buckeye), twin bother to Darren, will add depth and support in the secondary.

The Yellow Jackets are afforded one of the top Division III punters in junior 2005 All-American Kevin Soflkiancs (Middleburg Heights/ Midpark). Two years ago, Soflkiancs led the nation in punting at 42.7 yards per boot and led the league again a year ago at 39.8 yards overall.

“Kevin is a special kid. You never want to take anything for granted, but Kevin has been so consistent the past two seasons that we can count on him to give us a good kick every time,” says Snell.

Overall, Snell says he excited to start the ‘06 season. “We have some holes to fill and some starting spots to be won and with that on the line, competition will be high in camp and that's what makes camp fun,” says Snell. “I love to see the guys battling against each other because in the long run, that's what makes each of them better.”

The Yellow Jackets open the 2006 season with a trip to Rock Island, Illinois to play the Vikings of Augustana College. This is only the second time the B-W will play Augustana. The Vikings won the only other meeting in 1982 by a score of 28-22.

One key for the Yellow Jackets this season is that they will play the top three teams in the OAC from a year ago, Mount Union, Ohio Northern and Capital all on the “magic carpet” of Finnie Stadium. “Obviously it is great to play these teams at home,” says Snell.

“We would like to play all 10 games at home if we could, but we know we still have to play the top teams sometime and it is an added bonus to play them at home.”

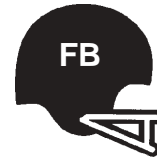

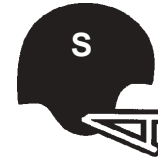

The Baldwin-Wallace College Football student-athlete is one of the best publicized in all of small college and NCAA Division III athletics. Several factors help this to happen.

Its location, its national and conference affiliation and philosophy of athletics, its administration and coaches and its support of the student-athlete all play large roles in telling others about B-W and the successes of its student-athletes.

Baldwin-Wallace College is a small, private, liberal arts college located 12 miles southwest of Cleveland, Ohio. While being in the small and pro-gressive local community of Berea, B-W student-athletes benefit from being close to a major urban area such as Greater Cleveland/Akron. B-W athletics receive support both in Cleveland and Akron and in the Berea community itself.

Being a member of the prestigious Ohio Athletic Conference and playing NCAA Division III athletics also is an advantage. Coaches who are teachers first forge a solid commitment to the Division III philosophy of the student-athlete.

Baldwin-Wallace also is proud of its athletic heritage and the fact that it has produced 62 College Division Academic All-Americans since 1970, including three in 2005-2006. In football, the Yellow Jacket program has produced 23 Academic All-American student-athletes since 1970. *See more about the academic excellence of our football student-athletes on page 5.*

Support in terms of facilities, equipment and transportation and in staff provides the Baldwin-Wallace student-athlete with a luxury not enjoyed at many other schools. One part of that support is in the area of sports information.

A diligent staff of B-W sport information student assistants and sport management majors work with the director to publicize B-W and its coaches and student-athletes in 21 NCAA Division III sports.

The students learn first-hand about publicizing a program by updating the internet website, writing hometown press releases and doing feature stories, doing game and cumulative statistics as well as statistical analysis, game and special event programs, Web-based and media guides, contacting local, state and national media sources prior to and after each game and promoting and administering special events during athletic contests.

Each Yellow Jacket Football student-athlete receives at least one hometown press release which is sent to the individual student-athlete newspaper list. When the student-athletes fill out a preseason questionnaire, each is asked to list his or her hometown newspaper.

After each football game, the internet website is updated, a

FAX is sent to B-W's base of local, state and national media that regularly cover or have requested B-W coverage. In addition, hometown facsimile messages about individual performances are also sent either the date of the contest, the next day and during the week preceding the next game. Statistics are also updated and made available to all requesting the information.

Campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, broadcasts all home and away football games on-air and on the Internet. In addition, Salem Communications of Cleveland broadcasts nine of the 10 Yellow Jacket games throughout the Greater Cleveland area on WHK (1420 AM) or WHKW (1000 AM) or WKNR (850 AM). *You can access the Yellow Jacket football games on WBWC via the College Internet Web site at [www.bw.edu/athletics](http://www.bw.edu/athletics) or at [www.wbwc.com](http://www.wbwc.com).* A number of former B-W student broadcasters have gone to successful careers in the Greater Cleveland area, both in radio and in television. In addition, the four local commercial television stations and numerous radio stations do game coverage and feature interviews on a selected basis.

The B-W football student-athlete receives excellent local small college coverage both in terms of game coverage and hometown coverage by *The Plain Dealer* (Cleveland's major daily with a circulation of more than 500,000 homes), the *Chronicle-Telegram* (based in Elyria, Ohio), the *Morning Journal* (based in Lorain, Ohio), the *Beacon-Journal* (based in Akron, Ohio), the *Medina County Gazette* (based in Medina, Ohio), the *Sun News-papers* (Cleveland's largest weekly newspaper serving the Greater Cleveland area) and a number of other daily and weekly publications throughout Northeast Ohio.

The sports information office offers the student-athlete the opportunity to receive maximum exposure at the small college level. In addition, the B-W sports information student assistant garners solid skills in writing, communications, advertising, marketing, promotion, Web site and publication layout and design and sport and event management. Overall, 21 former Yellow Jacket SID student assistants have gone on to sports information, marketing, promotion and/or management careers in the college and professional ranks at such places as the Kansas City Chiefs (NFL), the Toledo Mudhens, Akron Aeros and Jamestown Jammers (minor league baseball), Turner Sports in Atlanta, Host Communications (the PR arm of the NCAA), the Raycom Sports Network, the University of Texas at Austin, Notre Dame (Ind.) University, the University of Cincinnati, Arizona State University, the University of Nebraska, the University of Arkansas, Kent State University, Monmouth (N.J.) University, the University of Florida, Louisville University, the University of Tennessee, the University of North Carolina at Wilmington, Fresno State University, the University of New Mexico, Eastern Michigan University, Youngstown State University, the Ohio Athletic Conference, Hiram College, Heidelberg College, Mercyhurst (Pa.) College and Olivet (Mich.) College.

"We are extremely proud of what our young people have accomplished in the areas of sports information, marketing and promotion," said SID Kevin Ruple. "It is a credit to the College and its leadership.

# The Yellow Jacket Athletic Facilities Are Among the Best in NCAA Division III Athletics

The Baldwin-Wallace College football student-athlete is afforded the opportunity to learn, exercise, practice and play in some of the finest facilities in small college athletics. In addition, as a student at B-W, each has an opportunity to use a group of facilities that are unparalleled in Division III athletics.

The expanded and newly renovated Lou Higgins Center with the Ursprung Gymnasium, Harrison Dillard Track and Natatorium, The George Finnie Stadium with an additional grass field adjacent to it and behind Bagley Hall (the old Cleveland Browns Training Facility), the Heritage Field for baseball, the "Pop" Collins Tennis Complex and other outdoor recreation and athletic areas at Baldwin-Wallace make the Yellow Jackets physical plant second to none among small colleges.

The Lou Higgins Center, dedicated on October 18, 1986, is a facility that benefits all B-W students, faculty, staff and alumni and is considered one of the top recreation facilities in the country.

The 170,000 square foot Rec Center serves as home for the health and physical education departments, all winter intercollegiate and intramural sports, as well as playing host for a number of amateur sporting events.

The Rec Center, which includes the Rudolph S. Ursprung Gymnasium, serves as the home of Yellow Jackets basketball, volleyball and wrestling teams. Ursprung Gymnasium, which has housed B-W basketball since 1949, received a complete renovation in 1986 and was renovated again this summer. In addition to B-W playing in the Ursprung Gym, the Ohio High School Athletic Association has long used the B-W facility for its sectional and district tournaments for boys.

The fieldhouse consists of a 200-meter, six-lane track that is named for 1949 B-W graduate and four-time Olympic gold medalist Harrison Dillard. The track, with its Mondo surface, is both fast and comfortable for the walker, jogger or serious runner. Pits for the field events are also incorporated. The track surrounds three multi-purpose courts that can be used individually or in tandem for volleyball, basketball, tennis and other activities. On many occasions, the B-W basketball team has been playing a game while a wrestling match or an intramural basketball game was taking place in the Rec Center fieldhouse.

The Harrison Dillard Track, along with the multi-purpose courts, have been home for the B-W indoor track teams, the John Summa Invitational Wrestling Tournament, the Ohio Sports Festival (basketball and wrestling venues) and many local high school track meets.

Also in the Rec Center is the B-W Natatorium, home to the Yellow Jacket swimming and diving teams. The facility includes a 25-yard, six-lane pool with a one-meter diving board. The movable pool bottom has adaptive physical therapy applications and can be used by the disabled.

As part of the renovation of Ursprung in 1986, chairback seating and a media center were constructed while training and physical therapy, laundry and eight locker rooms were added. Other features include a room for news media as well as exhibit and storage areas for the B-W Athletic Archives.

The Archives give students, alumni, parents, friends and visitors to Baldwin-Wallace a glimpse of the rich tradition and heritage of Yellow Jacket teams and athletic greats.

The George Finnie Stadium is one of the nations best small college stadiums for football and track and field. The Yellow Jacket men's and women's soccer teams also play at Finnie and numerous Ohio High School Athletic Association State Playoff games have been held at Finnie in addition to an Ohio State University Scarlet & White Spring Game and a few Cleveland Browns and Pittsburgh Steeler Alumni contests.

In terms of track and field, B-W has already hosted five NCAA Division III national championship track meets, a Pan-American Games qualifying meet, a number of high school sectional and district track meets and is the home field to both Berea High School and Middleburg Heights Midpark High School. The Ohio Sports Festival/Ohio State Games also used Finnie as both a regional and state championship site.

The B-W Baseball Field is located on the campus within walking distance of the student dormitories. The facility has a manicured playing surface and seating for approximately 200 fans. The B-W Baseball Field has been the host site for four OAC Baseball Tournaments and is home to the nationally-ranked Yellow Jacket baseball squad.

The "Pop" Collins Tennis complex is named in honor of former B-W tennis coach and teacher Arthur Worth Collins, the father of nationally renowned sportswriter and television tennis analyst Arthur "Bud" Collins '51. The facility is on campus and includes six courts which are lighted for night play.

In addition, the Yellow Jacket softball team plays at the Cuyahoga County Fairgrounds Field. The facility has dugouts, a permanent fence and scoreboard and is one of the best softball facilities in the OAC.

Does such a strong group of facilities benefit the Yellow Jacket football? Definitely! Practice time is available in the Finnie Stadium the week of a game on turf, on the grass field adjacent to Finnie Stadium on the week of a game on grass and in the Lou Higgins Center during times of inclement weather.

In addition, B-W has always had a close working relationship with the National Football League's Cleveland Browns. At one time, the Browns had their main offices located on the B-W campus. That building is now known as Bagley Hall. The grass practice field behind Bagley Hall is the same one of the Browns used for many years.

The Browns have since moved to their current location on Lou Groza Blvd. and are just two blocks from campus. At times of inclement weather, B-W has occasionally been able to use the Browns indoor practice facility.

"Finnie Stadium, the Lou Higgins Center and the possibility of using the Cleveland Browns practice facility are a plus to our program," says Head Coach John Snell. "The playing, practice and dress facilities that our football student-athletes are afforded are among the finest in all of college athletics and especially in Division III."
