# Media Information

## Media are Welcome at Practice and at All Home Games

**BEREA, OHIO --** The Sports Information Office at Baldwin-Wallace College always welcomes coverage of its football program and student-athletes from legitimate media sources.

Before coming to campus, we first ask that all members of the media please contact Sports Information Director Kevin Ruple so that arrangements can be made both with Head Coach John Snell and his staff and student-athletes who participate in the Yellow Jacket football program.

The College allows coverage at most practices and all home games. Practices and games are conducted either on the grass field behind Bagley Hall which is adjacent to Tressel Field at The George

Finnie Stadium or on the newly installed FieldTurf surface of Tressel Field.

The George Finnie Stadium is located at 141 E. Bagley Road in Berea, Ohio, 44017. Bagley Hall is located at 123 E. Bagley Road. Generally there is plenty of parking in The George Finnie Stadium and Kleist Center for Art & Drama parking lot. Once classes begin on August 23, 2010, a visitor parking permit will need to be obtained during the work week, but not on game day. A visitor parking permit can be obtained for you by the SID.

The practice schedule during the preseason varies from day-to-day. The intrasquad scrimmage is set for Saturday, August 20. On Thursday, Aug. 25, B-W will

travel to University Circle for its preseason scrimmage against cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University. The start of the scrimmage is set for 6:00 p.m.

## Four B-W Football Games to be Televised by SportsTime Ohio

**BEREA, OHIO --** Four Baldwin-Wallace College football games, including three home contests, will be televised on SportsTime Ohio this season. Veteran sportscaster Adam Mendoza will do the play-by-play with a student from B-W's communication department offering the color analysis.

B-W, in conjunction with S & S Video Productions, will tape and produce the games that will be given to SportsTime Ohio to air. The broadcasts have the capability of reaching 3.4 million households in the SportsTime Ohio family of networks and many more via Dish and Direct TV access. The 2011-12 year will mark the fifth straight year that B-W and S&S have teamed to broadcast athletic events.

In addition to Yellow Jacket football student-athletes and their families being able to view the "fruits of their labor of love" on the gridiron, a group of students from B-W's communication and sport management areas gain valuable experience working hand-in-hand with professionals from S & S.

"This is an outstanding opportunity for both our football student-athletes to gain exposure on television, for the College to gain exposure and for our communication and sport management students to gain valuable practical experience," said Yellow Jacket **Head Football Coach John Snell**.

# Coverage of Yellow Jacket Football in Print and Electronic Media in Berea, Greater Cleveland and Globally

**BEREA, OHIO --** The Baldwin-Wallace College football student-athlete receives media visibility both on and off campus. He receives some of the best coverage in NCAA Division III football, whether it is in the newspaper, on radio, television or via the Internet.

### On Campus Coverage; and Off-Campus Broadcasts

The Yellow Jacket football squad benefits from having the program publicized on campus in the student newspaper, *The Exponent*, via campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, and via the College Web site at both [www.bw.edu/athletics](http://www.bw.edu/athletics).

*The Exponent* has covered Yellow Jacket athletics exploits for many years and is a weekly publication that includes game and feature stories on B-W student-athletes, coaches, managers, trainers and other support personnel.

All 10 Yellow Jacket football games will be broadcast on WBWC. The coverage begins on gameday with a pregame show, continues during the contest and ends with a postgame show. Fans can listen to either the radio broadcast or the Internet feed live.

### The John Snell Show and Sports Pulse

This season, in addition to WBWC car-

rying all 10 games live, Co-Sports Directors Chris Terlop and Alex Hooper and their student staff will host a weekly "John Snell Coaches Corner" show on Tuesday's at 7:30 p.m. That show will be followed by WBWC's award-winning show "Sports Pulse" from 8:00-9:00 p.m.

During each John Snell show, Terlop, Hooper, and their staff will interview Coach Snell, other members of the coaching staff and members of the football squad and support staff about the upcoming game, last week's contest and any other pertinent information regarding the program.

As a part of the show, Terlop and Hooper will have plenty of giveaway items for students and fans who join them at Mike's Bar and Grille in Berea.

### Off-Campus Coverage

Off campus, the Yellow Jacket football program is publicized by both print and electronic media sources via newspapers, radio, television and Internet.

### Weekly Newspapers

Locally, the *Berea Sun-News* covers Yellow Jacket athletics and is joined by a number of other weekly Sun Newspaper publications in Greater Cleveland that help publicize Yellow Jacket athletics pursuits.

In addition to the Sun papers, the Westlake WestLife, North Ridgeville Press-Light, and other hometown papers do an excellent job of covering their local high school graduates who compete in athletics at B-W.

### Daily Newspapers

In the Greater Cleveland area, the Yellow Jackets receive coverage in a number of local daily newspapers. They include *The Plain Dealer* (a seven-county coverage area), both the *Elyria Chronicle-Telegram* and *Lorain Morning Journal* in Lorain County, the *Medina County Gazette* and the *Lake County News-Herald*.

All five newspapers also do an outstanding job of covering their local high school graduates who compete at B-W.

### The Web site

The College Athletics Web site is updated daily during the school year and during the summer on an as-needed basis. The site contains schedules, rosters, coach and player biographies, web guides, game stories, event and feature stories, current and archived statistics, program information and on-line recruiting questionnaires. ## Home Game Coverage at Tressel Field at The George Finnie Stadium

**BEREA, OHIO --** Baldwin-Wallace College welcomes media coverage at all home games which are played at Tressel Field at The George Finnie Stadium.

The Finnie Stadium pressbox has two floors. The bottom floor accommodates the announcer, official statisticians and print and broadcast media. There are phone outlets and Internet data ports available for working media members.

The top floor has a camera bay, separate rooms for the coaches from each team, a radio/TV booth and a room for the scoreboard and game clock operators.

In addition, there are two additional camera bays located at each 30-yard line. Each outside camera bay also has additional seating for overflow media.

To gain access to the pressbox, please

contact B-W Sports Information Director Kevin Ruple by telephone at 440-826-2327, by writing and sending a detailed facsimile message at 440-826-2329 or a detailed e-mail message to [kruple@bw.edu](mailto:kruple@bw.edu).

Prior to each game, members of the media receive a detailed press kit that includes a game program, game notes, team and individual statistics from each opponent, a 2-deep depth chart and a number of other materials that may help them with their coverage.

At halftime, the sports information office provides first half statistics, food and beverage and other hospitality items for those who are present to cover the game.

Following the game, a full packet of postgame statistical information will be made available as well as the head coach

and student-athletes from each school for interviews.

In the case of a game that has high importance, the SID Office may reserve the right to host a postgame press conference in the Lou Higgins Center, which is located directly across the street from The George Finnie Stadium.

In addition to communicating with and assisting with the needs of media who attend the game, the B-W SID Office makes numerous phone calls, sends FAXes and e-mails of game results and coordinates the updating of its and other Web sites.

# Ninth-Year Head Coach John Snell



Baldwin-Wallace College graduate John Snell '87 enters his 10th season as the Head Coach of the Yellow Jackets in the fall of 2011. Snell led the Yellow Jacket football program back to the NCAA Division III National Playoffs in 2003, and his goal is to have B-W in the playoffs every year.

"We will work hard to help keep the B-W program one of the best in Division III," said Snell, who has an outstanding 56-36 career record with a .609 winning percentage. "Our goal is to win the OAC title and win the NCAA Division III national title. Both our players and coaching staff are dedicated and committed to making it happen."

"I have a responsibility to keep strong the tradition of excellence of our football program and its student-athletes," said Snell. "We are all committed to continuing that tradition of excellence and look forward to the challenges ahead."

Snell finished his 17th season at his alma mater in 2010. He had previously served as an assistant coach in charge of quarterbacks and recruiting and was the Yellow Jacket offensive coordinator for five years. In the spring of 2001, Snell was elevated to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator.

Snell was hand-picked to take over the Yellow Jacket program by former Head Coach and 1965 B-W graduate Bob Packard. Packard, who ended his career as the winningest coach in B-W history, learned his trade from College Football Hall of Famer Lee Tressel.

In his first season as the head coach of the Yellow Jackets, Snell led his team to an impressive 8-2 overall record and a ranking both in the North Region and national Division III polls. For his efforts, he was selected as the OAC *Co-Coach of the Year* by his peers.

In the fall of 2003, Snell's program went two steps further. He led the Yellow Jackets to a 10-2 overall record and his team received B-W's first NCAA Division III Playoff berth since 1991 and won its first playoff game since 1978. In 2006, B-W had a 7-3 record and Snell earned his second OAC *Co-Coach of the Year* honor. A year ago, B-W finished 7-3 overall and forecasts are bright for another strong season in 2011.

Prior to returning to his alma mater, Snell coached at the University of Rochester (1987-88 and again from 1992-94), at Rutgers University (1988-90) and the University of Buffalo (1990-92). Snell is a native of Albion, New York and graduated from Albion High School in 1983.

Snell and his wife, Shelly, reside in Strongsville and have three children.

The 1999 graduate of the College and former football player, football student-coach and four-year wrestling letterman, worked with the Yellow Jacket running backs for five seasons and last season with the wide receivers. He additionally has worked for six seasons with the kickers and punters. # A Tradition of Academic and Athletic Excellence:

*B-W has produced 25 Academic All-Americans in football since 1970*

**BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College football program has a tradition of producing outstanding football teams and student-athletes and the 2011 team should be no different.**

**During the 40 years that CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) has chosen a College Division Academic All-America team, B-W has produced 25 Academic All-Americans in football, including four-time first-team All-Ohio Athletic Conference and three-time first-team Academic All-OAC punter Kevin Soflkiancs '08. He was the first player in the 106-year history of the OAC to be a four-time first-team All-OAC selection.**

**"We are extremely proud of our tradition of excellence when it comes to how our football student-athletes achieve both in the classroom and on the football field," said ninth-year Head Coach John Snell. "Our young men are at the College to first get an education and secondly to represent themselves and the College on the field of play. We are very proud of what our student-athletes have accomplished and we continue to strive every year to be a leader in the OAC."**

**Soflkiancs was selected to both the 2006 and 2007 ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America teams and graduated with honors and a 3.77 grade point average. He additionally received a Cleveland Touchdown Club Scholar-Athlete award and was a finalist for the 2007 Woody Hayes National Scholar-Athlete award.**

**"What Kevin did for four years at the College was pretty unbelievable," said Snell. "Not only did he graduate in less than four years, he was taking Master's of Business Administration classes during his final season of football. He maintained an excellent grade point average, was a leader on campus and in the community of Middleburg Heights and was one of the best punters in Division III. Every accolade that Kevin received was earned and well-deserved. He was an outstanding role model for all of our younger student-athletes to emulate."**

**In the past decade, the B-W football program has produced seven Academic All-Americans. Prior to Soflkiancs' selection, third-team pick Justin Andes '05 carried a 3.9 grade average and was the Yellow Jackets' leading tackler in the secondary. A year earlier, offensive center Tom Kovacevich '05 continued a run by Jacket offensive linemen. He carried a 3.8 grade point average with a triple major in math, business administration and economics. In addition, Matt Kish '03 was a first-team Academic All-America pick for the second straight year and won the Milton T. Baldwin Prize at graduation as the senior with the highest grade point average. He was joined as an Academic All-American that year by then junior offensive tackle Joe Harbour '04. A year later, Harbour joined Kish and became a two-time honoree.**

**Overall, the B-W athletic program as a whole has produced 80 Academic All-Americans in the last 40 years - more than any other OAC school and among the most of any small college in the nation.**

**In the past six years, B-W has had 13 Academic All-Americans in addition to 195 student-athletes named Academic All-OAC and 80 more tabbed as CoSIDA Academic All-District IV selections.**

**This year, the Yellow Jacket program boasts 36 football student-athletes with a 3.0 or better grade point average, including senior Academic All-OAC and CAPITAL ONE Academic All-District IV cornerback Matt Bowen, who carries a 3.685 grade average in business administration and accounting, and senior 2-time All-OAC safety Ryan Dugan, who carries a 3.114 grade point average in exercise science. Bowen intercepted two passes that he ran back for touchdowns last season. Two years ago, Dugan led the OAC in interceptions.**

**"We seek to challenge each young man in our football program to strive for excellence in the classroom and on the football field," said Snell. "This year, we look for guys like Ryan Dugan, Matt Bowen, Ryan O'Rourke, Jimmy Basar, Aaron Manders, Max Wagner and Aaron Hurd to lead by example and achieve success both academically and athletically.**

**"All of those guys maintain a better than 3.0 grade average and are key members of our starting lineup," continued Snell. "Every year we have great senior leadership, and this year will be no different. They are the caretakers of a rich B-W tradition of outstanding academics and excellent athletics."**

# The Yellow Jackets Look to Challenge for the 2011

BEREA, OHIO -- The 2011-12 Baldwin-Wallace College football team hopes to compete for both an Ohio Athletic Conference title and a berth in the 2011 NCAA Division III National Playoffs.

Leading the way for the Yellow Jackets will be the return of 43 lettermen and 17 fulltime starters, including 10 on offense and seven on defense. And, despite losing both its punter and placekicker to graduation, B-W returns two of the most explosive kick return specialists in Division III in sophomore speedsters Kevin Johnson and Josiah Holt. A total of 175 student-athletes are expected when preseason camp opens on August 12 in Berea.

Head Coach John Snell enters his 10th season at the helm of his alma mater and has compiled a career record of 56-36 with a .609 winning percentage.

"Our goals never change at B-W," said Snell. "Each year we set out to win championships. Our first goal is to win the prestigious Ohio Athletic Conference title. Our feeling is that if we can win the OAC title, we have what it takes to also win the NCAA Division III national title. History bears out that fact.

"Last season, we had a solid season and made some excellent improvement on both sides of the football and on special teams," continued Snell, speaking of last fall's 7-3 overall record, including a 6-3 mark in the OAC. "This season, we return a number of key student-athletes who have the talent and ability to take us to the next level of success. We are motivated and feel like we have the right team and staff in place to return B-W football to

where it belongs -- at the top of the OAC and Division III."

Offensively, the Yellow Jackets will be led by quarterbacks Ryan O'Rourke and Andrew Dziak, running back Tim Miker, tight end Aaron Hurd and a host of wideouts who all are experienced. In addition, a solid corp of offensive linemen who all contributed to last season's success are back and ready to contribute again.

In the backfield, O'Rourke will return as the starting QB and Dziak offers an experienced backup who offers opponents an explosive problem. Snell and his staff felt so strong about the duo, a few freshmen from last year's junior varsity team and the incoming recruits that they have moved last year's No.3 QB Josh Masters to an H-back/ TE spot where he can help the team even more in 2011.

O'Rourke returns after completing 119-of-213 passes for 1,513 yards and 16 touchdowns while tossing 10 interceptions. He also carried the ball 40 times for 154 yards and scored three TD. Dziak completed 2-of-4 aeriels for 21 yards and a TD and ran the ball 37 times for 169 yards and two scores.

"We feel that we have a solid returning starter in Ryan O'Rourke and Andrew Dziak offers us another explosive weapon," said Snell. "Once we build the depth, we'll feel pretty comfortable at the QB position."

Miker ran for a team-high 595 yards in 129 attempts and seven TD and will be the feature back with the graduation of Kyrell Crook and John McGraw. Miker also caught six passes for 75 yards.

"Tim is a very hard runner," said Snell. "Depending upon what happens in camp, Tim will be the main guy or sharing the load. He has demonstrated that he's a talented Division III runner."

Hurd, who earned All-OAC accolades last season, tops the returning receivers after catching 24 passes for 283 yards and three TD a year ago. He is one of 10 returning receivers who caught passes from O'Rourke or Dziak in 2010.

Also look for senior Troy Van Meter with 17 catches and two TD and junior Aaron Manders with 16 grabs and two TD, Holt with 16 catches and seniors Brett Jensen with 12 grabs and two TD and Dan Turner with seven grans and a TD to all be key targets for O'Rourke and Dziak.

In addition, senior Anthony Fairhurst (one TD) and sophomore Devin Woods (one TD) will battle that group for the opportunity to start.

Then we have to talk about Kevin Johnson. His role this season could feature him running the ball, catching the ball, playing the "lockdown" cornerback spot and definitely returning kickoffs. A year ago, he caught two passes, both for touchdowns, ran the ball once, averaged 28.7 yards with a TD in 20 kick returns, made 15 tackles and broke up four passes on defense and blocked a kick. Not bad for a freshman!

"Our receiving corps is deep and talented," noted Snell. "We return an All-OAC player in tight end Aaron Hurd and we have about 10 guys who all gained experience last year. This is one of our deepest spots."

The offensive line returns four starters, including senior center Jimmy Basar, senior tackle Travis Barnhill, senior guard Rudy Ackerman and sophomore guard Jason Cook. In addition, junior tackle Clay Wolf and sophomore Alex Lovasz all gained experience.

"Any success our offense has this season will have to start up front," said Snell. "We have a solid group of veterans that we need to stay healthy and help work our younger guys into the mix. Any successful offense needs to have stability on the O-Line."

Defensively, B-W will be led by its outstanding secondary which is headed by a pair of All-OAC standouts in 2-time All-OAC safety Ryan Dugan and senior cornerback Matt Bowen. The duo anchor a veteran secondary that includes Johnson, junior CB Brandon Russo, senior safety Corey Hildreth, senior "nickel" back Nick Scarcella and junior Tom Goebel.

The defense will be led by its outstanding secondary which is headed by a pair of All-OAC standouts in 2-time All-OAC safety Ryan Dugan and senior cornerback Matt Bowen. injury, had 39 stops, led the team with three interceptions and was second with 11 breakups. Russo rounded out the starters with 35 tackles and seven breakups.

"We have some solid veterans returning to the secondary," said Snell. "Obviously Ryan Dugan, Matt Bowen and Corey Hildreth are among the better one's in the OAC and they will be our leaders, "but we also have some other guys, like Brandon Russo, Kevin Johnson and more, who return who have seen action, are experienced and will be a big asset to our defense."

The line will be led by a pair of returning starters in Hazelwood at end and senior tackle Max Wagner at tackle. Also look for junior "rushing end" Derron Hamilton, senior tackle Lucas Ferron, senior end Matt Lewis and freshman tackle Addison Carbone to add strength, speed and depth up front.

Hazelwood had 27 tackles, six tackles for loss, including a sack, intercepted a pass and had a team-leading three forced fumbles. Wagner, who missed eight games due to an injury and began the season as a starter, had seven stops in 2010 after making 19 stops as a sophomore. Hamilton, who played mostly in passing situations, had 34 tackles, including 5.5 tackles for loss, 4.5 sacks and six forced QB hurries. Ferron, Lewis and Carbone all saw some playing time and contributed a combined 23 stops. All three should be more of a factor this season.

For decades, B-W has been known for its outstanding linebackers. It graduated one of its all-time best in Ryan Kish but returns at least two others in seniors Brett Thompson and J.J. Laseak. The duo return as starters and will joined as candidates for the open position by seniors Brian Ellis, Matt

Higgenbotham and John Haraysyn, junior Ben Penman and sophomore Isiah Kimmie as well as a few others.

A year ago, Laseak led the team in tackles with 81, was tied for third with 11.5 tackles for loss, had two sacks, forced one fumble and recovered another. Thompson was third with 60 stops, eight tackles for loss, three sacks, five pass breakups and six hurries.

"In J.J. and Brett, we return two very solid linebackers," said Snell. "Both are simply good players who have the talent and ability to be among the best in our conference. And, we return some other guys who are quite talented, and that should help us with depth and strength at that position."

Ellis is coming back after missing last season with an injury. He played in nine games in 2009 and had seven tackles. Higgenbotham saw action in 10 games last season and had 24 tackles. Haraysyn saw action in all 10 games, made 31 tackles, had a sack, an interception and two pass breakups. Both Penman and Kimmie saw the majority of playing time on special teams and displayed solid ability when on defense.

On special teams, Snell can rely on either Johnson or Holt to possess the talent and ability to scare his opponents on kickoffs. In addition, look for Gillissie, LaGuardia and Lohr to be among a hopst of talented speedsters to have a shot at returning opponent punts.

"Boy, they both can just flat out fly," said Snell with a really big smile on his face. "Each of them showed last season that they have the ability to score every time they touch the ball."

The final spot for the coaching staff to figure out is the kicking game. B-W graduated its kicker and punter and return kickoff specialist Dave Cantu.

"We enter camp in August with no one assured of a starting position," said Snell. "We have some talented upperclassmen who have shown that they have the talent and ability to get the first shot. We are bringing in another very talented recruiting class that will push each of our upperclassmen to perform to the best of their ability. It should be a lot of fun as we prepare for The College of Wooster on Thursday night, September 1."

## Yellow Jacket Football Notes

### **B-W Among the Nation's Winningest College Football Programs**

The Baldwin-Wallace College football program is one of the winningest programs in college football history. The Yellow Jackets have an all-time record of 546-319-30 in their 106-year history on the gridiron. Remarkably, B-W has had 42 winning seasons in the past 45 years, including a 38-year winning streak from 1967 through 2004.

### **OAC Titles and NCAA Playoff History**

The B-W football program has won 12 Ohio Athletic Conference titles (1935, 1937, 1968, 1977, 1978, 1980, 1982, 1983, 1984, 1988, 1991, 1994) and appeared in the NCAA Division III National Tournament six times (1978, 1979, 1980, 1982, 1991 and 2003). B-W earned its first national championship with a 24-10 victory over Wittenberg University in the 1978 Stagg Bowl.

### **John Snell 7-2 in Season Openers**

Yellow Jacket Head Coach John Snell enters the 2011 season against The College of Wooster with a 7-2 record in season-openers. Snell's Yellow Jackets defeated Allegheny (Pa.) College in the opener from 2002 through 2005, beat Augustana (Ill.) College in both 2006 and 2007 and Wooster a year ago.

### **Trio of Great Coaches Have Reached the Century Club at B-W**

Three former B-W legends, Ray E. Watts '23, Lee Tressel '48 and Bob Packard '65 are the only three football coaches in college football history who have won 100 or more games at the same school. Watts won 104 games, compiled a 104-58-14 with a .631 winning percentage and coached from 1928 through 1948. Tressel won 155 games in his College Football Hall of Fame career, compiled a 155-52-6 record and had a .742 winning percentage. Bob Packard won a school-record 156 games, compiled a 156-54-2 mark and had a .741 winning percentage. Comparably after eight seasons, John Snell '87 is 56-36 with a .608 winning percentage.

### **The George Finnie Stadium Success**

Since The George Finnie Stadium opened in 1971, the Yellow Jackets have compiled an impressive 147-31-2 home record with an .822 winning percentage.

### **Finnie Stadium Attendance Always Among National Leaders**

The faculty, administration, students, parents and friends of the B-W football have a long history of supporting the Yellow Jacket program. Every year since the NCAA has kept statistics on home game attendance, B-W has ranked in the Top-10 nationally in Division III. A year ago, B-W's six home games attracted 25,962 fans and ranked 11th in Division III attendance by averaging 4,327 fans per game.

### **B-W Leads Season Series Against Nine of its Ten Opponents**

Entering the season, B-W leads the all-time season series against nine of its 10 opponents. This season also marks the second meeting between B-W and The College of Wooster since 1983. The Yellow Jackets also have played Heidelberg University 64 times for the most of any opponent and lead that series, 45-19.

### **B-W and Rival JCU Tied in Both Series**

B-W and OAC cross-town rival John Carroll University have played in the "Battle for the Cuyahoga Gold Bowl Trophy" every year since 1989. The all-time series is tied at 11-11. The all-time series against the Blue Streaks which began in 1923 is tied at 23-23-4.

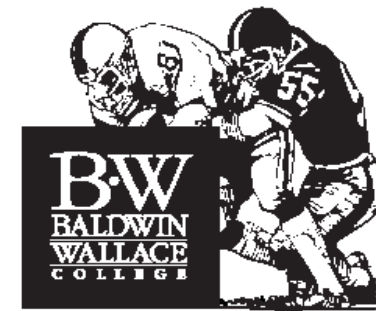

# Senior Safety Ryan Dugan Returns as One of the Best in Division III

**BEREA, OHIO** -- For the past three years, Baldwin-Wallace College senior safety Ryan Dugan (Mentor) has been regarded as one of the best pass coverage specialists in Division III. He enters his senior season within range of breaking the Yellow Jacket all-time record of 18 career pass interceptions by Dave Coad (1968-71). But Dugan could care less about records, his goals are much more team-oriented.

"Records are great," said Dugan, "but they are statistics that can be appreciated long after graduating. I want to win championships -- the OAC [Ohio Athletic Conference] and DIII [NCAA Division III] titles. The reason I came to B-W five years ago was its reputation and the opportunity to be a national champion."

This year, Dugan and his teammates have a great deal to be excited about. The football team is already ranked 13th nationally in two Division III preseason polls by a pair of national publications -- *The Sporting News* and *Lindy's Sports*.

The Yellow Jackets, 7-3 overall a year ago, returns 42 lettermen and 17 full-time starters, including 10 on offense and seven on defense, and two of the most electrifying return specialists in Division III in sophomore speedsters Kevin Johnson (Cleveland/ St. Ignatius) and Josiah Holt (Grafton/ Midview). The offense will be led by returning quarterback Ryan O'Rourke (Avon/ Senior), and the defense will be led by Dugan.

"We return a lot of key people, but we also lost some outstanding student-athletes and leaders," said Dugan, who maintains a fine 3.011 grade point average in the classroom and majoring in exercise science. "Many of us have been here and playing on the varsity the past three or four years. We feel that this is our time to make a statement."

"With that said, it is not as easy as it sounds when you play in the best Division III conference in the country -- the OAC," continued Dugan, who enters this season with 129 career tackles and 11 career interceptions, leaving him seven shy of Coad's mark of 18. "We know if we play well and we beat the right opponents that we'll get a shot in the playoffs. We know who we have to beat -- every team we play. We play 10 very strong opponents. We need to respect each one and play one game at a time."

Spoken like the true leader that Dugan is. His coaches speak volumes about the four-year varsity starter.

"Ryan Dugan is a tough-nosed, strong-willed leader of our Yellow Jacket football family," said 10th-year Head Coach John Snell, who enters the campaign with a 56-36 career mark and one NCAA Division III Playoff appearance (2003). "Ryan is a leader by the way he conducts himself in the classroom, as a leader in our program and on-campus and every day he comes to practice and continues to give 110 percent. We are extremely lucky to have Ryan and

a number of other outstanding senior leaders."

"Ryan leads by-example every day," said third-year Assistant and Defensive Backs Coach Tom Watts. "He understands the game by top-to-bottom. He knows what needs to be done, how to make the adjustments and how to be the leader of our secondary. Having Ryan Dugan at safety is like having another coach in our secondary."

After missing his initial freshman season in 2007 with an injury during the preseason, Dugan played in all 10 games at cornerback in 2008 and recorded 41 tackles, intercepted two passes and broke up four others and recovered a fumble.

As a sophomore in 2009, Dugan moved to safety and had the first of two straight All-OAC-caliber seasons. He had 49 tackles, led the OAC with six interceptions and 12 total pass breakups and was rewarded by being named second-team All-OAC to the second-team of the ohio-collegefootball.com honor squad.

Last season, Dugan began slowly as he missed one whole game and parts of two others due to a preseason injury but picked up the pace and had 39 tackles and a team-leading three interceptions and 14 total pass breakups.

"We all have been working hard in the offseason and summer," said Dugan. "We want this season to be a special one for all involved."

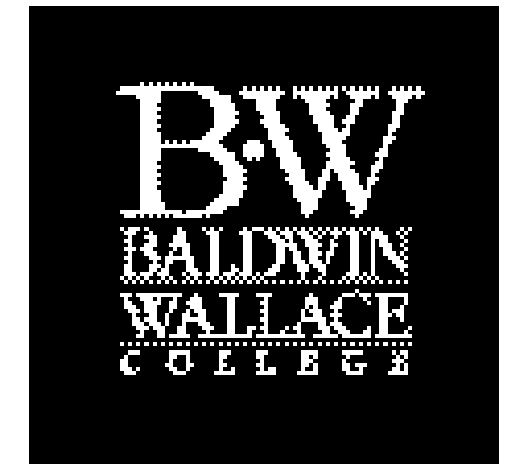

## The Yellow Jacket Athletic Facilities Are Among the Best in NCAA Division III Athletics

The Baldwin-Wallace College football student-athlete is afforded the opportunity to learn, exercise, practice and play in some of the finest facilities in small college athletics. In addition, each student has an opportunity to use a group of facilities that are unparalleled in Division III athletics.

### LOU HIGGINS CENTER

The Lou Higgins Center, dedicated on October 18, 1986, is a facility that benefits all B-W students, faculty, staff and alumni and is considered one of the top recreation facilities in the country.

The 170,000 square foot complex serves as home for the health and physical education departments, all winter intercollegiate and intramural sports, as well as playing host for a number of amateur sporting events.

The Higgins Center, which includes the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium, serves as the home of Yellow Jackets basketball, volleyball and wrestling. Ursprung Gymnasium, which has housed B-W basketball since 1949, received a complete renovation in 1986 and was renovated again in the summer of 2008. In addition to B-W playing in the Ursprung Gym, the Ohio High School Athletic Association has long used the B-W facility for its sectional and district tournaments for boy's basketball.

The Higgins Center fieldhouse houses the Harrison Dillard Track that is named for 1949 B-W graduate and four-time Olympic gold medalist Harrison Dillard. The 200-meter, six-lane track track, with its Mondo surface, is both fast and comfortable for the walker, jogger or serious runner. Pits for field events also are incorporated. The track surrounds three multi-purpose courts that can be used individually or in tandem for volleyball, basketball, tennis and other activities. On many occasions, the B-W basketball team has been playing a game while a wrestling match or an intramural basketball game was taking place in the Higgins Center fieldhouse.

The Harrison Dillard Track, along with the multi-purpose courts, have been home for the B-W indoor track teams, the John Summa Invitational Wrestling Tournament, the Ohio Sports Festival (basketball and wrestling venues) and many local high school track meets.

Also inside the Higgins Center is the B-W Natatorium, home to the Yellow Jacket swimming and diving teams. The facility includes a 25-yard, six-lane pool with a one-meter diving board. The movable pool bottom has adaptive physical therapy applications and can be used by the disabled.

As part of the renovation of Ursprung Gymnasium in 1986, chairback seating and a media center were constructed while training and physical therapy, laundry and eight locker rooms were added. Other features include a room for news media as well as exhibit and storage areas for the B-W Athletic Archives. The Archives give students, alumni, parents, friends and visitors to Baldwin-Wallace a glimpse of the rich tradition and heritage of Yellow Jacket teams and athletic greats.

### TRESSEL FIELD AT THE GEORGE FINNIE STADIUM

With a newly renovated playing surface thanks to the new FieldTurf on Tressel Field as well as a new track surface, The George Finnie Stadium is truly one of the nations best small college stadiums for football and track & field. The Yellow Jacket men's and women's soccer teams also play at Finnie and numerous Ohio High School

Athletic Association State Playoff games have been held at Finnie in addition to an Ohio State University Scarlet & White Spring Game and several Cleveland Browns and Pittsburgh Steelers Alumni contests.

In terms of track and field, B-W has already hosted six NCAA Division III national championship track meets, a Pan-American Games qualifying meet, a number of high school sectional and district track meets and is the home field to both Berea High School and Middleburg Heights Midpark High School. The Ohio Sports Festival/Ohio State Games also used Finnie as both a regional and state championship site.

### HERITAGE FIELD

Heritage Field, home to Yellow Jacket baseball, is located on campus within walking distance of the student dormitories. The facility has a manicured playing surface and seating for approximately 200 fans. Heritage also has been the host site for four OAC Baseball Tournaments.

### "POP" COLLINS TENNIS COMPLEX

The "Pop" Collins Tennis complex is named in honor of former B-W tennis coach and teacher Arthur Worth Collins, the father of nationally renowned sportswriter and television tennis analyst Arthur "Bud" Collins '51. The facility is on campus and includes six courts, which are lighted for night play.

### CUYAHOGA COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS FIELD

The Yellow Jacket softball team plays at the Cuyahoga County Fairgrounds Field. The facility includes a manicured playing surface, dugouts, a permanent fence and scoreboard and is one of the best softball facilities in the OAC.

### BENEFITS TO THE FOOTBALL STUDENT-ATHLETE

Does such a strong group of facilities benefit the Yellow Jacket football program? Definitely! Practice time is available in the Finnie Stadium the week of a game on turf, on the grass field adjacent to Finnie Stadium on the week of a game on grass and in the Lou Higgins Center during times of inclement weather.

In addition, B-W has always had a close working relationship with the National Football League's Cleveland Browns. At one time, the Browns had their main offices located on the B-W campus. That building is now known as Bagley Hall. The grass practice field behind Bagley Hall is the same one the Browns used for many years.

The Browns have since moved to their current location on Lou Groza Blvd. in Berea and are just two blocks from campus. At times of inclement weather, B-W has been able to use the Browns indoor practice facility.

"Finnie Stadium, the Lou Higgins Center and the possibility of using the Cleveland Browns practice facility are a plus to our program," says **Head Coach John Snell**. "The playing, practice and dress facilities that our football student-athletes are afforded are among the finest in all of college athletics and especially in Division III."

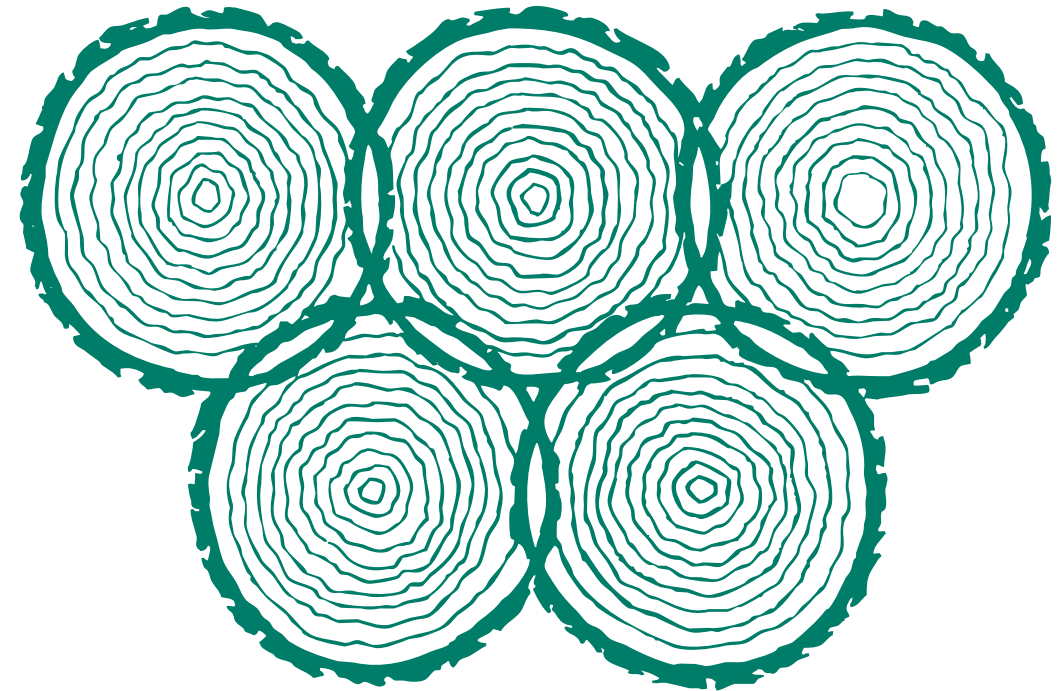
