

# Baldwin-Wallace Men's Basketball Camp

**Cost:** \$100, if sending two boys in same household the cost for the second boy is \$90

**Camp features:** Camp T-Shirt, Instruction by B-W Basketball Staff and Players, Teaching of Basketball Fundamentals, Team Competition, Foul Shooting Contest, Hot Shot Contest, 1 on 1 Contest, 3 on 3 Contest, and an awards ceremony at the conclusion of camp on Thursday. Camp starts at 9:00 am each morning and finishes at noon for boys entering grades 4–6 and starts at 1pm and finishes at 4 pm for boys entering grades 7–9.

## Camp Philosophy

Our main goal is to teach and develop the skills and concepts in the game of basketball. The camp will stress basketball fundamentals and is designed to give full attention to each camper, assuring that each camper receives the individual attention necessary to become a better player. The Baldwin-Wallace Men's Basketball Camp provides each camper with opportunities to grow as a player and to have fun with others who want to learn more about basketball. We will provide quality instruction and a positive fun-filled experience for all campers!

## Camp Staff

The camp staff will consist of the members of the Baldwin-Wallace Men's Basketball Coaching staff, current and former Baldwin-Wallace Men's Basketball Players, area high school coaches, and other college coaches. The camp staff will work hard to ensure that everyone attending camp gets quality instruction on the fundamentals of basketball along with a positive and fun experience.

## Concessions/Camp Bank

Campers will be able to deposit money into a camp bank account which can be used for concessions (water and Gatorade) during break times. All unused money will be refunded at the end of camp on Thursday.

An athletic trainer will be on staff. Participants will not be covered with medical or dental insurance during the camp. Space is limited and if room is available walk ups will be accepted on the first day of camp.

**From East via I-90:** I-90 west to I-271 south. Take exit 27 to 480 west to I-71 south. Exit I-71 south at Bagley Rd. Right onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

**From East (via I-80 or I-76):** I-80 or I-76 west to I-80 (Ohio Turnpike) west. Exit I-80 at I-71, US 42. Take I-71 north approximately 2 miles to the Bagley Rd. exit. Left onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

**From West (via I-80):** Take I-80 (Ohio Turnpike) to I-71 north at Strongsville. Take I-71 north approximately 2 miles to the Bagley Rd. exit. Left onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

**From South (via I-77, or I-71):** I-77 north to Rt. 18 Medina. Take Rt. 18 west to I-71 north. Exit I-71 north at Bagley Rd. Left onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

Head Coach Duane Sheldon completed his third season as the Head Men's Basketball Coach at Baldwin-Wallace College in 2010-11. Sheldon, a

former student-athlete, 1993 graduate and assistant under previous head coach Steve Bankson, returned to his alma mater after spending six years building Heidelberg College's program into an Ohio Athletic Conference champion. Sheldon is no stranger to Berea. He is a 1989 graduate of Strongsville High School and began his coaching career at local Middleburg Heights Midpark High School, then joined Bankson's staff at B-W before coaching at Heidelberg College. At Heidelberg from 2002-2008, Sheldon built the Student Prince basketball program into the 2007-2008 OAC Tournament champion. With its OAC tourney title, Heidelberg and Sheldon received the OAC's automatic berth in the 2008 NCAA Division III National Tournament. As a student-athlete at B-W, Sheldon was a three-time letter winner, a co-captain and a first-team Academic All-OAC pick. He also was tabbed as the Best Defensive Player. During his five seasons at Midpark, he was named the Associated Press Northeast Ohio Coach of the Year in 1997-1998 for leading his team to an 18-4 record and was the Pioneer Athletic Conference Coach of the Year. The following season, his team compiled a 21-2 campaign and a final ranking of eighth in the Ohio AP poll.
