The **BALDWIN-WALLACE COLLEGE YELLOW JACKET** men's basketball team travels to Wilmington, Ohio to play Ohio Athletic Conference rival Wilmington College on Saturday, December 10, 2011 in the Fred Raizk Arena at 3:00 p.m. This is the nightcap of a women's and men's doubleheader. This is the seventh regular season game for the Yellow Jacket men.

**Pre-game Setup --** The Yellow Jackets enter this game at 5-1 overall and 2-0 OAC record following their 90-69 victory at Heidelberg University on December 7 in Tiffin. B-W has won four straight games, including OAC wins against previously No.4-ranked Marietta College, 93-74, on Dec. 3 and Heidelberg. In its winning streak, B-W also beat Waynesburg (Pa.) University, 78-39, and Allegheny (Pa.) College, 79-61.

Wilmington enters this game with a 3-4 overall and 2-0 OAC record following its 63-57 victory at Capital University on Dec. 8 in Bexley. The Quakers have won two straight, including OAC victories over Heidelberg, 92-66, and Capital.

**The All-Time Series Between B-W and Wilmington --** This is the 30th all time meeting between B-W and Wilmington in men's basketball. The Yellow Jackets lead the all-time series, 16-13, however, Wilmington won the last matchup between these two teams, 75-68, on January 9, 2011 in Berea. B-W won the first meeting last season with a 92-82 triumph in Wilmington on December 11, 2010.

**In the Last Meeting Between B-W and Wilmington on January 29, 2011 in Berea, Ohio: Wilmington -- 75, Baldwin-Wallace -- 68 --** In the last meeting between B-W and Wilmington College, on January 29, 2011 in the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium in the Lou Higgins Center in Berea, the Quakers defeated the Yellow Jackets, 75-68. Despite its loss, B-W was led by current 6'5" sophomore guard **Kevin Krakowiak (Valley City/ Parma Heights Holy Name)** with 16 points, current 6'6" sophomore forward **Kyle Payne (Brunswick)** had 15 points, current 6'5" junior forward **Sean Rothermel (Delaware/ Hayes)** had a career-high 13 and current 5'10" senior All-OAC point guard **Promis Cabbil (Elyria/ Senior)** had 12. Wilmington was led by current 6'3" senior forward Tyler White with a game-high 24 points. **Rothermel** was named the *Al Sirat Grotto Player of the Game* for B-W while White took home the same award for Wilmington.

**The Baldwin-Wallace College Starters and Information --** B-W likes to run with the basketball and will play aggressive man-to-man defense. B-W scores 79.7 points-per-game and allows 62.5 ppg. for a plus 17.2 ppg. differential. The Yellow Jackets grab 39.8 rebounds-per-game and allow 35.5 rpg. for a plus 4.3 rpg. differential. B-W shoots 45.5 percent from the floor on 173-of-380 attempts, including 33.6 percent from three-point range on 47-of-140 attempts, and 66.4 percent from the foul line on 85-of-128 attempts.

Look for Head Coach Duane Sheldon to give 10-to-12 players court time. He will start **Kyle Payne**, 6'2" junior **Ben Umbel (Poland/ Seminary via Div. I Youngstown State University)** and 6'7" sophomore **Tyler Ferrell (Brunswick)** at the forward positions. In the backcourt, look for **Promis Cabbil** and **Kevin Krakowiak** to start. **Krakowiak** leads the team in scoring at 13.8 ppg., grabs 2.3 rpg. and is second with 13 three-pointers. **Payne** is second in scoring with 12.3 ppg. and leads the team in rebounding with 6.0 rpg. **Ferrell** scores 7.4 ppg. and grabs 5.0 rpg. **Cabbil** scores 4.2 ppg., grabs 1.8 rpg. and is tied for second with 17 assists. **Umbel** scores 6.7 ppg., grabs 5.0 rpg., also has 17 assists and tops the team with 21 steals.

Off the bench, Sheldon has played 6'0" red-shirt freshman guard **Jaron Crowe (Mentor)**, 6'6" junior forward **Chris Ameen (Broadview Heights/ Walsh Jesuit)**, 6'8" sophomore center **Aaron Selmek (Delaware/ Columbus St. Francis DeSales)**, 6'1" sophomore guard **Grant Fairhurst (Ashland)**, 6'3" junior guard **Brandon Schmidt (Wellington)**, 6'3" junior forward **Scott Branchick (Mentor)** and **Sean Rothermel**. **Crowe** scores 5.8 ppg., grabs 2.2 rpg. and has a team-leading 18 assists. **Ameen** scores 9.5 ppg., grabs 5.0 rpg. and has six treys. **Fairhurst** is third with 8.2 ppg. and has a team-leading 15 triples.

**In B-W's Last Game: Baldwin-Wallace -- 90, Heidelberg -- 69 in Tiffin on December 7 --** In B-W's last game, a 90-69 victory against Heidelberg University on December 7 in Tiffin, the Yellow Jackets were led by **Chris Ameen** with 17 points and six rebounds. **Kevin Krakowiak** had 14 points, **Tyler Ferrell** added a career-high 13 and **Ben Umbel** had a career-high 12 points and a team-high seven rebounds. The key to the win was a 42-18 run by the Yellow Jackets before the end of the first half that gave them a 51-24 advantage at the intermission.

**Scouting the Quakers of Wilmington College** -- Wilmington scores 69.4 ppg. and allows 72.3 ppg. for a minus 2.9 ppg. differential. The Quakers grab 31.1 rpg. and allow 31.6 rpg. for a minus 0.5 rpg. differential. Wilmington shoots 47.4 percent from the floor (170-of-359 attempts), including 38.4 percent from three-point range (38-of-99), and 65.9 percent from the foul line (108-of-164).

Look for Head Coach K.C. Hunt to start 6'5" sophomore Malcom Heard II, 6'7" freshman Ben Vonderhaar, and 6'3" senior Tyler White at the forward positions and 6'0" freshman Dwight Johnson and 6'1" sophomore Klarke Ransome in the backcourt. Heard leads the team in scoring with 17.4 ppg., tied for first with 5.4 rpg., shoots 69.7% on 46-of-66 attempts and leads the team with 14 blocked shots. White is second with 11.9 ppg., grabs 4.6 rpg. and is tied for first with six three-pointers. Ransome scores 5.0 ppg., grabs 1.0 rpg. and has 11 assists. Johnson scores 5.0 ppg., grabs 1.7 rpg. and leads the team with 18 assists. Vonderhaar scores 1.1 ppg. and grabs 1.7 rpg.

Off the bench, Hunt will play 6'1" senior guard Antonio Bowman, 6'3" junior guard Brandon Candella, 6'4" freshman guard R.J. Leppert, 6'5" junior forward Tim Pfeiffer, 6'3" junior center Miles Bankston, 6'7" junior center Ethan Fite and 6'5" senior forward Daniel Rogers. Bowman is third in scoring at 11.0 ppg., grabs 1.7 rpg. and has 17 assists and six treys. Leppert scores 8.1 ppg., grabs 3.0 rpg., six triples, and leads the team with 15 steals. Candella scores 6.9 ppg. and grabs 5.4 rpg. to tie for first.

**In Wilmington's Last Game: WILMINGTON -- 63, Capital -- 57 in Bexley on December 7** -- In Wilmington's last game, a 63-57 victory against Capital University in Bexley on Thursday night (Dec. 8), the Quakers were led by Malcom Heard II with 17 points and seven rebounds. In addition, Brandon Candella came off the bench to score 15 points and grab five rebounds and Tyler White had 13 points and was three-of-four from three-point range. The keys to the win included outshooting the Crusaders 47.7% on 21-of-44 attempts compared to 40.4% on 21-of-52 attempts, outscored Capital by seven points from the foul line and outrebounded Capital, 35-26.

## Yellow Jacket Chatter

**Yellow Jackets Heading to Kentucky During Winter Break** -- The Yellow Jackets travel to Lexington, Kentucky the week before Christmas to participate in the Transylvania (Ky.) University Don Lane Classic. B-W plays Wasbash (Ind.) College on Dec. 20 at 5:30 p.m. and then play either Transylvania (Ky.) or Hendrix (Tenn.) College on Dec. 21 at 5:00 or 7:00 p.m.

**B-W Picked to Finish Seventh in OAC** -- B-W is picked by the Ohio Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Coaches to finish seventh this season.

**Early Road Games** -- The Yellow Jackets play eight of their first ten games on the road. After a season opening win at the "friendly confines" of the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium in the Lou Higgins Center in Berea on Tuesday, November 15 versus Case Western Reserve University, the Yellow Jackets hit the road for three non-conference matchups. B-W opens OAC play at home on Saturday, December 3 versus Marietta at 3:00 p.m. After that game, the Yellow Jackets will be on the road for five games. B-W will not play at home until Friday, December 30 when they host non-conference opponent Alma (Mich.) College at 7:00 p.m.

**Two Doubleheaders to be Televised by SportsTime Ohio** -- Two B-W women's and men's basketball doubleheaders will be televised this winter on regional cable television giant SportsTime Ohio. The two DHs are the Saturday, January 28 doubleheader versus Wilmington College and the Saturday, February 18 Seniors' Day doubleheader versus Ohio Northern University.
