Ohio Northern Earns Top Seed in the 2005 Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament



TWINSBURG, OHIO -- Ohio Northern earned the top seed for the 14th time overall and will host Heidelberg, the eighth seed, on Tuesday night at the ONU Sports Center. ONU defeated Heidelberg, 3-1 (21-30, 30-19, 30-25, 30-28) during the regular season. Overall, ONU has appeared in every tournament since its inception in 1984 and is 41-7. ONU has won an OAC-record-14 tournament titles, four of the last five. The Polar Bears also have won 18 regular-season titles. On the year, ONU has been led by senior setter Erika Roof, juniors Karlee Kanuckel, the libero and OH Sara McGinnis and sophomore OH Laura Vuyk. Earlier this year, Roof set the OAC and ONU school record for career digs, while just two weeks ago, Kanuckel set the Conference and school records for career digs.

Baldwin-Wallace, the second seed, will face seventh-seed John Carroll on Tuesday at 7 p.m. in Berea. The Yellow Jackets are making their 18th overall trip to the tournament, where they are 19-16 overall. B-W is 1-0 against the Blue Streaks in the OAC Tournament, defeating JCU, 3-0, in the 2000 tournament. B-W has advanced to the OAC Championship match seven times, including back-to-back 3-1 losses to Ohio Northern. B-W defeated JCU 3-0 during the regular-season. B-W has been led all year by sophomore hitter Kelsey Hills, freshman Rachel Selgo and senior Emily Albanese, while junior setter Angie Camp has been dishing out the assists.

Otterbein, the third seed, will host sixth-seed Mount Union at the Rike Center on Tuesday at 7 p.m. in Westerville. Otterbein is making its sixth straight and 10th overall stop in the tournament. This is the highest a Cardinal team has been seeded since 1994 when they were fifth heading into the tournament. The Cards' best finish came in 1994 when they finished fourth. Otterbein won a school-record seven OAC matches on the year. Otterbein won its regular-season match against the Purple Raiders, 3-1. On the year, Otterbein has been led in hitting by junior OH Heather Meyer and sophomore MH Laura Waddl, while sophomore DS Allie Busser leads the team in digs and junior setter Jesse Maul leads the team in assists.

Capital earned the fourth seed and will host fifth-seed Muskingum at the Capital Center on Tuesday at 7 p.m. Capital is making its 11th straight appearance in the OAC Tournament and 15th overall. Capital reached the OAC Tournament championship game for the first time in school history in 2002. Earlier this year, Capital rattled off a school-record 20-match win streak. Capital defeated the Muskies 3-0 during the regular season. A year ago, in the OAC Tournament quarterfinals, Capital defeated Muskingum, 3-0. The Crusaders are led by a trio of hitters: junior Jordan Centers, sophomore Jessie Hampson and senior Ashley Gentry. Defensively, look for junior Marie Zumberger and sophomore Jackie Helm to pave the way.

Muskingum, the fifth seed, is making its 20th appearance in the OAC Tournament in 2005.

Muskingum has captured five OAC Tournament titles and five OAC regular-season championships. When facing Capital in the OAC Tournament, the Muskies own a 3-0 advantage. Offensively, the Muskies are led by junior MH Amanda Hawkins and senior OH Heidi Gasser, while junior Jessica Gromes dishes out the assists. Senior Hannah Babcock leads the team in blocks, while junior libero Elizabeth Guinsler tops the squad in digs.

Mount Union is the sixth seed and is making its 16th appearance in the OAC Tournament in 2005. The Purple and White had their best-ever finish in the OAC Tournament in 1999, placing second. Mount Union and Otterbein last met in the 1994 OAC Tournament with the Cardinals capturing a 3-2 win. Overall, the two teams are tied at 1-1 win each when facing off in tournament play. Look for the Raiders to be led by sophomore hitters Amanda Kohler and Jessica Ehmer, senior libero Kristen Sagula and freshman setter Kayli Tyson.

John Carroll is making its second straight OAC Tournament appearance and 11th overall where it has eight wins, including an OAC Tournament title in 1993. JCU will be looking for its first postseason win since the 2001 season. On the year, JCU has been led by junior Niki Csak, junior setter Michelle Branaghan and seniors Rita Huffman, and Brooke McCann.

Heidelberg is making its fourth straight OAC Tournament appearance and is seeded eighth. The Student Princes are making their 14th stop in the tournament and will be looking for their first-ever postseason win. On the year, Heidelberg has been led by senior outside hitters Tina Siegel and Sarah Hess, senior setter Tannah Haidet and juniors Megan Kempf and Breana McCool.

The Winner advances to OAC Final Four to face the Mount Union-Otterbein Victor

BEREA, OHIO -- Tonight, the number two-seed Baldwin-Wallace College Yellow Jackets will meet the seventh-seed and Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll in the quarterfinals of the 2005 Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament at the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium in Berea.

The winner of this quarter final match will advance to Friday's OAC Tournament semifinals at 5:00 p.m. to face the winner of the sixth-seed Mount Union versus third-seed Otterbein match that is also being played tonight at the Rike Center in Westerville. Ohio Northern University won the 2005 OAC regular season title finishing the regular season with an 8-1 conference record. B-W, Otterbein and Capital University all finished with 7-2 Conference records, but the Yellow Jackets received the second seed by virtue of the tie breaker.

The B-W women enter this match with a 20-11 overall mark. The Yellow Jackets are hoping for continued OAC tourney success this year. In 2000, B-W won its first ever OAC Tournament

title and advanced to the NCAA tourney. In 2003, B-W tied with Ohio Northern and Capital for the OAC regular season title and finished second in the tournament, losing to Ohio Northern in the championship game. The loss cost B-W yet another NCAA berth. Last season, B-W finished the regular season tied with Capital for second place. The Yellow Jackets advanced to the OAC Tournament game but were defeated by Ohio Northern.

B-W is led on the front line by senior All-OAC right-side player Emily Albanese who leads the team in service aces with 54. Freshman Rachel Selgo has a team-leading 371 kills and is second in defensive digs with 446. Sophomore Kelsey Hills leads the team in hitting percentage at .262. Junior Angie Camp has recorded a team-high 1,258 set assists and sophomore Meggie Marten leads the team in digs with 682.

Last week, the Yellow Jackets won three of five matches. B-W defeated Heidelberg, 3-2, on Tuesday, Oct. 25. At the Wittenberg University Fall Classic on Friday, B-W defeated Alma (Mich.) College, 3-0, and Carthage (Wisc.) College, 3-0. On Saturday, B-W lost a pair of games

to host school and No. 6 Wittenberg, 3-0, and Wooster, 3-2.

John Carroll enters this tournament with a 9-20 overall and a 3-6 OAC mark. B-W and the Blue Streaks met earlier this season with the Yellow Jackets winning, 3-0, in Berea.

The Blue Streaks are led by junior middle hitter/right-side player Niki Csak, junior setter Michelle Branaghan and seniors Rita Huffman and Brooke McCann.

Csak leads the team in kills with 393. Branaghan enters tonight's game with a team-high 1,123 set assists. Huffman has recorded a team-leading 487 digs and McCann rounds out the JCU team-leaders with 86 blocks (22 solo, 64 assists).

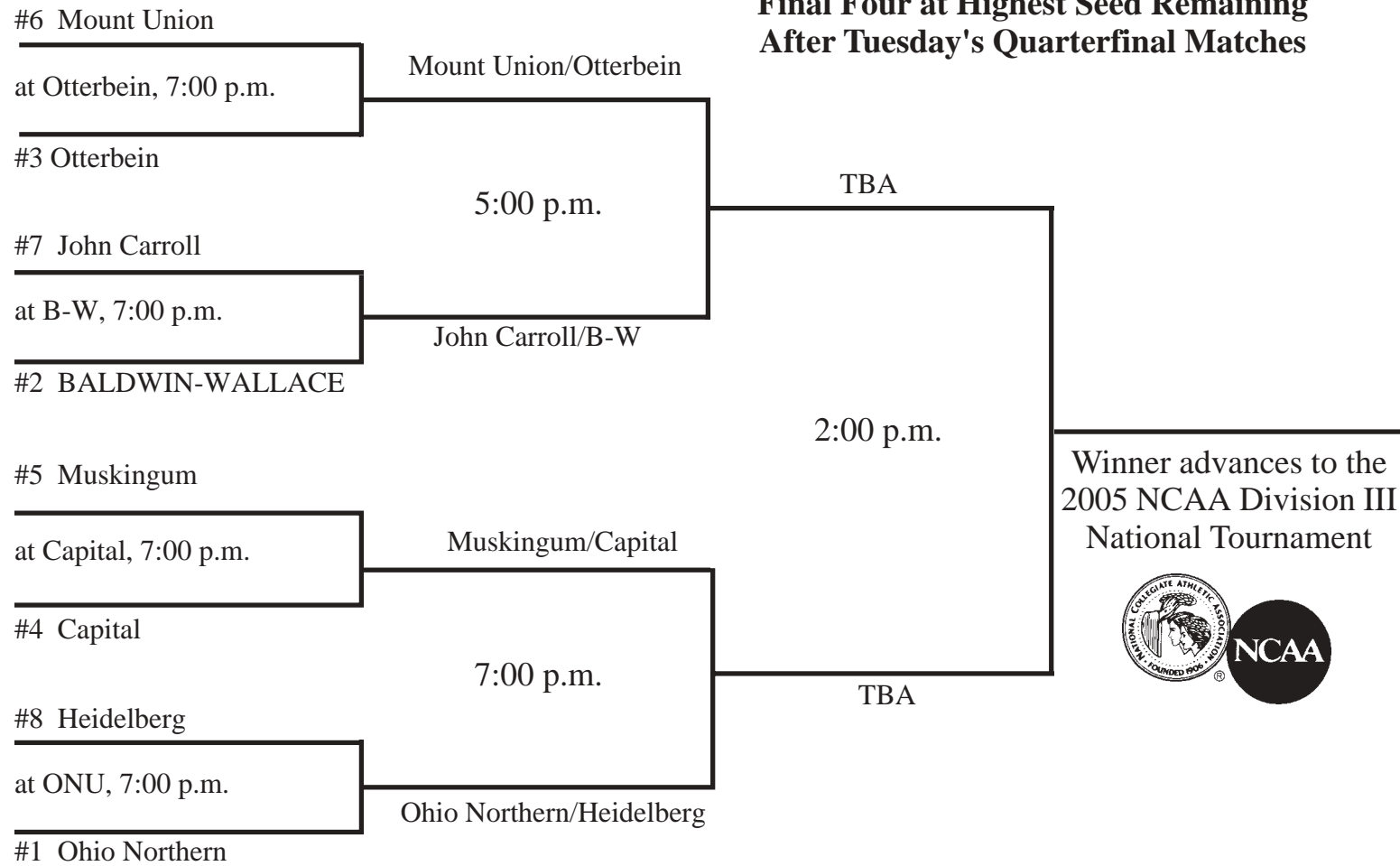
