B-W Travels to New Concord to Face Muskingum on Saturday

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College volleyball team hosts Ohio Athletic Conference rival and No. 23 nationally-ranked Capital University tonight in the Ursprung Gymnasium in Berea.

The Yellow Jackets enter tonight's match with a 16-8 overall record and 5-1 OAC record after a 3-2 loss to Ohio Northern on Tuesday. Capital has a 24-2 overall record and a perfect 6-0 conference record following a 3-0 victory against Wilmington Tuesday night.

After 24 matches, B-W's freshman outside hitter Rachel Selgo leads the team in kills with 294 (3.34 per game) and is second in defensive digs with 334. Sophomore All-OAC and outside hitter Kelsey Hills is second on the team in kills with 251 (2.85 per game). Senior All-OAC right-side player Emily Albanese is third in kills with 198 (2.25 per game) and leads the team in service aces with 44 and third in digs with 312. Junior setter Angie Camp has a team-high 976 set assists (11.09 per game) and is third in total blocks with 54 (14 solo and 40 assists). Freshman middle hitter Maria DePeters leads the team in total blocks with 99 (29 solo and 70 assists) and has the third highest number of service aces with 27. Freshman Brooke Hinkle has recorded the second highest number of total

Three Senior Yellow Jackets Taking Part in Final Regular-Season Home Volleyball Match Tonight Against Capital

BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College senior right-side player Emily Albanese will compete in her final home match of the 2005 regular season tonight. In addition, senior athletic-training student Jessica Bukowski and senior student-manager Amy Gladieux also will be recognized for their support of Yellow Jacket volleyball this season. Albanese is the lone senior player and has helped the Yellow Jacket volleyball program to become one of the best in the Ohio Athletic Conference and in the Great Lakes Region of Division III.

Emily Albanese; Right Side; 5'7"; Mentor

Emily Albanese is playing in her fourth season of volleyball in 2005. The business management major was the team "Rookie of the Year" as a freshman in 2002. Also that season, Emily earned her first varsity letter as an outside hitter with 60 kills, 205 digs and 30 blocks. As a sophomore in 2003, she earned her second varsity letter playing in 123 games and recording 177 kills. She also had 111 defensive digs and 45 total blocks (16 solo and 29 assists). As a junior in 2004, she played in all 122 games as a right-side hitter and led the team in service aces with 60 which ranks fifth all-time in school history in a single season. She also finished second in digs (618), third in kills (382) and third in blocks (51) including 41 solo blocks. Her 618 digs ranks fourth all-time in a single season. For her efforts, Emily was selected second-team All-OAC. As a senior, she serves as a team captain. At the Annual Marcia French Tournament, she helped to lead B-W to the team title and was tabbed to the all-tournament team. She currently leads the team in service aces (44), is third in kills (198), second in set assists (62), third in defensive digs (312) and fifth in total blocks (40). She has provided leadership throughout her four-year career both on and off the court and has been a valuable member of the B-W community.

Baldwin-Wallace College Senior Volleyball Standout Emily Albanese Has Always Been a Leader



BEREA, OHIO -- Most incoming freshmen look forward to their senior seasons when he or she will become the leaders of their team; the one that the newcomers look to as a role model.

For Baldwin-Wallace College senior volleyball player Emily Albanese (Mentor), there's a catch. She is the only senior on the Yellow Jacket squad this fall and faces the challenge of leading a very young team which consists of no returning junior lettermen, a junior transfer, six sophomores and eight talented first-year student-athletes.

Being the only senior does not bother Albanese. It only makes her want to be a better leader.

"I like being a team leader," said Albanese, "It is a challenge that I want, and I will meet this challenge head-on. We have a very talented group of young women on this team and I want to be a strong team leader."

Albanese, a 5'6", right-side player, has seen playing time at almost every position on the volleyball court throughout her three-year career.

She began as an outside hitter as a freshman and has become one the best right-side and all-around players in the Ohio Athletic Conference, Division III Great Lakes Region and all of Division III.

As a freshman in 2002, Albanese made a significant impact playing in 60 of 115 total games and put up productive numbers for a first-year player with 60 kills, 205 defensive digs, 30 blocks (including 14 solo blocks), 18 service aces and a .086 attacking percentage. At the end of her inaugural season, she was named the team "Rookie of the Year."

"Emily had a solid freshman season," said veteran Yellow Jacket Head Coach Vicki Brault, who owns a 275-178 career mark, including a 205-128 mark in 10 seasons. "You knew that she was talented and played with confidence by the end of the season. She displayed leadership characteristics even then."

Albanese continued to improve as a sophomore and finished fourth on the team in kills with 177. In addition, Albanese also had 111 digs, 45 blocks (16 solo, 29 assists) and a .126 attacking percentage.

"She gained more confidence as a sophomore and played in every match," said Brault. "Emily made the switch to being a right-side player and played it well."

Albanese then had a break-out season in 2004 as she played in 122 of 125 games and led the team in service aces with 60. She was also second in digs (618) and third in kills (382), attacking percentage (.267), set assists (66) and total blocks (51). For her efforts, Albanese earned second All-OAC honors. Her 60 service aces also rank fifth all-time in B-W history in a single-season. Albanese's 618 digs rank fourth all-time.

Now entering her senior and final season with the Brown & Gold, Albanese has set her sights on higher goals.

"I think the biggest goal that I have set for myself is to take this team to the NCAA Division III National Tournament," said Albanese, who carries a better than 3.5 grade point average in the classroom as a business administration and management major.

"I have yet to go to the national tournament, and what a better year to go than during my senior year."

Albanese also contributes her success to playing alongside AVCA (American Volleyball Coaches Association) All-Americans Cassie Palmer '04 and Laura Leach '05. She hopes to pass along what she learned from them to her teammates.

"Playing with the best players in Division III can only make you better," said Albanese. "They both were constantly helping me along with the other players. They taught me how to be a strong team leader. I hope that I, too, will be a player that the underclassman will feel made them better by being on the court with them."

In addition to playing with some very talented volleyball players over the course of her first three seasons, Albanese has seen improvements in her game from the instruction of Coach Brault.

"Coach Brault has changed me and helped me to improve in order to be successful at this level," said Albanese. "She is a very intense coach who won't take 'no' for an answer.

"She pushes her players to levels that they can achieve and won't give up until they are there," added Albanese. "I always knew that coach was pushing me because she thought that I could be so much better....and she was right."

Throughout her tenure as head coach, Brault has seen a number of her players make significant strides during the course of their careers, and she has seen those same changes in Albanese.

"We knew when Emily came to B-W she was a very talented student and volleyball player," said Brault. "Emily was both an All-Conference and All-District player in high school as well as the Mentor High School Female Athlete of the Year. She has taken her game to a higher level at B-W

"Emily plays with great intelligence," said Brault. "She has become a more consistent player in addition to sharpening her skills and adjusting to playing a new position."

In addition to having a number of individual goals for the season, Albanese is focused on helping the team meet seasonal goals of its own.

"One of the biggest goals we have for the upcoming season is team unity," said Albanese. "With only one returning senior and no returning juniors, we really have a young team."

"As long as we get better consistently, we are going to have an awesome season," added Albanese. "I am really looking forward to it (the challenge)."
