Women's Athletic Director Cheri Harrer:

The Builder of a Student-Athlete Dynasty at B-W

Cheri Harrer is in her 10th season as the Director of Women's Athletics at Baldwin-Wallace College.

In her 17 seasons at B-W as women's basketball coach, Cheri Harrer has helped her team set and reset the school record for victories.

Last year, Harrer and her Yellow Jackets had a 19-7 overall record, and two years ago her Yellow Jackets were the Ohio Athletic Conference regular-season champions and advanced to the "Elite Eight" of the NCAA Division III National Tournament.

Harrer is already the winningest women's basketball coach in Yellow Jacket history with a 347-126 mark. In addition to coaching at B-W, Harrer also teaches in the Division of Health and Physical Education. She is a firm believer that

the Division III basketball experience is a learning experience that can be both fun and extremely competitive.

"We stress learning. It takes place both in the classroom and on the basketball court. The players are learning the benefits of goal-setting, hard work, and discipline. We try to take a very positive approach to basketball, yet one that challenges every player to excel and to reach a higher level of play," Harrer explained.

Harrer's B-W teams annually play a very competitive schedule, including games against regionally and nationally-ranked opponents both in and out of the rugged OAC.

"Our program is competitive with any in the OAC and in Division III," said Harrer. "We are beginning to win games against these opponents on a more consistent ba-

sis, and hopefully, if we can continue that, we will qualify for the national tournament again. We are very optimistic and excited about the future of women's basketball at B-W. We have a great deal to offer a young woman who is looking for success both in the classroom and on the basketball court."

Harrer came to B-W with five years of intercollegiate coaching experience at Bowling Green State University, Bluffton College and the University of Findlay, her alma mater. While earning her degree in math education at Findlay, Harrer was a four-year starter and NAIA Academic All-American in basketball. As a point guard, she led Findlay to conference, district, and bi-district championships. In addition to basketball, Harrer also lettered two years in volleyball and three years in track.

The Baldwin-Wallace College Women's Program for Athletics captured an OAC-record eight straight OAC All-Sports trophies from 1998-99 through 2005-2006

Yellow Jacket Head Coach Vicki Brault

Vicki Brault is in her 13th season as the head coach at Baldwin-Wallace College and 17th overall at the NCAA Division III level. She is the second winningest volleyball coach in school history and simply one of the best coaches in all of Division III.

In 12 seasons in Berea, Coach Brault's teams have been outstanding, including compiling a 26-7 overall mark in 2006 and being the regular season co-champion of the Ohio Athletic Conference. Her team also has advanced to the OAC Tournament Championship game three of the last four years.

Coach Brault enters this weekend with a 257-148 overall record in volleyball at B-W and a 326-198 career record. She also serves as an assistant softball coach.

Coach Brault was a successful head

coach at the NCAA Division III level at Claremont (California) McKenna-Mudd-Scripps College prior to coming to B-W. As head coach for four years, Brault guided her team to a 70-50 overall mark, two Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference titles and two appearances in the NCAA Division III tourney.

Coach Brault graduated from Western Michigan University and received her master's degree from Azusa Pacific

University. In addition to coaching volleyball at Claremont McKenna Mudd-Scripps, she was a physical education instructor and the head softball coach.

Coach Brault is a member of the American Volleyball Coaches Association, United States Volleyball Association, the National Youth Volleyball Association, the National Fastpitch Coaches Association and the Women's Sports Foundation.

In Memory of Marcia French:

One of the Builders of the Women's Athletic Dynasty at Baldwin-Wallace

Marcia M. French, 56, one of the pioneers in intercollegiate athletics for women, died Sunday, May, 17, 1998 after an extended battle with ovarian cancer. In 33 years as a teacher, coach and administrator at Baldwin-Wallace College, she helped build a fledgling athletic program to a regional power with ten sports, capturing the Ohio Athletic Conference All-Sports trophy numerous times.

Born Marcia Belser and raised in Independence, Ohio, she came to Baldwin-Wallace as a student in 1959.

She graduated from B-W in 1963 and was a 1995 inductee into the Alumni Athletic Hall of Fame. "We had a very organized intramural program and we also had what we called 'play days' when we would travel to meet a number of schools and play a variety of sports at a central site."

"In the beginning one of the main purposes of competition between schools was the interaction among the players," she said. "I remember when we used to have a social after the competition."

After graduation from B-W in 1963, French taught and coached in the Parma schools for two years before returning to B-W to teach and start an intercollegiate volleyball program in 1965. She received her master's degree from Kent State University in 1968.

"We started by playing just a few teams, such as Miami of Ohio, Bowling Green, Dayton, and Mount St. Joseph," she recalled. "We played in the first state volleyball tournament. Then we began playing in associations that sponsored state and national tournaments with large and small schools together. From that, the AIAW (Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women) was formed. Then we moved on to NCAA sponsored affiliation and eventually the formation of women's athletics in the Ohio Athletic Conference."

In 27 seasons as volleyball coach, she compiled a record of 447-298, with two teams advancing to the NCAA Division III national playoff level. In 1992, after leading the Yellow Jackets to a 28-12 record and a berth in the NCAA nationals, she was named Mid-

west Region Coach of the Year by the American Volleyball Coaches Association.

French also introduced intercollegiate softball to B-W in 1970. In 22 years, she guided her teams to success at the slow-pitch and again as the sport made its transition to fast-pitch in 1986. In 1992, B-W compiled a school-record 28 wins and earned a spot in the NCAA Division III national tournament.

She was named B-W's second athletic director of women in 1981. With her leadership, the women's athletic programs continued to grow. Golf became the tenth varsity sport for women this season.

"Marcie was a tireless cheerleader for her players and for women's athletics," said B-W Chancellor Neal Malicky. "In nearly four decades since Marcie began classes at B-W, things have changed dramatically in women's athletics. People here agree that if those changes involved Marcie French, they were all for the better."

The 2007 Yellow Jacket Volleyball Team Opened its Season at the Prestigious Juniata (Pa.) College Tournament

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College volleyball team opened its 2007 season last weekend at the prestigious Juniata (Pa.) College Invitational Tournament. The Yellow Jackets got to play the defending NCAA Division III national champs and host school in its second match. It was the second straight season that B-W faced the defending national champ at its tourney on the first weekend of play.

At Juniata, the Yellow Jackets had a solid, 3-1 record and lost their only match to the host school. In its other three matches, B-W dominated Galludet (Washington D.C.) University, 3-0, on Friday and then shut out Dickinson (Pa.) College, 3-0, and Franklin & Marshall (Pa.) College, 3-0, on Saturday. Highlighting play for the Yellow Jackets was all-tournament team selection in junior middle hitter/ blocker Maria DePeters. In addition, a young Yellow Jacket team made great strides in just its first week of play.

En route to earning all-tourney team accolades, DePeters had a team-leading 52 kills and 12 blocks, had a .230 hitting percentage and contributed 11 digs, two service aces and a set assist.

In addition to DePeters, senior three-time All-Ohio Athletic Conference and 2006 Academic All-OAC outside hitter Kelsey Hills, senior Betsy Gilbert and freshman Rebecca Pittenger all contributed on the front row. Hills led the team in hitting at .256, was second with 28 kills, 27 digs and six blocks and added four aces and two set assists. Gilbert had 17 kills and four blocks and Pittenger had 16 kills and 24 digs.

Leading the offense was freshman Casey Passen with 116 set assists. She also was second with 28 digs and added three aces, three blocks and three kills.

In the back row, senior libero Meggie Marten was outstanding as usual and led the team with 43 digs. She also had a kill, three set assists and a team-high 11 aces. Also, freshman Melissa Grame had 18 digs, five aces and three set assists.

Following the Marcia French Tournament this weekend, the Yellow Jacket spikers will be back in action on Wednesday, September 12 when they travel to University Circle to play Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University in a dual match at 7:00 p.m.

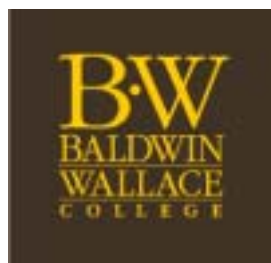
