Yellow Jackets Play at the Trinity (Texas) Tourney

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College women's volleyball team will next play on Friday and Saturday, September 27-28 when it travels to Austin, Texas to participate in the prestigious Trinity (Texas) University Invitational Tournament. At Trinity, the Yellow Jackets will compete at the Trinity (Texas) University Invitational. At Trinity, B-W will open play against the host school which is ranked seventh nationally and then play Dubuque (Iowa), Thomas More (Ky.) and finish against 20th-ranked Nazareth (N.Y.). The next home match is October 8 against Mount Union College at 7:00 p.m.



Yellow Jackets Begin OAC Play Against Otterbein;

B-W enters the match with a 10-match win streak and 11-2 mark

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College volleyball team begins 2002 Ohio Athletic Conference play today as it hosts OAC rival Otterbein College.

The Yellow Jackets enter today's match with a 10-match win streak and have an 11-2 overall record. B-W last played on Tuesday when it defeated Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University for the second time in four days. On Tuesday night in Berea, B-W prevailed, 30-20, 30-18 and 30-19 to improve its home mark to a perfect 5-0.

Otterbein enters today's match with a 10-4 overall record and last played on Wednesday when it defeated Kenyon College, 38-40, 30-27, 30-18 and 30-23 in Westerville.

In beating CWRU, senior outside hitter **Sarah Gordon** led all hitters with 16 kills and was followed by junior All-OAC middle hitter **Cassie Palmer** with 14 and junior rightside player **Emily Bowen** with 11. Junior back-up setter **Angie Elser** had 24 assists to set up the offense and junior All-OAC starting setter **Kerry Helm** had 23 assists in two games before giving way to **Elser**. Senior All-OAC libero **Kate Kost** led the defense with 15 defensive digs. In addition, sophomore middle hitter **Laura Leach** had the most blocks with four.

Next weekend, the Yellow Jackets are at the Trinity (Texas) Tournament (*see above for more information*). After its Texas trip, B-W will play away OAC matches at Muskingum College on October 2 and 16th-ranked Ohio Northern

13-MATCH STAT LEADERS -- After 13 matches, **Cassie Palmer** tops all hitters with 162 kills and is followed by **Sarah Gordon** with 154, **Emily Bowen** with 138 and **Laura Leach** with 95. **Palmer** also has the top hitting percentage at .297. **Kate Kost** has the most digs with 255, **Gordon** is second with 205, **Bowen** is third with 167 and **Helm** is fourth with 117. **Helm** is the top setter with 460 and 12.11 per game. **Leach** has the most blocks with 96 and is followed by **Palmer** with 80 and **Gordon** with 62.

KOST NEARS RECORD -- **Kate Kost's** 1,669 career defensive digs is 25 shy of the all-time career mark of 1,694 which was set by 2001 graduate and current John Carroll University assistant coach Regan Pore.

HELM NEARING 2,000 -- **Kerry Helm** has 1,935 career assists and is nearing the 2,000-mark for her career. She currently ranks fourth all-time behind **Amanda Gordon's** 4,273 from 1997-2000, **Beth Schmidt's** 3,878 from 1990-93 and **Lisa Horton's** 2,360 from 1996-97. Her 1,373 assists a year ago ranks second all-time for a single season.
