Our Elite Camp is designed to take the serious basketball player to the next level. It is a highly competitive camp that will assist players in reaching their full potential as a basketball player. Players will advance their skill level through individual and small group sessions, competitions, and regulation games. Commuters will arrive at camp for 8:45 a.m. roll call in Ursprung Gymnasium and depart after the evening game at 9 p.m.

Room and Board (Elite Camp Only)

All residents will stay in the residence halls on the Baldwin-Wallace campus. Halls are secured and will be watched 24 hours a day. University policy permits only two girls per residence hall room; however, arrangements can be made to house friends on the same floor. Meals are served in the campus cafeteria.

Day Camp June 28–July 1, 2010

Open to girls entering grades 4–8

Commuters only: \$100

Check-in: Monday, 8:30–9:00 am

Checkout: Thursday, 12:00 pm

Camp features: Camp T-Shirt and basketball, instruction by B-W Basketball staff and players, teaching of basketball fundamentals, team competition, foul shooting contest, Hot Shot Contest, Basketball Golf, 1-on-1 Contest, 2-on-2 Contest, 3-on-3 Contest, awards, and pizza during the last session! Camp starts at 9:00 each morning and finishes at 12 pm.

Application and Registration

Camp sessions start on the day of check-in. Complete and return the application form on this brochure to enroll in the Baldwin-Wallace Women's Basketball Camp. Enrollment is limited to ensure quality individual instruction, so early registration is encouraged. A nonrefundable deposit of \$50 (Made payable to: B-W Women's Basketball) for each camp session is required with the application. After receiving your application and deposit, a confirmation email will be sent to you with additional camp information. No refunds will be made after the start of camp. An athletic trainer will be on staff. Participants will not be covered with medical or dental insurance during the camp.

From East via I-90: I-90 west to I-271 south. Take exit 27 to 480 west to I-71 south. Exit I-71 south at Bagley Rd. Right onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

From East (via I-80 or I-76): I-80 or I-76 west to I-80 (Ohio Turnpike) west. Exit I-80 at I-71, US 42. Take I-71 north approximately 2 miles to the Bagley Rd. exit. Left onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

From West (via I-80): Take I-80 (Ohio Turnpike) to I-71 north at Strongsville. Take I-71 north approximately 2 miles to the Bagley Rd. exit. Left onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

From South (via I-77, or I-71): I-77 north to Rt. 18 Medina. Take Rt. 18 west to I-71 north. Exit I-71 north at Bagley Rd. Left onto E. Bagley Rd. Left onto Beech Street. Immediate left into the Lou Higgins Center parking lot

Head Coach Cheri Harrer has led the Baldwin-Wallace College women's basketball program to the elite ranks in NCAA Division III. Harrer completed her 20th season as head coach at B-W

in 2009–10. She is the winningest women's basketball coach in school history and has compiled a 415–145 career record and a .741 winning percentage. Harrer, a four-time OAC Coach of the Year, ranks 16th in terms of winning percentage and 26th in total wins amongst the top 50 active Division III coaches. Every year, Harrer's team is in the hunt for both an Ohio Athletic Conference regular season and OAC Tournament title as well as a berth in the NCAA Division III National Tournament.

Program Highlights

- 11 berths to the NCAA Division III National Tournament over the past 15 years
- Three "Elite Eight" finishes (1999–2000, 2000–2001 and 2005–2006)
- Seven OAC regular season titles
- Five OAC Tournament crowns
- 18 straight winning seasons with at least 15 victories
- 12 seasons with at least 20 wins over the past 14 years
- An .826 winning percentage over the past 14 seasons —the best of any Ohio Division III program
