Baldwin-Wallace's Ariel Brough Earns ESPN THE MAGAZINE Academic All-District Honors

BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College senior basketball student-athlete **Ariel Brough (Powell/Olentangy-Liberty)** has been named to the 2009-10 *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-District IV team. Brough is a first-team selection for the third straight year and moves on to the Academic All-America national ballot.

Student-athletes qualify for the team by being a starter or key reserve and maintaining a minimum 3.3 grade point average. Voting is conducted by Sports Information Directors in District IV which comprises the states of Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, Tennessee and Alabama.

Brough, a 6'2" center who maintains a strong 3.97 grade point average in political science and plans to attend graduate school next fall, is a three-time first-team *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* pick, a two-time Academic All-Ohio Athletic Conference choice (the 2009-10 team has not yet been selected) and earned All-OAC honors for her play a year ago. She is a Dean's List student and member of a number of academic honoraries on campus.

This season, Brough is having her best campaign as a collegian and is scoring a career-high 10.3 points-per-game, tops the team at 7.0 rebounds-per-game and is tied for the OAC lead with 50 blocked shots.

The Yellow Jackets Host Arch-Rival Mount Union Tonight in Key OAC Matchup

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College women's basketball team will look to get back on the winning track and sweep the season-series versus rival Mount Union College tonight at Ursprung Gymnasium.

The Yellow Jackets enter this game at 16-5 overall and 12-2 in the Ohio Athletic Conference following a 76-59 loss against Capital University on Saturday in Berea. B-W has won 11 of its last 12 games and is tied for first place in the OAC with Capital.

The Purple Raiders enter this game at 18-3 overall and 11-3 in the OAC following a 61-51 win against Ohio Northern on February 6 in Alliance. Mount Union has won two straight games and six of its last seven and is just one game back of B-W and Capital for first place.

This is the 71st meeting in women's basketball between B-W and Mount Union. B-W leads the all-time series, 38-33, including wins in the last five games. Earlier this season, B-W defeated the Purple Raiders, 65-53, on January 6 in Alliance. The last Mount Union win was a 65-61 triumph on February 20, 2007 in the quarterfinal round of the OAC Tournament in Berea. The first-ever meeting was during the 1982-83 season and Mount Union won, 103-50, in Columbus.

In this season's first B-W versus Mount Union game, the Yellow Jackets defeated the previously unbeaten Purple Raiders, 65-53, at the MacPherson Athletic and Academic Complex. B-W was led by Amanda Schroeder with a game-high 22 points and seven rebounds and Nancy Coulter with 15 points and six rebounds. Mount was led off the bench by Katie Crider with 12 points.

B-W is scoring 67.0 points-per-game and allowing 58.9 ppg. for a plus 8.1 ppg. differential. B-W grabs 40.4 rebounds-per-game and allows 33.8 for a plus 6.6 rpg. differential. The Yellow Jackets shoot 42.6 percent from the field, including 29.4% from three-point range, and 75.8% from the foul line.

Look for Head Coach **Cheri Harrer** to start All-OAC guard **Amanda Schroeder** and center **Ariel Brough** along with **Nancy Coulter** on the inside, and **Monica Gustin** and **Rachel Rossman** in the backcourt. In addition, look for **Harrer** to utilize **Ali Stack**, **Olivia French**, **JoBeth Roll**, **Katie Heinlen** and **Catherine Spisak**.

Schroeder has started all 21 games and tops the team in scoring at 13.7 ppg. and adds 5.0 rpg. She also has made a team-best 22 three-pointers and has 26 steals. **Brough** also has started all 21 contests and is second at 10.3 ppg., first at 7.0 rpg., and is tied for the league lead with 50 blocked shots. **French** comes off the bench and adds 6.6 ppg. with 39 assists, 19 steals and 10 treys. **Coulter** has started all 21 games and scores 7.1 ppg. and grabs 4.3 rpg. **Spisak** scores 6.5 ppg. and is second on the team at 6.8 rpg. **Rossman** has started all 21 games and scores 3.3 ppg., grabs 2.2 rpg. and leads the team with 54 assists. **Heinlen** scores 4.0 ppg., grabs 4.3 rpg. and has 25 steals. **Stack** has started three times and scores 3.8 ppg. **Gustin**, who has started 18 straight games, scores 1.8 ppg., grabs 1.4 rpg. and ranks second with 50 assists.

The Raiders score 70.6 ppg. and allow 60.6 ppg. for a plus 10.0 ppg. differential. Mount Union grabs 40.8 rpg. and allows its opponents to grab 37.1 rpg. for a plus 3.7 rpg. differential. Mount also shoots 39% from the field, including 35% from three-point range, and 66.3% from the foul line.

Look for Raider Head Coach Suzy Venet to start Rosa LaMattina, Tessa Pohovey and Kori Wiedt at the guard spots. In the frontcourt, Venet will start Amanda Rose at the forward spot and Lauren Foquer at center.

Pohovey leads the team in scoring at 11.3 ppg., grabs 4.7 rpg. and has 30 assists, 27 three-pointers and 24 steals. Wiedt is second in scoring at 10.1 ppg., grabs 3.6 rpg., tops the team with 35 treys and has 24 assists and 26 steals. LaMattina is third at 10.0 ppg., grabs 2.8 rpg., is second with 34 triples and tops the team with 57 assists and 46 steals. Rose scores 9.5 ppg., tops the team at 6.1 rpg. and has 30 assists and 30 steals. Foquer scores 7.7 ppg. and grabs 5.3 rpg.

Off the bench, look for Venet to utilize Nicole Plant, Kelly Evans, Taylor Hartung, Erin Schmidt, Katie Crider, Brittany Kilgore and Kelsey Wartluft. Crider tops the bench in scoring at 6.1 ppg. and is tied for third with 27 three-pointers.

Men's Basketball

The Yellow Jacket men's basketball team, 12-9 overall and 7-7 in the Ohio Athletic Conference, is playing tonight at Mount Union. Fans can listen to that game **LIVE** on campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, and via the web at www.bwbc.com.

The Jackets last played on Saturday and lost, 74-60, to Capital University in Columbus.

To date, sophomore point guard **Promis Cabbil (Elyria/Senior)** is tied for the team lead in scoring at 11.3 points-per-game and averages a team-high 4.6 assists with 28 steals. Junior guard **Zane Meeder (Erie, Pa./Fairview)** also averages 11.3 ppg. and senior forward **Kyle Brown (Strongsville)** checks in at 11.0 ppg.

The Yellow Jackets are back home this Saturday, February 13 to host Muskingum University at 3:00 p.m. The game is designated as Al Sirat Grotto day with partial gate proceeds going to benefit the Monarch's Scholarship Fund.

Swimming and Diving

The swimming and diving teams are idle until the OAC Championship Meet that will be held Thursday through Saturday, February 18-20, at the University of Akron's Ocasek Natatorium. Prelims begin each day at 11:00 a.m. and finals follow at 6:00 p.m. The Yellow Jackets are led by their divers, junior four-time All-American **Todd Richert (North Royalton)** for the men, and freshman reigning OAC Athlete of the Week **Julie Pinter (Broadview Heights/Brecksville Broadview Heights)**.

Wrestling

The wrestling team wrapped up the regular season last night in a dual match versus cross-town rival John Carroll University. B-W entered the match at 4-13 overall and was fresh off of a solid third-place finish at Saturday's 24th Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament in Berea. The Yellow Jackets were led by junior 174-pounder **Andrew Scavuzzo (Cuyahoga Falls/Woodridge)**, a 2009 OAC champion and NCAA Division III national qualifier, and junior 197-pounder **Tristan Stoll (Milan/Edison)**, who both won individual titles. For the season, **Stoll** tops the team with a 16-3 overall record and **Scavuzzo** is 14-4. B-W returns to action on Saturday, February 20 at the OAC Championship Meet hosted by Mount Union in Alliance. Action begins at 10:00 a.m.

Indoor Track

The indoor track and field teams host their third event of the season, the B-W Mid-February meet, this Friday at 5:00 p.m. on the Harrison Dillard Track inside the Higgins Center Fieldhouse. The women enter at 8-5 overall and the men are 5-6-1 overall following respective third and second-place finishes at last Saturday's Oberlin Invitational. The B-W men had three individual champions including senior **Steve Price (North Olmsted)** in the long jump. The women had four individual winners including senior **D'Arcy Hlavin (Berea)** in both the mile and 800-meter runs. The Yellow Jackets are right back in action on Saturday at the All-Ohio Meet at Otterbein College at 11:00 a.m. in Westerville. B-W also hosts its final event of the season, the Greater Cleveland College Championships, on Friday, February 19.
