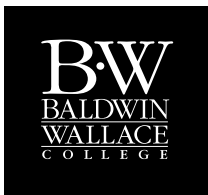

## Baldwin-Wallace, Capital and Wilmington Have Dominated the OAC Tournament for the Last 18 Years

**BEREA, OHIO** -- Three Ohio Athletic Conference schools -- Baldwin-Wallace College, Capital University and Wilmington College -- have dominated the OAC Women's Basketball Tournament for the past 18 years and have combined to win 17 OAC Tournament titles. Capital was the 2009 champion as it beat Baldwin-Wallace, 53-41, in last year's title game.

Capital has won eight OAC titles in the last 18 years, B-W has five and Wilmington four. The only breakthrough came in 1998 when Mount Union College won the title. Each of the three schools have won one OAC tourney title during the past four years. The winner of the 2010 OAC Tournament receives the OAC's automatic berth to the NCAA Division III National Tournament which begins next week.

## B-W Meets John Carroll Tonight in the Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament Quarterfinals

**BEREA, OHIO** -- The third-seeded Baldwin-Wallace College women's basketball team hosts Cleveland cross-town rival and sixth-seeded John Carroll University in the opening round of the 2010 Ohio Athletic Conference Tournament in Berea. The winner advances to the OAC Final Four on Friday and Saturday, February 26-27, at the site of the highest remaining seed.

The Yellow Jackets enter this game at 18-7 overall following a 74-70 loss in its regular season finale at Otterbein College on Saturday, February 20. B-W has won 13 of its last 16 contests, but has lost three of its past five games.

The Blue Streaks enter this game at 11-13 overall following a 73-68 loss at Ohio Northern University on February 20 in Ada. JCU has lost its last three games and six of its past eight.

B-W and JCU have met 58 times in women's basketball with the Yellow Jackets holding a 39-19 series advantage, including five consecutive wins spanning the past three seasons. Earlier this season, B-W defeated JCU, 75-61, on December 2, in University Heights, and the Yellow Jackets beat the Blue Streaks, 74-62, on January 27, in Berea. The last JCU win came on January 16, 2008 by an 80-73 score in Berea. The first meeting was in 1975-76 when JCU won, 57-56.

B-W is scoring 67.6 points-per-game and allows 60.2 ppg. for a plus 7.3 ppg. differential. B-W grabs 39.4 rebounds-per-game and allows 33.5 for a plus 5.8 rpg. differential. The Yellow Jackets shoot 43.1 percent from the field (596-of-1384 attempts), including 30.4% from three-point range (83-of-273), and 76.7% from the foul line (414-of-540).

Look for **Head Coach Cheri Harrer** to start junior **Amanda Schroeder**, senior **Ariel Brough** and sophomore **Nancy Coulter** on the inside with junior **Ali Stack** and freshman **Rachel Rossman** in the backcourt. In addition, look for **Harrer** to utilize freshman **Jess Carpenter**, sophomore **Monica Gustin**, freshmen **Olivia French** and **JoBeth Roll**, and sophomores **Katie Heinlen** and **Catherine Spisak**.

**Schroeder** has started all 25 games and tops the team in scoring at 14.4 ppg. She adds 5.2 rpg. and has made a team-best 27 three-pointers. **Brough** also has started all 25 contests and is second at 10.7 ppg. and first at 6.7 rpg. She also has blocked a team-leading 59 shots. **French** comes off the bench and adds 6.8 ppg. with 43 assists, 26 steals and 12 treys. **Coulter** has started all 25 games and scores 7.5 ppg. and grabs 4.3 rpg. **Spisak** scores 6.3 ppg. and is second on the team at 6.6 rpg. **Rossman** has started all 25 games and scores 3.3 ppg., grabs 2.3 rpg. and leads the team with 75 assists. **Heinlen** scores 3.8 ppg., grabs 4.1 rpg. and has 26 steals. **Stack** has started five times and scores 4.4 ppg. **Gustin**, who has started 19 games, scores 1.6 ppg. and ranks second with 52 assists.

The Blue Streaks score 70.6 ppg. and allow 70.1 ppg. for a plus 0.5 ppg. differential. JCU grabs 40.2 rpg. and allows its opponents to grab 45.3 rpg. for a minus 5.1 rpg. differential. JCU also shoots 41% from the field (656-of-1600 attempts), including 29.6% from three-point range (110-of-371), and 65% from the foul line (273-of-420).

Look for Head Coach Kristi Maravalli to start junior Lee Jennings and senior Whitney Hamilton in the backcourt with junior Sadie Zander and seniors Laura Gruber and Caitlin Sureck on the inside. In addition, expect junior Katie Knox and sophomore Kate Mahoney to see significant minutes off the bench. Also expected to see floor time are sophomores Katherine O'Brien, Taylor Christner and Emily Day.

Jennings leads JCU and the OAC in scoring at 22.2 ppg. She also grabs 7.3 rpg. with 134 assists, 46 steals and 20 blocked shots. Sureck scores 13.9 ppg., grabs a team-leading 8.2 rpg. and has 58 blocked shots. Hamilton rounds out the double-digit scorers at 10.3 ppg., grabs 3.8 rpg., tops JCU with 36 three-pointers and has passed for 29 assists. Zander, who missed three games earlier this season due to injury, scores 9.0 ppg., grabs 3.1 rpg. and is second with 30 treys, 56 assists and 26 steals. Gruber scores 5.4 ppg., grabs 4.2 rpg. and has 16 steals. Off the bench, Knox scores 4.1 ppg. and grabs 6.8 rpg. Mahoney scores 3.6 ppg. and is third with 17 triples.



## 2010 OAC Championships Began Last Weekend

### Men's Basketball

The 2010 Ohio Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Tournament begins tomorrow, Wednesday, February 24, with the Final Four this Friday and Saturday, February 26-27. John Carroll University is the defending champion and the top seed.

In the first round, #1-seed and OAC regular season champion JCU plays #8-seed Marietta College at 7:30 p.m. in University Heights; #2-seed Wilmington College hosts #7-seed Mount Union College at 7:30 p.m. in Wilmington; #3-seed Capital University hosts #6-seed Baldwin-Wallace College at 7:30 p.m. in Bexley; and #4-seed Ohio Northern University hosts #5-seed Heidelberg University at 7:30 p.m. in Ada.

The 2010 OAC Final Four will be played at the highest remaining seed following play on Wednesday night. The winner of the OAC Championship Game receives an automatic berth into next week's NCAA Division III National Tournament.

### Swimming and Diving

The Ohio Northern University men's and women's swimming and diving teams each won titles this past weekend at the 2010 OAC Championship Meet at the University of Akron.

The title for the Polar Bear men was their sixth straight and the title for the ONU women was its third in the past four years. The Mount Union Coaching Staff was recognized as the OAC Coaching Staff of the Year for women and the ONU and JCU staffs shared the men's honor. For the men, ONU's Michael Schultz was the Most Outstanding Swimmer and Todd Richert of B-W was the Most Outstanding Diver for the second time in his career. For the women, Rachel Mizner of JCU was the Most Outstanding Swimmer and B-W freshman Julie Pinter was the Most Outstanding Diver.

### Wrestling

Heidelberg won the 2010 OAC wrestling title last weekend at Mount Union College in Alliance. It was the fifth straight title for the Student Princes. ONU's 157-pounder Luke Miller was named as the John Summa Most Valuable Wrestler for the second straight time and Heidelberg Head Coach Jason Miller was tabbed as the OAC Coach of the Year for the fifth straight season.

### Indoor Track

The 2010 OAC Indoor Track and Field Championship Meet will take place this Friday and Saturday, February 26-27 at Marietta College in the Dyson Baudo Recreation Center Track in Marietta. Action begins on Friday at 2:00 p.m. and resumes again on Saturday at 10:00 a.m.

Ohio Northern University is the defending women's champion. Last year's title was a first for the Polar Bears. The B-W women have won 18 of the past 22 titles, including an OAC-record 15 straight crowns from 1988 through 2002. Otterbein College has won three titles. ONU is the defending men's champion. Either ONU (two straight), Mount Union (four) and Otterbein (three) have won the past nine OAC Indoor Championship Meet titles.

The 2010 NCAA Division III National Championship Meet is on Friday and Saturday, March 12-13 at DePauw University in Greencastle, Indiana.

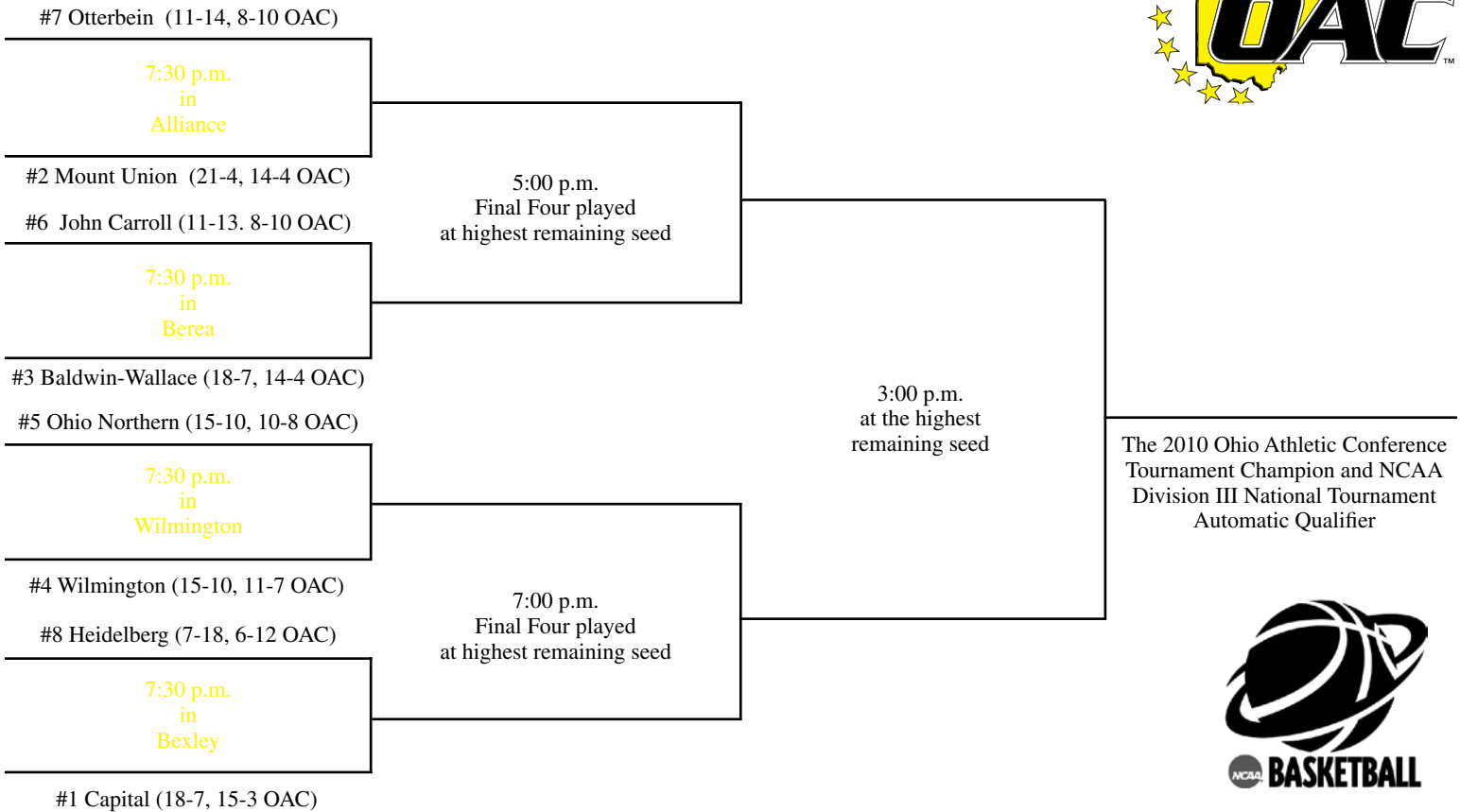
