Carmen an All- American and Heiland Competed at the NCAA National Tourney

BEREA, OHIO -- Junior 197-pounder Devin Carman
earned NCAA Division III All-American honors by placing
eighth at the 2005 NCAA Division III National Tournament.
Senior 165-pounder Joe Heiland also competed at the na-
tionals for the second time in his career. The national tourney
was held at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota.
Carman lost his first match to the top seed and eventual
defending national champion, and then won his next two
matches to earn All-American honors.

Heiland ended his collegiate career at the national tour-
ney. He lost his first match to the No.2-seed and then won.
His 3-2 loss in the next round left Heiland a win shy of All-
American honors but did not diminish an outstanding career.

Yellow Jackets Fourth at OAC Tourney; Carman and Heiland Go to NCAA Division III National Tournament

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team finished the 2004-2005 season with a 8-16 overall and 3-3 Ohio Athletic Conference dual match record. The team finished fourth of seven teams at the OAC Championships in Wilmington. The Yellow Jackets also finished tied for 34th at the NCAA Division III National Championships at St. Olaf College in Minnesota.

Individually, the Yellow Jackets were led by All-American junior **Devin Carman** who compiled an overall 28-5 record and an unblemished 5-0 OAC dual meet record. **Carman** was ranked the majority of the year by the Adidas Brute National Poll, as high as seventh. **Carman** went on to claim the 197-pound OAC title, advance to the NCAA Division III National Tournament in Minnesota and earn Division III All-American honors with an eighth place finish. **Carman** led the team in takedowns with 72.

Senior **Joe Heiland** also advanced to the NCAA Division III Championships following his second OAC crown at 165 pounds. He missed the first part of the season rebounding from surgery to compete in his senior season. **Heiland** compiled a 14-7 overall record and a flawless 5-0 OAC dual match record. In his limited action, he finished second on the team with 47 takedowns. **Heiland** advanced to the national tourney and ended his season one win shy of achieving All-American status.

Sophomore **Bryan Kmetz** had another strong year with a 21-6 record and his second straight All-OAC honor and second straight second place finish at the OAC tourney. **Kmetz**, who had 39 takedowns this season, is 49-11 in two seasons in the Brown & Gold.

Junior **T. Terry** started at 174 pounds was third in wins with 16 and had a 16-21 overall record with 39 takedowns. Freshman **Gino Russo** had a strong first season at 157 pounds with a 13-13 record and 41 takedowns.

Senior 149-pounder **Scott Conrath** and junior 184-pounder **Sterling Sebek** provided the veteran leadership throughout the sea-

son. **Conrath** compiled a 10-17 overall record and had 33 takedowns. **Sebek**, after returning from an early season injury, compiled a 12-9 record. In addition, junior 125-pounder **Mike Ham**, junior 133-pounder **Chris Harrold** and junior 157-pounder **Steve Vaughn** each continued their improvement from a year ago. This solid corps of starters and upperclass leaders will help to make B-W even stronger next year.

In addition to **Gino Russo**, freshmen **John Weston** and **Brett Thomas** (125 pounds), **Scott Haber** (141), **Brian Haines** (157/165),

At the OAC Championship Tournament

BEREA, OHIO -- At the 2005 Ohio Athletic Conference wrestling championships at the Fred Raizk Arena on the campus of Wilmington College, the Baldwin-Wallace College Yellow Jackets finished fourth of seven teams with 43.5 points.

B-W had two individual weight class champions in junior 197-pounder **Devin Carman** and senior 165-pounder **Joe Heiland**. With their wins, both grapplers earned automatic bids to the 2005 NCAA Division III National Championship Tournament. **Heiland's** title is the second of his career. His All-OAC honor is his third overall. In addition, junior



285-pounder **Bryan Kmetz** placed second for the second straight year. He and **Carman** are two-time All-OAC wrestlers.



Joe Heiland and Scott Conrath Each End an Outstanding Wrestling Careers at B-W



The Yellow Jacket wrestling program graduates two outstanding senior student-athletes in **Scott Conrath** and **Joe Heiland**.

Joe Heiland competed in his fourth season of wrestling and earned his fourth varsity letter. He ends his career with a 76-25 record, two Ohio Athletic Conference titles at 165 pounds, four OAC *Wrestler of the Week* awards (one each year), two appearances at the NCAA Division III National Tournament and a win at the national tourney. Joe ends his career as one of the best to ever wear the Brown & Gold.

After an injury sidelined **Heiland** in 2000-01, he had an 11-4 mark in 2001-02. As a junior in 2002-03, Joe had his best season with a 32-7 record, an OAC title and his first NCAA tourney appearance. As a junior and despite wrestling with injuries late in the season, Joe compiled an impressive 18-6 record and advanced to the 165-pound championship match at the OAC Tournament and earned All-OAC accolades. This season, Joe missed the first two months of the season due to surgery to correct the problem from a year ago. He came back strong to compile a solid 14-7 record, including a 5-0 slate against OAC opponents. Joe then went on to win his second OAC title and NCAA berth. Joe is completing

work on his degree in health and physical education and hopes to one day teach and coach.

Scott Conrath has competed for four years and earned four varsity letters. He ends his career with a 29-49 record. Scott had a career in which he showed consistent improvement every year, including a senior year with a career-high-tying 10 victories. As a freshman in 2001-02, Scott competed in his first season of wrestling and was the backup at 133 pounds. He compiled a 5-5 record with 15 takedowns and one pin. In 2002-03, Scott alternated between the 149 and 157 weight classes. He compiled a record of 10-14 with one pin. As a junior in 2003-04, despite battling injuries, Scott compiled a record of 4-13 with 18 takedowns. This season, Scott was the starter at 149 pounds and compiled a 10-17 record with a career-high 33 takedowns. Scott is a pre-physical therapy major and hopes to one day have his own practice.
