## Yellow Jackets Second at OAC Tourney; Carman and Kmetz Go to NCAA Division III National Tournament

**BEREA, OHIO --** The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team finished the 2005-2006 season with an 8-4 overall and 2-4 Ohio Athletic Conference dual match record. The team finished second of seven teams at the OAC Championships in Berea. The Yellow Jackets tied for 46th at the NCAA Division III National Championships at The College of New Jersey.

Individually at the OAC Championships, the Yellow Jackets were led by senior Division III All-American Devin Carman who won his second straight OAC title and wrestled in his third straight OAC title match, and senior 285-pounder Bryan Kmetz who won his first OAC title after being the OAC runner-up the past two years. By virtue of their OAC titles, Carman and Kmetz earned automatic berths to the 2006 NCAA Division III National Tournament.

Carman won his title with a perfect 3-0 record as he defeated Adam Lange of Mt. Union in his first match, 8-2; beat Chris Bailey of ONU in the semifinals, 7-2; and dominated Heidelberg's Ryan Fogliano, 9-3, in the title match. A year ago, Carman finished eighth at the NCAA Division III National Tournament to earn Division III All-America acclaim.

Kmetz won his title with a perfect 2-0 mark. He received a first round bye as the top seed and then beat Heidelberg's Rob Brubeck, 13-5, in the semifinals. He defeated OAC arch-nemesis Derek Ankney of OAC and Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll University, 4-2, in the championship match. Ankney and Kmetz met for the third straight time in the OAC title match. Ankney won the title in 2004 and 2005 but Kmetz won this year and also pinned Ankney in December at the Rochester Institute of Technology Tournament en route to winning RIT Most Valuable Wrestler honors.

In addition to Carman and Kmetz, senior 174-pounder Ster-

ling Sebek placed third and freshman 133-pounder Chris Hamed, junior 141-pounder Jared Selover and sophomore 184-pounder Jeremy Feador each placed fourth.

At the 2006 NCAA National Tournament, Carman was seeded seventh in the 197-pound weight class and lost his first match to fifth-seeded Jay Figgins of Loras (Iowa) College, 6-4. Following his match against Figgins, he defeated Nicholas Calandrino of Ithaca (N.Y.) College, 10-6, before being eliminated from the tournament with a 16-11 loss to Matthew Chrzanarski of York (Pa.) College.

Kmetz made his first appearance in the national tournament and was defeated in his first match 2-1 in double overtime by fifth-seeded Tom Snyder of Lycoming (Pa.) College. He was later eliminated when he was pinned by fourth-seeded Michael Hayes of Wisconsin Steven's Point in 5:22.



### At the OAC Championship Tournament

**BEREA, OHIO --** At the 2006 Ohio Athletic Conference wrestling championships, Heidelberg College won its first OAC team title with 99 points and the Yellow Jackets finished second with 62.5 points. Ohio Northern University was third with 52.5 points and was followed by Wilmington College in fourth with 44 points. Muskingum College finished fifth with 34 points and defending champion John Carroll University and Mount Union College tied for sixth place with 33 points each.

Heidelberg, led by 2006 OAC *Coach of the Year* Jason Miller, also won its first OAC regular season title with a perfect 6-0 dual match record. Individually, Mount Union senior 149-pounder Sean Connelly was tabbed as the John Summa Most Valuable Wrestler.



## Seven Yellow Jackets End Outstanding Wrestling Careers at B-W



The Yellow Jacket wrestling program graduates seven outstanding senior student-athletes in Devin Carman, Mike Ham, Chris Harrold, Seth Pirc, Sterling Sebek, T. Terry and Steve Vaughn.

Carman ends his career as a two-time OAC 197-pound champion, two-time NCAA National Tournament qualifier and All-American. He finished his senior season with a perfect 9-0 record after returning from an injury in January that sidelined him for over half the season. Carman ends his Yellow Jacket career with a 71-15 record.

Ham was a four-year starter at 125-pounds and ended the 2005-06 season with a 7-20 overall record. His seven wins were a career-high. At this year's OAC Tournament, Ham advanced to the semifinals before being defeated by the eventual NCAA 125-pound National Runner-Up Ty Kloffta from Ohio Northern. The four-year letterwinner ends his career with a 20-63 record including two pins.

Harrold completed his fourth season of wrestling this winter and earned his third varsity letter. For the second consecutive season, he alternated between the 133 and 141-pound weight classes. This season, Harrold finished a combined 6-9 overall and was 17-43 for his career. In addition to wrestling, Harrold was also a key member of the B-W men's soccer team.

Pirc returned to the mat for his senior season after a two-year absence from the sport. Despite having not wrestled com-

petitively for two seasons, Pirc finished the 2005-06 season with an impressive 7-2 record at 157-pounds. For his career, Pirc was 15-23 overall with two pins.

Sebek completed his fifth season of wrestling this year. He received a medical red-shirt as a sophomore due to an injury. Sebek returned to the mat the following year. This season, he had his best year as a Yellow Jacket finishing 26-7 at 174-pounds. For his career, Sebek compiled a 64-45 record.

Terry has been a mainstay and key starter for B-W throughout his career. He alternated between the 165, 174 and 184-pound weight classes during his four years as a Yellow Jacket. This season, Terry compiled a 12-14 record at 165 pounds. For his career, Terry was 49-70 with three pins.

Vaughn wrestled at both the 149 and 157-pound weight classes this season and finished with a 5-6 combined record. Vaughn transferred from the University of Rochester (N.Y.) to Cuyahoga Community College before coming to B-W in 2002-03. For his career, he was 20-24 overall with four pins.
