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Chanel Graduate T. Terry is Looking to be an Explosive Force on the Wrestling Mats at Baldwin-Wallace College This Winter

BEREA, Ohio—Many people get their names from other family members or friends. However, the father of Bedford resident and Chanel High School graduate and current Baldwin-Wallace College senior, T. Terry, wanted a name with a bit more “pop” to it.

T. Nathan Terry, whose initials are T.N.T., exploded onto the scene four years ago as a football player who wanted to stay active on the Yellow Jacket wrestling mats. However, because of an open spot on the wrestling team, Terry took to the mat permanently. The 165-pounder wrestled at the 174-pounds and in the 184-pound weight classes during his first three years in the Brown and Gold.

This year, the 22-year-old is switching to the lower weight class and hopes to make an impact in the Ohio Athletic Conference.

“I want to win the OAC at 165 pounds and go to the [NCAA Division III] National Tournament,” said Terry, who is 1-0 this season. “For the team, I would like to go undefeated in OAC dual meets and beat John Carroll.”

The Yellow Jackets match up against the Blue Streaks when they come to Berea on Jan. 10 for their regularly scheduled OAC dual match

“We love wrestling against John Carroll,” said Terry. “They have been the best in the OAC for many years. We respect their program and their wrestlers. They give us great competition. We look forward to the challenge on January 10.”

So far this season the B-W grapplers are 2-1 after hosting the annual B-W Quad Meet last Saturday in the Lou Higgins Center. The Yellow Jackets defeated Waynesburg (Pa.) College, 37-3, and Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University, 23-18, but lost a close 21-20 decision to the College of Mt. St. Joseph of Cincinnati.

“I thought we had a pretty good start,” said Terry. “We lost a tough one to Mt. St. Joe’s. For an opening weekend where we were missing Devin Carman, our returning All-American 197-pounder, I thought we wrestled well. We also got some freshmen some experience, and some of them looked pretty tough.”

“Our coaches are doing a great job preparing us,” continued Terry. “I think we will have a better second half of the year. It is good to get the cobwebs out at the beginning.”

Terry, who was a combined 17-24 last season at the 174-pound and 184-pound weight classes enjoys competing on the mat.

“It is you against your opponent,” said Terry. “There are not many sports like it. If you lose, it is all on you. There is no one else to blame but yourself.”

“There is nothing like the moment your hand gets raised as the winner,” he added. “It is what motivates you to wrestle.”

B-W veteran 18-year Head Coach Rich Fleming feels his team will be strong with Terry in the lineup.

“T. has a devastating counter for a headlock,” said Fleming, who also was the head wrestling coach at Parma Senior High School before coming to B-W. “If anybody tries to put him in a headlock, he has good leverage and knows what to do to counter their move.”

“T. is mentally and physically tough,” added Fleming. “He has become a lot stronger over the last four years through a great work ethic and dedication to the sport and his team. He also has improved his overall technique which has

made him a more technically sound wrestler each year. We feel that this year is T.’s year and we are looking forward to watching him continue to be successful.”

A season ago, Terry placed fourth at the OAC Championships in the 174-pound weight class. He is happy to have done so well in the conference.

“My favorite memory is when I placed at OAC last year,” said Terry, who has a career record of 37-56. “I beat a kid who beat me earlier in the year, so I got a little revenge on him.”

Despite all of the work involved during wrestling season, Terry does not take time off.

“When I am not in season, I like to work out or do anything athletic,” Terry said. “I usually lift and do cardio four to five times a week.”

Last fall, B-W began renovations on its recreation center. Now it is known as the Lou Higgins Center and features numerous exercise bikes, treadmills, free weights and new athletic training facilities.

“Now that we have this new weight room in the Lou Higgins Center, it is hard to stay out of it,” added Terry. “It has state-of-the-art equipment and is top-of-the-line. All of our students are just flocking to work out, stay in shape and become better in all ways. It is a great recruiting tool for the school.”

Before a match, Terry tries to find a rhythm by listening to music.

“I like hip-hop [music],” said Terry. “I like the beats. It is usually what I warm up to.”

Terry, who has participated in sports since the age of five, believes his family has been a big part of his success on and off the fields of play.

“My father always wanted me to do well,” said Terry said. “He always made sure I put forth my best effort and gave me support in all ways. That support has made me a better wrestler and a better teammate.”

At St. Peter Chanel High School in Bedford, Terry played on the 2001 Ohio High School Athletic Association (OHSAA) Division V State Football Championship squad. He also placed at the OHSAA State Wrestling Championships as a sophomore. He came to B-W as a linebacker but made the permanent switch to the mat because he could not resist the competition.

“That was a big decision,” said Terry, an outside linebacker who played on the junior varsity team and dressed for some varsity games. “In football there are 150 guys at preseason camp competing for 22 spots, including 11 on defense.”

“I was not getting a lot of playing time in football and I knew I had a spot on the wrestling team,” Terry continued. “I could not give up wrestling. I had the passion for it. And I knew that if I put all of my efforts into it that I could both be good individually and better help my team and teammates. It has been a good decision for me.”

Terry also has a passion for business. He is currently majoring in business administration and would like to start his own company some day. However, before he can do that, he has some “business” to take care of on the mat.

“My goal is to go to the National Tournament and hopefully become an All-American,” Terry said.

Regardless of the obstacles he may face on or off the mat, T.N.T. will burst through those barriers and achieve his goals.

Yellow Jackets Open the 2005-2006 OAC Schedule Tonight Against Rival Mount Union College

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team, 4-3 overall, opens Ohio Athletic

Conference action tonight when it hosts rival Mount Union College in the Ursprung Gymnasium of the Lou Higgins Center. To date, B-W has been challenged at two separate events and has received some solid results. Look for the Yellow Jackets to be challenged again tonight by the Purple Raiders.

The Yellow Jackets opened the season on Nov. 12 at the B-W Quad Meet in Berea when it had a 2-1 record. B-W beat both Cleveland cross-town rival Case and Waynesburg (Pa.) College but lost to the College of Mt. St. Joseph in a one-point decision. The Yellow Jackets then had a 2-2 mark last weekend at the Olivet (Mich.) College Comet Duals. B-W beat both Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology (Ind.) and Tri-State (Ind.) University and lost to the University of Wisconsin at Steven's Point and to host Olivet.

Mount Union comes into tonight's match with a 3-1 record, including a dual match win against Mt. St. Joseph. Individually, the Yellow Jackets are led by the trio of freshman 149-pounder **Muhamed Salem**, sophomore 157-pounder **Gino Russo** and senior 285-pounder **Bryan Kmetz**. All three grapplers had perfect 4-0 marks at last weekend's Olivet Duals. **Kmetz** and **Russo** are each 7-0 this season and **Salem** is 5-0. Also at Olivet, freshman **Brian Bucher** was 3-1.

Following tonight's dual match, B-W will compete this Saturday in Rochester, New York at the annual Rochester Institute of Technology (RIT) Invitational Tournament. Wrestling begins at 9:00 a.m. The next home match is on January 10 versus OAC and Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll University at 7:30 p.m.

The B-W Winter Sports Update

*** The men's basketball team has a 4-1 overall record following a 75-72 loss to eighth-ranked Albion (Mich.) in the championship game at the Allegheny (Pa.) College Tournament last weekend. B-W advanced to the championship game with an 89-66 win versus Allegheny as pre-season All-American **Tori Davis (Elyria/ Open Door)** became the 33rd men's basketball player in B-W school history to surpass 1,000 career points. He now has 1,037 points.

To date, **Davis** leads the team in scoring, averaging 22.8 points per game. He also leads the team in rebounding, grabbing 9.0 rebounds per game. **Davis** is currently shooting 64.1 percent (41-of-64) and 71.1 percent (32-of-45) from the free-throw line.

*** The women's basketball team is in action tonight at University Circle in a nonleague game against Cleveland cross-town rival Case. That game began at 7:00 p.m. and can be heard locally on campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM and via the College Internet Web site at www.bw.edu/athletics or www.wbwc.com.

To date, the Yellow Jackets are led by sophomore forward **Alyson Cotter (Salem)** who is averaging 10.3 points per game. She also is tied for second in rebounding averaging 4.3 rebounds per game. **Cotter** is shooting 57.1 percent (12-of-21) from the floor including 85.7 percent from the free-throw line (six-of-seven).

*** The men's and women's track teams will compete in their first meet of the season on Friday, Jan. 20 when they host the Mid-January Meet on the Harrison Dillard indoor track. This season, the women's team will be looking to defend its OAC Championship indoor title and earn its 17th title in the last 21 years. The team is returning All-OAC seniors **Mary Griglak (Cleveland)**, **Liz Redd (North Canton)**, **Kim Lammers (Liberty Center)**, **Angela Gruss (Tiffin)**, junior All-American **Kara Weaver (Myrtle Creek, Ore.)** and sophomores **Jeanne Osborne (Oak Harbor)**, **Megan Cathcart (Parma)**, and **Kristen Paulsen (Oberlin/ Firelands)**. The men's team is returning OAC players in senior **Josh Svenson (Wadsworth)**, juniors **Sean Johnson (Alliance)**, **Ben Price (Cleveland)**, and **Steve Johnson (Canton)**, sophomores **James Harris-Chappell (Jefferson)**, **Aaron Apathy (Parma)**, and **D.J. Hanigosky (North Royalton)**.

*** The men's and women's swimming and diving teams are idle until their annual winter break trip to the Sunshine State of Florida from January 1-8, 2006. B-W will swim a pair of NCAA Division II schools in Florida. Last weekend (Nov.18-19), B-W competed at the Second Annual Doug Coers Invitational Meet at Division I Ball State (Ind.) University. Highlighting the meet was the men's 200-yard and 400-yard freestyle relay teams which each set a school record. Both the 200 and 400 freestyle teams are comprised of juniors **Alex de la Pena (Elyria)** and **D.J. Mosiniak (Perrysburg)**, sophomore **Dave Fournier (Toledo)** and freshman **Sean Sonnenberger (Napoleon)**. Earlier last week, **Mosiniak** broke the school-record in the 50-yard freestyle with a 21.39-second timing at the Cleveland State University All-City Meet at the CSU Natatorium. Both teams enter the winter break with 5-3 overall and perfect 2-0 OAC records.

Final Fall Sports Update

*** The football team ended the season 4-6 overall and 3-6 in the OAC. Despite suffering its first losing season in 38 years, B-W had a record-setting season. Senior two-time All-OAC linebacker **Joe George (Massillon/Perry)** became the all-time leading tackler in school history with 334 career tackles. He also was the second player in B-W history to have two 100-tackle seasons (2003 and 2005). Senior defensive end **Ryan Lewis (Holland/Springfield)** was named the OAC Paul Hoernemann Award winner which is given to the conference's most valuable defensive lineman. He led the OAC in quarterback sacks in 2005 with 12 and finished with 28 career sacks. His 28 sacks rank second all-time in B-W history. Six players were named All-OAC, including **George** and **Lewis**, and four players were named ESPN *The Magazine* Academic All-District IV.

*** The volleyball team finished its season with an overall record of 22-12. B-W also was second during the regular season and ranked much of the season in the AVCA national poll. Individually, junior setter **Angie Camp (Norwalk)** was named honorable mention AVCA All-American and first-team All-Great Lakes Region and All-OAC player. Also, freshman outside hitter **Rachel Selgo (Grand Rapids, Mich)** was named honorable mention All-Region, the Region *Freshman of the Year*, second-team All-OAC and the OAC *Freshman-of-the-Year*. Joining the duo on the All-OAC team was sophomore outside hitter **Kelsey Hills (Toledo)**, a second-team All-OAC pick. Last year, **Hills** was the OAC *Co-Freshman of the Year*.

*** The men's soccer team ended another outstanding season with a 14-6-1 overall and 6-3-1 OAC record. B-W was third during the OAC regular season and fourth in the OAC Tournament. The 14 victories ties the school record for wins in a season. The past two years, the B-W men were 28-11-2 overall and have been ranked both regionally and nationally. Individually, senior **Nate Christian (North Ridgeville)** is this year's OAC *Goalie of the Year* and junior **Louie Rolko (Hudson)** is this year's *Co-Midfielder of the Year*. They are joined by senior **Josh Dunder (Medina)** on the All-OAC first-team. In addition, junior **Jon Stanton (Delaware)** and sophomores **Todd Alexander (Hudson)** and **Matt Pietro (Canfield)** were honorable mention All-OAC choices. **Tom Ehrnfelt (Strongsville)** and **Matt Pietro (Canfield)** were named to the Academic All-OAC Team.

*** The women's soccer team also had an outstanding season and finished 13-5-3 overall, one win away from tying the school single-season record for victories. The Yellow Jackets were 5-2-2 in the OAC to place third and finished second in the OAC Tournament. Individually, sophomore **Michelle Neff (Strongsville)** was tabbed to the All-OAC first-team and the trio of junior **Jenny Miller (North Ridgeville)**, junior **Emily Lawrentz (Mansfield)** and sophomore **Courtney Gillespie (Brunswick)** were all second-team picks.

*** The men's and women's cross country teams ended their seasons by competing in the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region Meet at Wilmington College. The women placed 14th and the men were 19th. Crossing the finish line first for the women was freshman **Ashley Scullion (Kentwood, Mich.)** in 27th place with a time 22:22. She was joined as an All-Regional runner by junior **Megan Via (Brookville)** who placed 29th. For the men, sophomore **Josh Biggs (North Royalton)** was the first to cross the line in 15th place and earn All-Regional accolades. The three runners also received All-OAC Honors at the OAC Championship Meet.
