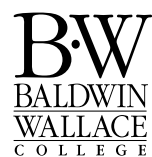

Yellow Jacket Wrestlers Host Ohio Athletic Conference Foe Wilmington College on Seniors' Night in Berea

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team, 6-13 overall and 0-3 in the Ohio Athletic Conference, hosts OAC foe Wilmington College on Seniors' Night in the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium inside the Lou Higgins Center. Tonight, **Head Coach Rich Fleming** will recognize eight outstanding senior competitors prior to the start of the dual match. They are **Devin Carman, Mike Ham, Chris Harrold, Bryan Kmetz, Seth Pirc, Sterling Sebek, T. Terry** and **Steve Vaughn**. This group of senior represents some of the finest ever to grapple at B-W.

In addition, for the first time this season, **Fleming** will have his entire lineup ready to compete in a dual match, including **Carman**, who was an NCAA Division III All-American last season at 197 pounds.

B-W last competed on Saturday (Jan. 21) when they lost a 25-13 decision to Thiel College of Pennsylvania. Despite the loss, freshman 133-pounder **Chris Hamed** and **Carman** each won individually in their first matches of the season. In addition, freshman 149-pounder **Mohamed Salem** also won. **Carman** won by pin and **Salem** won by major decision.

After 19 dual matches and one invitational tourney, sophomore 157-pounder **Gino Russo** tops all Yellow Jacket grapplers with 22 wins and a sparkling 22-2 record with a .917 winning percentage. **Kmetz** is second with 19 victories and is 19-2 overall record. He also tops the Yellow Jacketes with nine pin/ falls and 28 near falls. **Sebek** is third on the squad with 17 wins and is 15-5 overall. **Salem** is fourth with 15 wins and a 15-5 record. Also at 133 pounds, freshman **Brian Bucher** is 10-9 and senior **Chris Harrold** is 5-1. In addition to **Russo** at 157 pounds, senior **Seth Pirc** is 6-0. **Terry** is 8-8 at 165 pounds. Statistically, **Russo** tops the team 83 takedowns. **Salem** has the most escapes with 28. **Bucher** has the most reversals with 23.

Fans are reminded that this weekend the Yellow Jacketes are idle and do not compete again until Tuesday, Jan. 31 when they travel to New Concord, Ohio and will compete against OAC rival Muskingum College at 7:30 p.m.

In addition, fans are reminded that the 21st Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament is on February 4 in the Lou Higgins Center Fieldhouse with action beginning at 10:00 a.m. Also, the 2006 OAC Championship Tournament will take place on Feb. 18 in the Ursprung Gymnasium with wrestling beginning at 10:00 a.m.

B-W Winter Sports Update (continued).

The B-W last played on Saturday, Jan. 21 when it beat Wilmington College, 80-68, in Wilmington. Leading the way was led by junior preseason All-American forward **Tori Davis (Elyria/ Open Door Christian School)** scored a game-high 25 points and seven rebounds. He was joined in double figures by senior All-OAC guard **Keith Aufmuth (Brooklyn)** with 17 points and six rebounds and senior forward **Dan Gundert (Wellington)** with 12 points and seven rebounds.

After 17 games, **Davis** tops the team and OAC in scoring at 23.4 ppg, and leads the team in rebounding at 9.1 rpg. **Aufmuth** is second in scoring at 13.0 ppg. He currently has 951 career points and needs 49 more to become the 34th member of the Yellow Jacket "1,000-Point Club".

The Yellow Jacket men are at Marietta this Saturday for a 3:00 p.m. game. Fans can listen to that game on WBWC, 88.3 FM. The pregame show begins at 2:45 p.m.

The Indoor Track Update

The men's and women's indoor track and field teams will compete this Saturday (Jan. 28) at the OAC Relay Meet at Marietta.

Last Friday, B-W opened the season by hosting the Mid-January Meet on the Harrison Dillard Track in the Higgins Center. Highlighting the meet for the Jackets' was freshman sprinter **Rebekah Paul (Gibsonburg)** who individually won the 300 and 400-meter dashes and ran on the winning 4 x 400-meter relay team. She won the 300 meter dash with a time of 44.25 seconds and the 400 in 1:00.84 overall. Joining **Paul** on the winning relay team were freshman **Andrea Phillips (Akron/ Manchester)**, junior **Kim Johnson (Athens)** and senior **Ashlee Pence (Reynoldsburg/ Licking Heights)**. For her efforts, **Paul** was tabbed as this week's OAC Women's Track & Field Runner of the Week.

In addition to **Paul**, sophomore **Jeanne Osborne (Oak Harbor)** won the 55 meter hurdles in 8.97 seconds, senior **Kim Lammers (Liberty Center)** won the shot put with a throw of 40-feet and 4.25 inches. Also, men's pole vaulter **Sean Johnson (Canton/ Central Catholic)** won that event with a vault of 14' 5.5".

B-W is at Case next Friday (Feb. 3) and at the Akron Open on Feb. 4. The next home meet is Feb. 10 when B-W hosts the Annual Mid-February Meet. The final home meet is on Feb. 17 when the College hosts the Annual Greater Cleveland College Indoor Track & Field Championship Meet. Both home meets begin at 5:30 p.m.

Devin Carmen is en route to being one of the finest wrestlers in B-W history. The 2005 NCAA Division III All-American completed his junior season at 28-5 overall, won an OAC title, placed eighth at the Division III National Tournament. The 28 wins are a career-high. Devin returned to the mat last week following surgery in November for a nagging injury. He is just getting healthy and will make the Yellow Jacket lineup even stronger. As a freshman, Devin had a 24-7 record with 53 takedowns and five falls. He placed second in the OAC Tournament and earned All-OAC accolades. He was third in the John Summa Tournament and placed second at the RIT Invitational. As a sophomore, Devin had an 11-3 overall record, including a 10-3 mark at 197 pounds. He earned OAC Wrestler of the Week honors for having a 6-0 overall mark, including a 5-0 record and won an individual title RIT. As a junior, Devin was honored as the OAC *Wrestler of the Week* twice -- first on December 12, 2004 when he won another individual title at the RIT Invitational. The second time was the on January 31, 2005 when he went a perfect 3-0 in matches against Wilmington, RIT, and Thiel. Devin went on to win the OAC title at 197 pounds and earn All-American acclaim.

As a freshman, Chris had an injury-plagued season and had a 1-4 record at 133 pounds. As a sophomore, Chris compiled a 4-12 overall mark and split time between the 133 and 141-pound weight classes and earned a varsity letter. Bryan Kmetz is competing in his third season of wrestling and has been one of the best 285-pounder in Division III since the day he stepped on the mat. This season, Bryan has compiled an impressive 19-2 record, is ranked seventh nationally in Division III and is having his best season as a collegian, including being named as the Most Valuable Wrestler at the RIT Tournament and three times being named as the OAC *Wrestler of the Week*. Bryan did not compete as a freshman, instead choosing to concentrate on his academics. As a sophomore, Bryan earned a varsity letter, was the OAC *Wrestler of the Week*, compiled a 28-5 overall record with a team-leading .848 winning percentage and finished second and earned All-OAC honors at the OAC Championships. As a junior, Bryan compiled an impressive 21-6 record with a team-leading 33 near falls, was the B-W John Summa Trny. MVP and again earned All-OAC accolades with a second place showing at the OAC Trny.

Seth Pirc is completing his fourth season of wrestling and following a two-year break from the sport and is doing quite well with a perfect 6-0 record at 157 pounds. In addition, by coming back after a two-year absence, Seth has showed his love and dedication to both the sport of wrestling and his team. In his first season of wrestling in 2001-2002, Seth earned his first varsity letter as a backup splitting time between 149 and 157 pounds. Near the end of the season, Seth became B-W's top 157-pounder and competed at the OAC Tournament. Overall, Seth had a combined record of 4-12 between 141 and 157 pounds. After spending a semester abroad in Australia in 2002-2003, Seth returned as the starting 157-pounder and finished with a 4-9 record before a season ending knee injury. Sterling Sebek is the "heart and soul" of the wrestling program at B-W. He has overcome injury and illness to wrestle and lead by example. Sterling is having his best season as a collegian with a 15-5 mark and is finally back to wrestling at his natural weight of 174 pounds. As a freshman, Sterling battled with Joe Heiland '05 for mat time at 165 pounds and finished 6-15 overall with 10 takedowns, 17 escapes, two reversals, four near falls and one pin. As a sophomore, Sterling posted a 10-4 record and placed second at the RIT Tournament before his seas on ended prematurely in December due to an injury. As a red-shirt sophomore. Sterling compiled a 10-10 record at 184 pounds, including one technical fall. He also had 24 takedowns, 22 escapes, five reversals and seven near falls. Sterling missed a good part of the middle of the season due to a staph infection. As a junior, Sterling missed the first half of the season due to an injury. Women's Basketball Update

The eighth-ranked Yellow Jacket women's basketball team, 15-2 overall and a perfect 10-0 in the Ohio Athletic Conference, travels to University Heights to play against OAC and Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll University tomorrow tonight at 7:30 p.m. Fans can listen to that game on campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM. The pre-game show begins at 7:15 p.m. and seniors Chris Fedor and Pete Goche will call all of the action back to Berea. The Yellow Jacket women have beaten the JCU women 28 straight times, including 81-53 earlier this season in Berea on Jan 11.
