Head Coach Rich Fleming

Head Coach Rich Fleming is in his 18th season of coaching the wrestlers at B-W in 2005-2006. Fleming is committed to having championship wrestling at B-W and keeping the Yellow Jackets a power in the Ohio Athletic Conference and at the NCAA Division III level.

Since taking over the program, Fleming has tutored 30 wrestlers to the Division III national tournament, including a national champion. In eight of the past nine years, his team has been nationally ranked.

As a wrestler, Fleming learned that it takes hard work to become a champion. His 123-pound Mid-American Conference title while at Miami of Ohio is evidence of that work ethic. That same work ethic governs B-W wrestling.

Fleming is a 1963 graduate of Miami of Ohio and earned his master's degree from Cleveland State University in 1985. Prior to coming to B-W, he spent 17 years building a powerful program at nearby Parma Senior High School. Fleming is retired as a teacher and has dedicated his time to building the Yellow Jacket program into one of the best in Division III. This is Rich's 43rd coaching wrestling. He has been a head coach 35 of those years. Coach Fleming is in the Ohio Wrestling Hall of Fame.

Yellow Jackets Open Season By Hosting the B-W Quad Meet Today at the Lou Higgins Center

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team will look forward to a strong and promising season in 2005-2006. Under the direction of 18-year veteran Head Coach Rich Fleming, B-W will

sport a team that has solid veteran leadership, returning upperclass depth and a strong group of newcomers who hope to make B-W even better than a year ago.

Last season, the Yellow Jackets finished with an 8-16 overall record and were 3-3 in Ohio Athletic Conference dual matches. The team finished fourth at the OAC Chamionship Tournament and tied for 34th at the NCAA Division III National Championships.

This year, the Yellow Jackets return 15 letterman and eight starters and will be led by senior All-American 197-pounder **Devin Carman**, who finished last season with a 28-5 overall record, won an OAC individual title and finished eighth at the Div. III National tourney. He also was ranked by the Adidas-Brute National poll as high as seventh.

In addition, senior two-time All-OAC 285-pounder **Bryan Kmetz, who** was 21-6 a year ago and earned the B-W 19th Annual John Summa Tournament *Most Valuable Wrestler* Award and was second at the OAC Tournament, will be another key. **Kmetz** was also ranked nationally in the Adidas-Brute poll during the season. Some other top Yellow Jackets include sophomore 157-pounder **Gino Russo** (13-13), senior 157/ 165-pounder **Steve Vaughn** (9-10), senior 174-pounder **T. Terry** (16-21), senior 184-pounder **Sterling Sebak** (12-9). The other returning starters are **Mike Ham** at 125 pounds (5-13), **Chris Harrold** at 133 pounds (6-14) and **Scott Haber** at 141 pounds (5-17).

Following its matches today, the Yellow Jacket wrestlers will be back in action on November 19 when they travel to Olivet, Michigan to participate in the annual Olivet College Duals at 9:00 a.m.

In Other B-W Sports

*** The football team is also in action at home today as it hosts OAC and Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll University at The George Finnie Stadium. The game begins at 1:30 p.m. and is the annual Battle for the Cuyahoga Gold Bowl trophy. The all-time B-W and JCU series is tied at 20-20-4 overall and the Gold Bowl series which began in 1989 is even at 8-8. It is Seniors' Day at B-W.

*** The volleyball team finished the season last Saturday with its third straight second-place finish at the OAC Tournament. The Yellow Jackets lost the championship match to Capital by a score of 3-1 and finished the season with an overall record of 22-12. B-W also was second during the regular season and ranked much of the season in the AVCA Coaches national poll. Individually, freshman outside hitter **Rachel Selgo (Grand Rapids, Mich)** was named to the second-team All-OAC and the OAC *Freshman-of-the-Year*. Joining her on the All-OAC team were first-team All-OAC setter **Angie Camp (Norwalk)** and second-team outside hitter **Kelsey Hills (Toledo)**. **Hills** was the OAC Co-Freshman of the Year in 2004.

*** The men's soccer team ended another outstanding season with a 14-6-1 overall and 6-3-1 OAC record. B-W was third during the OAC regular season and fourth in the OAC Tournament. The 14 victories ties the school-record for wins in a season. The past two years, the B-W men are 28-11-2 overall and have been ranked both regionally and nationally. Individually, senior **Nate Christian (North Ridgeville)** is this year's OAC *Goalie of the Year*, junior **Louie Rolko (Hudson)** is this year's *Co-Midfielder of the Year* and they are joined by senior **Josh Dundr (Medina)** on the All-OAC first-team. In addition, junior **Jon Stanton (Delaware)** and sophomores **Todd Alexander (Hudson)** and **Matt Pietro (Canfield)** were honorable mention All-OAC choices.

*** The women's soccer team also had an outstanding season and finished 13-5-3 overall and one win away from tying the school single-season record for victories. The Yellow Jackets were 5-2-2 in the OAC to place third and finished second in the OAC Tournament. Individually, sophomore **Michelle Neff (Strongsville)** was tabbed to the All-OAC first-team and the trio of junior **Jenny Miller (North Ridgeville)**, junior **Emily Lawrentz (Mansfield)** and sophomore **Courtney Gillespie (Brunswick)** were all second-team picks.

*** The men's and women's cross country teams will compete this Saturday at the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region Meet at Wilmington College. Two weeks ago at the OAC Championship Meet the women placed fifth and the men were sixth. Crossing the finish line first for the women was junior **Megan Via (Brookville)** in third place with a time 22:39. She was joined as an All-OAC runner by freshman **Ashley Scullion (Kentwood, Mich.)** who placed sixth. For the men, sophomore **Josh Biggs (North Royalton)** was the first to cross the line in fourth place and earn All-OAC accolades.

*** The Yellow Jacket swimming and diving teams also are at home today when they swim against nonleague foe Ohio Wesleyan University in the B-W Natatorium at 1:00 p.m. The men are 3-0 overall and 2-0 in the OAC and the women are 2-1 overall and 2-0 in the OAC. Last week, freshman **Sean Sonnenberg (Napoleon)** was the OAC *Swimmer of the Week*. This week it is junior **Alex de la Pena (Elyria)**.

*** The men's and women's basketball teams open the season on the weekend of November 18-19. The men are at the Westminster (Pa.) tourney and the women open the season at the University of Rochester (N.Y.) Tournament. The men open against No.5-ranked St. John Fisher (N.Y.) at 6:00 p.m. and the women play Bethany (W. Va.) at 3:00 p.m. At the annual OAC Media Day, the women were tabbed to win the OAC title and men were picked second.
