BEREA, OHIO -- Baldwin-Wallace College has had a good start to the winter season. In addition to tonight's OAC match between the Yellow Jackets and Purple Raiders and Saturday's trip to Rochester, New York to participate at the RIT Invitational, four of the other six B-W winter sport teams are in action this week.

The 3-1 overall men's basketball team is on a three-game winning streak and travels to Oberlin for a 7:30 p.m. game on Wednesday and then hosts traditional OAC power Otterbein on Saturday in its home-opener at 3:00 p.m.

The Yellow Jacket women's basketball team is ranked 22nd in Division III and is off to an impressive 3-0 start, including its second straight title at the annual Greater Cleveland College Tournament two weeks ago. B-W also beat traditional nonleague rival Wittenberg, 77-62, last Tuesday in Springfield. This week, Coach Cheri Harrer's squad is at Grove City College of Pennsylvania on Thursday and at Otterbein on Saturday.

The Yellow Jacket men's and women's swimming and diving teams get back to action when they swim from Thursday through Saturday at The College of Wooster Invitational. To date, the women's team is 5-3 overall and 2-0 in the OAC, and the men are 4-3 overall and 2-0 in the OAC.

The final winter sport teams are the men's and women's indoor track and field squads. They do not begin competition until January 23 when they host a meet at 5:00 p.m.



Yellow Jacket Wrestlers Host Mt. Union to Open the Ohio Athletic Conference Dual Match Schedule

BEREA, OHIO -- The 2-0 overall and 29th-ranked Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team will open the 2003-2004 Ohio Athletic Conference dual match schedule tonight when it faces OAC arch-rival Mount Union College at the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium,

B-W opened its 2003-2004 season two weeks ago when it defeated Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University (22-16) and Waynesburg College of Pennsylvania (36-18) in its annual Tri-Meet in Berea. The Yellow Jackets are tabbed to finish fourth by the OAC Coaches during the OAC Dual Match season and fourth in the OAC Tournament.

A year ago, B-W had an 8-6 overall dual match record and a 2-4 slate during the OAC dual match season. It shocked the rest of the OAC at the annual OAC Championships when it placed second and had three individual champions in current sophomore 125-pounder Jared Selover, current senior 165-pounder Joe Heiland and graduated heavyweight Greg Hartlaub, who is currently serving as an assistant coach. But despite placing second at last year's OAC Championships, veteran B-W Head Coach Rich Fleming is not satisfied.

"It was a great showing by our wrestling program," said Fleming. "We had three champions and two other young men come close to winning titles. Four of the five are back this year. We have an outstanding group of wrestlers this year. Once we get everyone down to their natural weight class and healthy, we will be pretty good.

"Facing Mount Union is always a challenge," continued Fleming. "They traditionally have a good team, so we will need to be ready. For us to make that step to the next level as a program, we cannot overlook anyone. We will need to be ready to wrestle every time we step on the mats. That's what good teams do. I am looking forward to getting back at it after the Thanksgiving break, and I hope our kids are ready too."

Following its match tonight versus the Purple Raiders, B-W will travel to Rochester, New York this weekend to participate at the annual Rochester Institute of Technology Tournament on Saturday. Action begins at 9:00 a.m.



Yellow Jacket Wrestling Team Began the Season Strong With Wins Versus CWRU and Waynesburg at the B-W Tri-Meet

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College Yellow Jacket wrestling team opened the 2003-2004 season on November 22 by beating Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University, 22-16, and Waynesburg College of Pennsylvania, 36-18, right here at the Ursprung Gymnasium. It was a good, solid start to the season.

In the two matches, senior 165-pound national qualifier **Joe Heiland**, sophomore 174-pounder **Roger Roman** and freshman heavyweight **Bryan Kmetz** all posted 2-0 records. In addition, sophomore 125-pound All-American **Jared Selover** was 1-0 and pinned his only opponent in 59 seconds.

"We are pleased with the way we started the season, but we cannot be content," said veteran Yellow Jacket Head Coach Rich Fleming. "Everyone got a chance to participate. That is good when we can do it.

"Tonight, we start the OAC schedule. It gets tough from here on out."

Div. III Brute/Adidas Preseason Poll -- The Yellow Jackets will enter the season ranked 29th in the Brute/ Adidas Division III national preseason poll. Jared Selover is also ranked fourth nationally at 125 pounds by the selection committee.

B-W Tabbed Fourth in the OAC -- The OAC Wrestling Coaches have picked B-W to finish fourth in both the OAC regular season dual match schedule and fourth at the OAC Tournament. B-W surprised everyone last year by placing second in the tourney after a 2-4 dual match season.
