In the consolation bracket, Wuhr once again received a bye before defeating Garrett Miyake of Pacific(Wa.) by a major decision of 13-5. Wuhr was eliminated in the fourth round, one round shy of NCAA Division III All-American accolades when he lost to Kevin Owens of Central (Ia.) College, 7-5.

Yellow Jackets End a Successful Season With a Third Place Finish at the OAC Tournament; Wuhr Goes to NCAAs

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team finished the 2003-2004 season with a 6-7 overall and 3-3 Ohio Athletic Conference dual match record but that was just a part of the success that occurred on the mats for veteran Head Coach Rich Fleming.

Senior 141-pounder Sayre Wuhr and Fleming highlighted a season of improvement that culminated in Fleming's 100th career wins as coach, Sayre advancing to the 2004 NCAA Division III National Tournament and winning a match and five Yellow Jacket grapplers qualifying for the OAC Tournament championship round which led to a surprising third place finish. Sayre had an outstanding senior season, and there is great reason to rejoice in his success story, and there is just as much to be excited about when you consider that he and senior 197-pounder Tom DeLuca are the only senior starters who will graduate.

For Fleming, his 100th win came in a dual match victory against Wilmington College on January 20, 2004 in Wilmington with a 22-12 victory. He was honored for his accomplishment prior to the championship round of this year's John Summa Invitational Tournament. Fleming's 102 career wins rank second in school history to the legendary Summa.

Sayre transferred to B-W from OAC rival Capital University in the Fall of 2001, and it was a match made in heaven for the Yellow Jacket wrestling program. He improved every year he wore the Brown & Gold. Sayre's senior year was his best yet as he compiled a 27-9 record, was 4-0 at the NCAA Division III Duals, won an OAC title and had a 1-2 mark at the NCAA Championships. He ended his career with a 64-32 record. Most importantly, Sayre was a great leader.

As the 2003-2004 season progressed, Fleming looked for improvement despite a number of serious injuries and some health problems on his team. But just as they did in 2003, B-W rose to the occasion at the 2004 OAC Championship Tournament and surprised the field.

Picked to finish sixth in the OAC Coaches preseason poll, Fleming and his staff prepared the team well. Wuhr, sophomore All-American 133-pounder Jared Selover, junior 165-pounder Joe Heiland, senior 197-pounder Tom DeLuca and sophomore 285-pounder Bryan Kmetz all wrestled well and qualified for the championship match at their respective weight class. The efforts of these five as well as others made the rest of the OAC take notice this year, and are now put on notice that next year is B-W's year to challenge for an OAC title.

Bryan Kmetz had the best record on the team with a 28-5 mark. Sayre and his 27 victories ranked second on the team. Jared Selover, an All-American at 125 pounds as a freshman, was 22-7 overall, including a 10-3 mark at 133 pounds. After just two seasons, Jared already has 57 career wins. Joe Heiland, who recovered from a serious rib injury at midseason to battle for the title at 165 pounds for the second straight year, had an 18-6 mark. In 2003, Heiland won the OAC title at 165 pounds and advanced to the NCAA tourney. Tom DeLuca had just a 3-1 mark at 197 pounds before losing a tough match in the OAC finals.

In addition, Fleming will return a bevy of grapplers who gained extensive experience and will be even better next year. They are juniors Scott Conrath, James Payne and Sterling Sebek, sophomores Mike Ham, Chris Harrold, Eric Jaynes, Mike Munroe, Thamir Rimbart, T. Terry and Steve Vaughn and freshmen Eddie Waters, Dave Sarosy and Joe Smith (who missed this year after suffering a serious automobile accident last summer).

BEREA, OHIO -- At the 2004 Ohio Athletic Conference wrestling championships, B-W finished third of seven teams. Five Yellow Jacket grapplers, Jared Selover (133), Sayre Wuhr (141), Joe Heiland (165), Tom DeLuca (197) and Bryan Kmetz (285) all qualified for the finals with Wuhr winning a title.

At the NCAA Division III National Tournament, Sayre Wuhr had a 1-2 record and narrowly missed being an All-American. He received a first round bye before losing by major decision to third seeded Pat Brady of the College of New Jersey, 14-5.

Sayre, we wish you the best of luck in all of your future endeavors.

Tom DeLuca was the guy at the OAC Championship Meet with the "Big Red S" on his chest. Tom joined the Yellow Jacket team three weeks before the OAC Championships with the goal of helping the team. What he ended up doing was to reinvigorate a sleeping giant. His effort and enthusiasm helped his teammates to accomplish the third place finish at the OAC tourney. Tom had a 3-1 record and ended his B-W experience as a key contributor to both the football and wrestling programs. Tom also has family history at B-W (his grandfather once held the record for the longest kick return for a touchdown and his uncle is the late and legendary Paul "Sparky" Adams and his brother is current assistant coach, All-OAC wrestler and All-American football punter Max DeLuca. Tom, himself, was three times All-OAC in football, was a four-year starter in the secondary and served as a team captain as a senior.
