

Baldwin-Wallace College Honors Six Outstanding Wrestlers Today on Seniors' Day in Berea

ANTONIO CAMPEA: Antonio Campea is competing in his third season of wrestling at 174, 184, and 197 weight classes and has a 11-10 overall record in his final season as a Yellow Jacket. Highlighting his senior season was winning an individual title at the 2008 John Summa Memorial Tournament on February 2. Entering tonight's match, Antonio has a 33-33 career record. After sitting out his freshman year and as a sophomore in 2005-2006, Antonio finished with a 8-8 record as he split mat time between the 165, 174 and 184 weight classes. As a junior in 2006-2007, Antonio earned his second varsity letter with a record of 14-15. He placed fourth at the Ohio Athletic Conference Championship Tournament. He earned the OAC *Wrestler of the Week* honor for his efforts and 3-0 record at the 2007 John Reese Dual Match Tournament at Wilkes University. Antonio is a business administration and marketing double major. He is the son of Pina and Guy Campea of Hinckley, Ohio.

Coach Fleming's Comments: For three years, Antonio has been a dedicated and cooperative hard-worker. Highlights in his career are that he placed fourth in the OAC Tournament in 2007 and placed first in the 2008 John Summa Tournament at 174 pounds. Antonio also is an outstanding team member and leader. Many times, he has split time at a number of weight classes to help our team. We thank him for his dedicated commitment to make B-W wrestling better for every member of his team.

RAYSHAWN EATMON: Rayshawn Eatmon is competing in his third season of wrestling at 149 pounds and has a 4-6 record this season. He missed the first half of the season but has come on strong, including placing second at 149 pounds at the Summa Tournament. As a freshman in 2003-2004, Rayshawn split time between the 149 and 157 weight classes and finished with a 1-0 record. After sitting out his sophomore year and as a junior, he earned his first varsity letter as he competed at 141 pounds and compiled a 6-9 record. Rayshawn is involved in the Buddy System, served as a Resident Assistant, is involved in the Campus Entertainment Production Group and is a member of Mere Images. Rayshawn is a religion major and would eventually like to own a hotel. He is the son of Jacqueline Perry of East Cleveland, Ohio.

Coach Fleming's Comments: Rayshawn has competed really, really well the last two years and highlighted his career efforts with a second place finish at the 2008 John Summa Tournament. Last year, his season was shortened due to injury. Every year that Rayshawn has wrestled, he has improved a great deal.

JEREMY FEADOR: Jeremy Feador is competing in his fourth and final season of wrestling at 174 pounds and has a 15-12 record this season. He enters tonight's Seniors' Night match with a 48-44 career record with 23 falls. His 23 career falls ranks 15th all-time. In every match that Jeremy competes, he gives great effort and it is quite evident if you watch him. As a freshman in 2004-2005, Jeremy compiled a 4-8 record. As a sophomore in 2005-2006, Jeremy had a 8-14 overall record and finished fourth in the 2006 OAC Championship Tournament at 184 pounds. Earning his third varsity letter in his junior year, Jeremy finished with an outstanding 21-10 overall record. He earned OAC *Wrestler of the Week* with his efforts in a dual match win at Mt. Union and an individual win versus Notre Dame College. He earned his second OAC *Wrestler of the Week* Award for his efforts against Wilmington at the John Summa Tournament, which he recorded with the most pins in the tourney and earned the John Summa Tournament *Most Valuable Wrestler*. He earned his third OAC *Wrestler of the Week* Award for a pin against Muskingum. Jeremy is a history and political science double major and carries a 3.6 grade point average and was awarded Academic All-OAC honors a year ago. In the future, Jeremy hopes to pursue a career as a historian. Jeremy is the son of David and Mary Ellen Feador of North Olmsted.

Coach Fleming's Comments: Jeremy Feador has distinguished himself as a two-year starter, four-year letterman and as a team captain this winter. Jeremy had the honor of being the Outstanding Wrestler in the 2007 John Summa Tournament and placed fourth in the 2006 OAC Tournament. He was an All-OAC Scholar-Athlete a year ago. He is the runner-up at the 2008 John Summa Tournament in the 174-pound weight class. Not only is Jeremy a great team leader, he is an outstanding person.

BRIAN HAINES: Brian is competing in his fourth season of wrestling and will earn his fourth varsity letter this winter. This season, Brian is the starter at 197 pounds and has an 11-11 overall record. He has highlighted the season by both winning an individual title at the John Summa Tournament on Feb. 2 and being named as last week's OAC *Wrestler of the Week*. Since coming to B-W, Brian competed a wide range of weight classes, including 157, 165, 174, 184 and now 197 pounds. As a freshman in 2004-2005, Brian was 3-4 at 157 pounds and 2-5 at 165 pounds. Brian missed most of his sophomore season due to injury, but finished with a 1-5 record in the 165-pound weight class. As a junior in 2006-2007, he finished 8-4 overall as he tallied an 8-3 mark at 184 pounds and was 0-1 at 197 pounds. In addition to being a fine wrestler, Brian is a Dean's List student, a member of the Chi Sigma Alpha Honor Society and was named as a Jacket Scholar. He is a biology and neuroscience major and aspires to attend medical school and become a neurosurgeon. Brian is the son of Josephine and Bruce Haines of Amanda.

Coach Fleming's Comments: Brian Haines is a four-year letterman and has establish himself as a fine 197-pound wrestler. It is through his hard work, guts and determination that he has succeeded both in the classroom and on the wrestling mat. Brian won a title at the 2008 John Summa Tournament, is an outstanding student in the classroom and wants to become a doctor. He truly embodies the philosophy of the student-athlete.

MIKE PELTON: Mike is wrestling in his fourth season and will earn his fourth varsity letters this winter. Mike is a young man who has shown great determination and effort and gives 110 percent at every practice and in every match. As a freshman in 2004-2005, Mike split time between the 197 and 285 pound weight classes. During his sophomore (3-4 overall) and junior seasons (9-15 overall), Mike was the backup to Division III All-American and Division III national runner-up Bryan Kmetz. This season, Mike is the starter at 285 pounds and two of his three victories have come by pin. Mike is a physical education major and would like to become a teacher and a coach. Mike is the son of Donna Pelton of Parma.

Coach Fleming's Comments: Mike Pelton has worked hard the past four years and is a four-year letterman at 285 pounds. Mike is the epitome of a good team member and has done a great job as a team leader to help B-W have a good wrestling team. He is the type of young man that every coach hopes to have on his team. Mike will be an outstanding teacher and coach because of the way in which he deals with people.

GINO RUSSO: Gino is wrestling in his fourth season, will earn his fourth varsity letter and is one of the best to ever compete at the College. **He is a Division III All-American.** The past three years, Gino has been one of the most dominant wrestlers in OAC; and the past two years, he is one of the most dominant 165-pounders in all of Division III. Prior to injuring himself earlier this season, Gino was 22-0 and ranked as the number-two 165-pounder in Division III. He earned All-OAC accolades at 157 pounds as a sophomore, won an OAC title and placed sixth at the NCAA Division III National Tournament as a junior and is currently 22-1 overall. He is expected back and will compete at the Feb. 23 OAC Tournament at John Carroll. As a freshman, Gino posted a 13-13 record as a 157-pounder. As a sophomore, Gino posted a 28-5 record at 157-pounds, placed second at the OAC tourney and earned All-OAC honors. As a junior, Gino moved up to 165 pounds, won the OAC title, earned All-OAC accolades for the second time, qualified for the NCAA Tournament and placed sixth to All-American honors. For the season, Gino had a 24-7 record with two falls. He also had a perfect 6-0 record in OAC dual matches. This season Gino has earned OAC *Wrestler of the Week* honors on Nov. 19, had a 4-0 record and won an individual title at the RIT Tournament, earned his second OAC *Wrestler of the Week* award on Dec. 17 for his efforts at the Florida Gator Duals and earned his third OAC *Wrestler of the Week* honor on Jan. 14 for a 4-0 record at the Lycoming Duals. Gino is a business administration and accounting major and would you like be a certified public accountant and coach wrestling. He is the son of Joseph and Cindy Russo of Northfield Center.

Coach Fleming's Comments: Gino Russo is an outstanding wrestler, four-year letterman, two-year team captain and a two-time All-OAC wrestler. Gino has been ranked as high second in Division III by the Division III Coaches Association. Gino placed second as a sophomore in the OAC at 157 pounds. Last year, Gino finished a great season by winning the OAC Tournament at 165 pounds and becoming the 12th All-American in Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling history. This year Gino is 22-1 and won the RIT Tournament title at 165 pounds. Gino is an excellent wrestler and team member. He also does well in the classroom and will be remembered as one of the best to ever compete at this College.
