



The Yellow Jacket Fall/ Winter Sports Roundup

Men's and Women's Cross Country

The men's and women's cross country teams have completed the regular season and ran earlier today at the 2009 NCAA Division III Great Lakes Regional Meet in Terre Haute,

Indiana. The Ohio Athletic Conference champion Yellow Jacket women entered the meet at 72-13 overall and the men entered at 33-51 overall.

Fans also are reminded that B-W is the host school for the 2009 NCAA Division III National Championship Meet on Saturday, Nov. 21 at the Highland Hills Golf Course in Highland Heights, Ohio. The women race is at 11:00 a.m. and the men run at 12:00 noon.

On October 31, B-W competed at the OAC Championship Meet at Wilmington with the women placing first with 37 points and the men placing fifth with 122 points. With the win, the women captured the 16th OAC Championship in program history (since the OAC began women's championships in 1985).

Individually, the women placed six runners in the top-13 and each one earned All-OAC honors. Leading the way was senior 2008 OAC *Co-Runner of the Year* **D'Arcy Hlavin (Berea)** who placed third. She was followed in the top-nine and on the All-OAC team by junior **Kim Chinn (Zanesville/ West Muskingum)** in fifth place and freshman **Sarah Rospert (Milan/ Edison)** in eighth place. In addition, junior **Karin Coyne (Columbia Station/ Columbia)**, who placed 10th, junior **Katie White (Berea)**, who placed 11th, and junior **Krysten Kovach (North Royalton/ Parma Padua)**, who placed 13th), all received honorable mention All-OAC honors. Junior **Brian Gibbons (Rocky River)** led the men with a seventh place finish to earn All-OAC accolades.

Men's Soccer

The men's soccer team had a 13-7-1 overall record and finished tied for second during the OAC regular season at 7-1-1 and advanced to the semifinal round of the OAC Tournament.

The Yellow Jackets won their first-ever home OAC playoff game on Tuesday, Nov. 3 with a 1-0 win against cross-town rival John Carroll University. Freshman forward **Justin Peterson (Rochester Hills, Mich./ Adams)** scored his first career goal on a header via a fine cross from senior sweeper **Nate Smith (Ashland/ Senior)**.

B-W placed five players on the All-OAC team announced this week. First-team honors went to senior goalkeeper **Russ Mika (Medina/ Senior)**, sophomore forward **Carlin Vandendriessche (Medina/ Senior)**, junior midfielder **Jeff Grater (Stow/ Stow-Munroe Falls)** and senior defender **Nate Smith (Ashland/ Senior)**. Mika also was named as the OAC's *Goalkeeper of the Year*. Second-team honors went to senior midfielder **Andy Synk (Strongsville)**. **Mika** and **Grater** also earned *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-District IV accolades.

B-W ended their season ranked fifth in the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region.

Football

The football team, 3-6 overall and 3-5 in the Ohio Athletic Conference, plays this afternoon in their season finale at OAC foe Capital University in Columbus at 1:30 p.m. Last Saturday, B-W defeated Wilmington College, 28-14, at The George Finnie Stadium. It was Seniors' Day as 17 Yellow Jacket senior football student-athletes and their parents were acknowledged prior to the game. Junior running back **John McGraw (North Ridgeville)** led the offense with 129 yards rushing on 23 carries and scored two touchdowns on the ground. Sophomore safety **Ryan Dugan (Mentor)** had eight tackles, an interception and two pass breakups for the defense. The four senior captains are quarterback **Anthony Gardner (Rocky River/ Lakewood St. Edward)**, safety **Ryan Clokey (Massillon/ Perry)**, middle linebacker **Paul Burger (Mentor)** and offensive tackle **Brett Scarl (North Olmsted)**.

Women's Soccer

The women's soccer team finished its season at 6-12-2 overall and 2-7 in the Ohio Athletic Conference. Offensively, the women were led by senior three-time All-OAC first-team sweeper **Stephanie Geiger (Berea)** with five goals and one assist for 11 points.

Two Yellow Jackets, Geiger and senior defender **Tyler Fridley (Niles/ McKinley)** were named to the All-OAC team. Both also received *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-District IV honors. **Geiger**, who also was a second-team All-Region selection and is a two-time Academic All-OAC choice, also received an OAC *Player of the Week* honors earlier this fall.

Volleyball

The volleyball team finished its season at 5-24 overall and 2-7 in the OAC and ended on a strong note by winning two of its final three matches, including a 3-0 shutout of Wilmington in its final match. The team was very young this year and did not have a single senior on the roster.

Offensively, the Jackets were led by junior middle hitter **Abbey Thompson (Lorain/ Clearview)** with 206 kills and junior setter **Casey Passen (Ashville/ Teays Valley)** was this season's assist leader with 559. Defensively, the Yellow Jackets were lead by freshman **Natalie Emmons (Ashland/ Senior)** with 427 digs.

Men's Golf

The men's golf team ended its fall season with a 27-11 record and was led by five players who averaged less than 80 strokes per 18-hole round. Senior two-time All-OAC player **Nick Bryan (Zanesville/ Rosecrans)** led the way with a 76.25 stroke average in four tournaments and eight total rounds. He was followed by junior **Matt Weiss (Concord/ Mentor)** at 76.50, senior All-OAC player **Mike Falk (Strongsville)** at 76.63, freshman **Stephen Spalding (Stow/ Walsh Jesuit)** at 76.83 and junior **Cory Swaisgood (Fremont/ St. Joseph Central Catholic)** at 79.63.

The Yellow Jacket golfers will resume their schedule this spring when they travel to Florida in March for their annual spring break trip.

Women's Golf

The women's golf team ended its fall season on Oct. 4 at the Gannon University Fall Invitational at Lakeshore C.C. in Erie, Pa. and finished the fall with an overall record of 8-19. This is another extremely young team that does not boast a senior on its roster. In fact the top two stroke average leaders for the fall were freshmen.

Leading the way was **Brooke Hamilton (Cleveland/ St. Joseph Academy)** with a 91.56 average for five tournaments and nine rounds of 18 holes. She was followed by **Rebecca Kapusta (Independence)** at 97.11.

The women will resume play with their spring season when they also travel south for spring break.

Men's and Women's Tennis

The women's tennis team, 12-7 overall last year and OAC runner-up, has won two of the last three OAC crowns and qualified for the NCAA Division III National Tournament in both 2007 and 2008.

This fall, the ladies competed in two tournaments and were led by senior **Andrea Essig (Ashtabula/ Edgewood)** and juniors **Emily Pelosi (Uniontown/ Lake)** and **Katy Marshall (Medina/ Senior)** all with 2-1 marks.

The men's team, 19-5 overall last season and an OAC semifinalist, traveled to Oberlin, Ohio this fall to compete at the Oberlin Invitational Tournament.

Both teams will resume their schedules on their annual spring break trip to Hilton Head, South Carolina.

Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving

The men's (3-1 overall and 1-0 in the OAC) and women's (0-4 overall, 0-1 OAC) swimming and diving teams competed today at home versus Washington & Jefferson (Pa.) College this afternoon in the B-W Natatorium.

Last Saturday, the men were 2-0 in a tri-match at Penn State-Behrend defeating the hosts, 122-117 and St. Vincent (Pa.) College, 169-64. The women fell to PSU-Behrend, 143-71 and St. Vincent, 148-66. The men were led by junior **Hector Diaz (El Paso, Texas/Cathedral)**, senior All-OAC performer **Vince Colwell (Parma/Normandy)** and junior All-American diver **Todd Richert (North Royalton)**. The women's squad was led by freshman diver **Julie Pinter (Broadview Heights/ Brecksville)** who won the one-meter dive.

Junior **Ryan Musille (Canton/ GlenOak)** was named as the OAC *Men's Swimmer of the Week* for his performance on Saturday, Oct. 31 when he won two events and swam on a winning relay team in a dual meet win versus Wilmington in Berea.

The swimmers and divers next compete on Friday night November 20 at OAC foe Mount Union College at 6:00 p.m.

Men's Basketball

The men's basketball team opens the 2009-2010 season this Monday, Nov. 16 when it hosts cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University at 6:30 p.m. in the Ursprung Gymnasium of the Lou Higgins Center.

Look for returning All-OAC senior forward **Kyle Brown (Strongsville)** to lead the way. He averaged 11.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per game despite missing five games with injury and playing many others while being hampered.

B-W also is home on Nov. 23 to play Geneva (Pa.) at 7:30 p.m. Both the Dec. 2 game versus John Carroll and the February 20, 2010 contest versus Otterbein College will be broadcast on SportsTimeOhio.

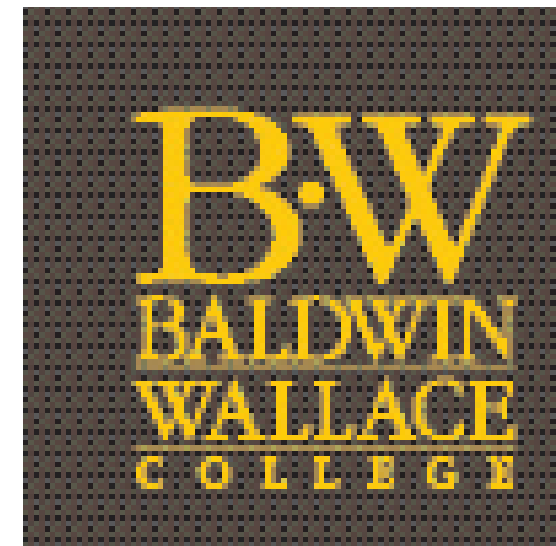
Women's Basketball

The women's basketball team is coming off a 22-8 record and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Division III National Tournament. The women open the season at the University of Rochester (N.Y.) Tournament versus Williams (Mass.) College on Friday, Nov. 20 at 6:00 p.m. and play home games on Nov. 24 versus CWRU and Wilmington on Nov. 28.

Look for junior All-OAC forward **Amanda Schroeder (Columbus Grove)** and senior two-time Academic All-OAC center **Ariel Brough (Olentangy-Liberty)** to lead the way. **Schroeder** scored 13.1 ppg. and grabbed 3.8 rpg. **Brough** scored 8.9 ppg., grabbed 7.6 rpg. and set a single-season school-record with 80 blocked shots last season.

Indoor Track & Field

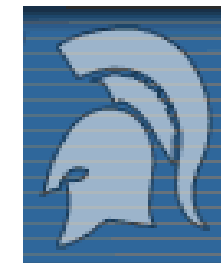
The 2010 indoor track season begins on Friday, January 23 when B-W hosts the Mid-January Meet on the Harrison Dillard Track in the Higgins Center.

The Yellow Jackets Host Case Western Reserve University Tonight at the Lou Higgins Center

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College Yellow Jacket wrestler, 0-3 overall, look to improve their overall record today against Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University Spartans. The Yellow Jackets are led by returning starters **Jeremy Dombrady** at 125 pounds, **Phil Payne** at 133 pounds, **Eric Schubert** at 141 pounds, **Korey Leonhard** at 157 pounds and Ohio Athletic Conference champion and NCAA Division III national qualifier **Andrew Scavuzzo** at 174 pounds.

B-W is coached by veteran Head Coach Rich Fleming, who began his 22nd season at B-W and 42nd overall this season and welcomes back 10 lettermen and six starters from his team of a year ago. The Yellow Jackets entered the season picked fifth in the Ohio Athletic Conference wrestling Coaches poll for both the OAC dual match format and at the 2010 OAC Championship Tournament on February 20 at Mount Union College.

In addition to today's B-W Dual Meet, the Yellow Jackets will host OAC foe Wilmington College on January 5 at 7:30 p.m., perennial Division III national power Central College of Iowa on Jan. 7 at 1:00 p.m., Mt. Union on Jan. 26 at 7:30 p.m., the 24th Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament on Feb. 6 at 10:00 a.m. and cross-town rival John Carroll University on Feb. 9 at 7:30 p.m.

Case Western Reserve University is coached by Head Coach Bob Del Rosa in his 32nd season as wrestling coach. Del Rosa has served as head coach of football, baseball, tennis, and wrestling in his 48-year career at Case Western Reserve University and is a Division III Wrestling Hall of Fame inductee.

The Spartans have only competed in one tournament so far this season at Messiah (Pa.) College, finishing seventh out of nine teams with a score of 37.5 points. Case Western was led by sophomore 157-pounder Isaac Dukes who won the 157-pound weight class with a 4-0 record. Sophomore Cale Harter at 285 pounds finished in third place, winning the consolation bracket for the heavyweights with a 4-1 record.

In last season's B-W vs. Case matchup, the Spartans defeated the Yellow Jacket, 26-20, in University Circle on November 25, 2009.

Highlighting the match for B-W was the first-ever collegiate win for current senior heavyweight **Terence Haynes**. **Haynes** won in a walk over. In addition to **Haynes**, Brian Bucher improved to 10-2 overall with a 14-2 win versus Case's Tim Sykes in the 133-pound class. At 165 pounds, graduate Joe Invcorvaia picked up a 4-0 victory versus Jacob Kornblatt and **Andrew Scavuzzo** recorded a pin at 2:59 of the match of CWRU's Evan Malone at 184 pounds.



Yellow Jackets Hosted B-W Quad Last Weekend

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team lost all three matches at the annual B-W Quad Tournament on Saturday, November 7, 2009 in the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium of the Lou Higgins Center. It was season-opener for the Yellow Jackets.

B-W lost to the College of Mount St. Joseph, 24-19, to Lycoming (Pa.) College, 29-15, and to Thiel (Pa.) College, 25-12.

For the Yellow Jackets, junior 174-pound defending Ohio Athletic Conference champ and 2009 NCAA Division III national qualifier **Andrew Scavuzzo (Cuyahoga Falls/ Woodridge)** and sophomore 285-pounder **Ryan Jones (Uniontown/ Lake)** led the way by each finishing 3-0 and junior 133-pounder **Phillip Payne (Orange Village/ Orange)** and 157-pounder **Korey Leonhard (Kinsman/ Pymatuning Valley)** each were 2-1.

In the first match versus MSJ, B-W winners were **Payne** by pin, **Leonard** and **Scavuzzo** each by decision and Jones by forfeit. In addition, both freshman 133-pounder **Danny Huffman (Maple Heights)** and sophomore 157-pounder **Tim Levitsky (Parma/ Senior)** each won by pin in exhibition matches.

In the loss to Lycoming, **Payne, Leonard** and **Scavuzzo** all won by decision and **Jones** pinned his opponent. In exhibition matches, both **Huffman** and **Levitsky** again pinned their opponents.

In the defeat to Thiel, sophomore 125-pounder **Jeremy Dombrady (Copley)** won by decision, senior 141-pounder **Eric Schubert (Oberlin)** won in overtime, **Scavuzzo** won his third straight decision and **Jones** completed a perfect day by winning by decision.
