

How B-W's Other 2002-2003 Winter Sports Teams Are Doing



Men's Basketball

The Yellow Jacket men's basketball team, 12-12 overall and 8-9 in the OAC, hosted its final regular season game this afternoon against Otterbein College. The 2003 OAC Tournament begins on Monday. The Yellow Jackets will be the sixth-seed and will not open play until Wednesday against an opponent and at a site yet to be determined. Prior to today's game, senior forward **Shawn McCormick (Massillon Jackson)** led the team in scoring with 20.3 ppg. and had just moved into third place on the all-time Yellow Jacket scoring list with more than 1,850 points. Next weekend, B-W will serve as the host site of both the OAC men's and women's basketball Final Four. Games on Friday are at 1:00 p.m., 3:15 p.m., 5:30 p.m. and 7:45 p.m. The women's championship game is on Saturday at 5:30 p.m. and the men's tipoff is slated for 30 minutes after the women's final.

Women's Basketball

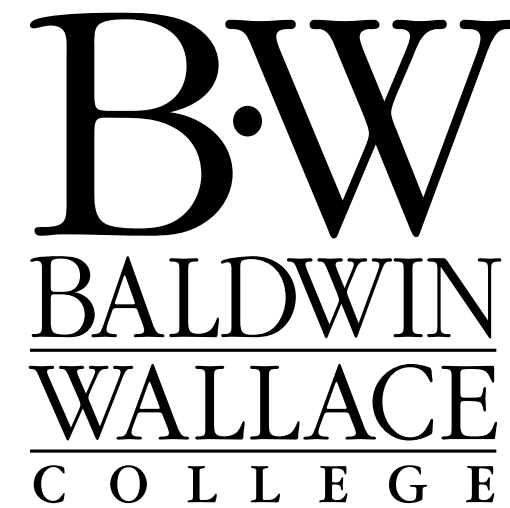
The Yellow Jacket women's basketball team, 21-3 overall and 14-3 in the OAC, played at Otterbein this afternoon. The 20-plus victories marks the seventh straight year that the B-W women have won 20 or more games. In that time, the Yellow Jackets have a 168-28 record and an .858 winning percentage. To date, B-W is led in scoring and rebounding by senior two-time All-OAC forward **Holly Koepf (Lorain Catholic)** with 11.9 points and 7.9 rebounds per game. The B-W women will open OAC tourney play on Tuesday at home at 7:30 p.m.

Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving

This afternoon a select group from themen's and women's swimming and diving team traveled to Case Western Reserve University to compete in the CWRU National Qualifying Meet. Two weeks ago, the women's swim team placed second and the men fourth at the OAC Championship Meet at JCU. Individually, junior diver **Kristen Demby (Westlake)** won the one and three-meter titles and was the women's *Diver of the Year*. Also, junior **Maryanda Yocum (Canal Winchester/ Pickerington)** won the 100 and 200-yard backstroke titles, sophomore **Kristen Showalter (Bowling Green)** won the 200-yard butterfly crown and sophomore **Keith DeVore (Mansfield/ Ontario)** won the 200-yard breaststroke.

Men's and Women's Indoor Track and Field

On Friday, the Yellow Jacket men's and women's indoor track and field teams hosted the annual Greater Cleveland College Meet in the B-W Rec Center Fieldhouse and on the Harrison Dillard Track. It was the fifth meet of the winter and fourth that B-W has hosted. In addition, today a select group of Yellow Jacket competitors traveled to Ypsilanti, Michigan and Eastern Michigan University to compete at an open, national qualifying meet. Next weekend, B-W will host the OAC Indoor Track & Field Championships Meet as a part of the OAC Winter Championships Festival. Action will begin at 2:00 p.m. on Friday and at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday. B-W will also host the B-W Qualifier on Friday, March 7 at 5:45 p.m.

Baldwin-Wallace College Hosts Cross-Town Rival Case Western Reserve University on Seniors' Night

BEREA, OHIO -- Tonight, the Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team will play host to OAC and Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University on Seniors' Night in Berea. This is the final home dual match of the season.

The Yellow Jackets enter tonight's dual with CWRU with a 7-6 overall and 2-4 Ohio Athletic Conference record and last competed on Tuesday, Feb. 11, when they were beaten by OAC rival Mount Union College, 23-14, in Alliance.

Despite the dual match loss to MUC, freshman 125-pounder **Jared Selover**, junior 165-pounder **Joe Heiland**, freshman 174-pounder **Roger Roman** and freshman 197-pounder **Devin Carman** all won by decision.

Statistical Leaders -- After 10 weeks of competition, **Jared Selover** and **Joe Heiland** are tied for the most victories with 28 each. **Selover** is 28-6 with a .8xxx winning percentage and **Heiland** is 28-7 with an .800 winning percentage. **Jeff Varney** is third in wins with 22 and is 22-12 overall. **Devin Carman** is fourth with 21 wins and is 21-6 overall. Senior heavyweight **Greg Hartlaub (Avon Lake)** is fifth in wins with 20 and is 20-5 with an .800 winning percentage. Junior 141-pounder **Sayre Wuhr (Hudson)**, who has been out with an injury, is sixth in wins with 14 and is at 14-4 overall and sophomore 174-pounder **Sterling Sebek (Columbus, Ga./ Brookstone)** is 10-4. **Heiland** has the most takedowns with 102 and **Selover** is second with 68. **Selover** also has the most escapes with 42. Freshman 149/ 157-pounder **Phillip Peak (Collinsville, Okla./ Collinsville)** has the most reversals with 12. **Selover** has the most near falls with 28. **Hartlaub** has the most falls with 9.

2003 OAC Tourney is at B-W Next Week

It is part of the 2003 OAC Winter Championships Festival at B-W that weekend. In addition to wrestling, the OAC Final Four for men's and women's basketball and the two-day OAC Indoor Track & Field Championship Meet all will take place at B-W. Wrestling will begin at 9:00 a.m.

falls is tied for second on the team. In addition, Brian has 19 takedowns, 12 escapes, and three reversals. He competed as a backup at 197 pounds as a freshman in 1999-2000. He compiled a 8-10 overall record and his top showing was a fourth place finish at the Case Western Reserve University Claud Sharer Tournament. As a sophomore in 2000-2001, he competed in the 197 pound weight class where he posted a 6-11 overall record as well as two pins. As a junior in 2001-2002, Brian was B-W's starting 184-pounder and compiled a 6-21 record. For his career, Brian has a 30-53 record.

Jeff Varney (Chagrin Falls, Ohio/ Kenston High School)

Jeff Varney, a business administration major, has been the starting 133-pounder since coming to B-W two years ago after spending his first two years in college at local Cuyahoga County Community College. Entering tonight's match with CWRU, Varney has a 38-21 career record and is expected to be one of the top 133-pounders at next week's OAC Tournament in Berea.

As a junior in 2001-2002, Jeff compiled a 15-9 record with 30 takedowns, 27 escapes, three reversals and a pin. This season, he has a 22-12 record with four falls. He has dominated the competition and has provided exceptional leadership for the Yellow Jackets.

Greg Hartlaub (Avon Lake, Ohio/ Avon Lake High School)

Greg Hartlaub, a sport management major, is also competing in his second season of wrestling at B-W after spending his first two years at Cuyahoga Community College. This season, Greg is competing at heavyweight but will not wrestle tonight due to an injury. He is expected to return to wrestle next weekend at the OAC Tournament. He enters tonight's Seniors' Night dual with CWRU with a career record of 32-13 with 11 falls.

A year ago as the starting 197-pounder, Hartlaub had a 12-8 record with two falls despite missing a good portion of the end of the season due to an injury. This season, Greg moved to heavyweight and has been one of the top wrestlers at that weight in the OAC. To date, Greg has compiled a 20-5 record with a team-leading nine falls. In addition, he has 20 takedowns, 14 escapes and a reversal.
