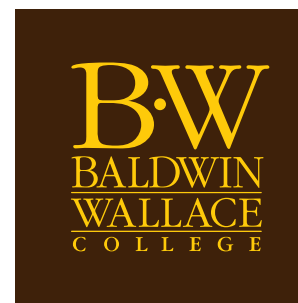

## Facilities Are a Key at B-W: the Lou Higgins Center and Fieldhouse

B-W is proud of its Lou Higgins Center.

The Lou Higgins Center was named in the Fall of 2005 following a renovation and addition to the building. It is one of the finest small college facilities in the country for a Division III school.

A concession stand and restrooms are available to the fans visiting today's John Summa Invitational Wrestling Tournament. Both the concession stand and the men's and women's restrooms are located in the front lobby of the Lou Higgins Center.

The Lou Higgins Center is home to the Yellow Jacket men's and women's basketball and wrestling teams during the winter. The Lou Higgins Center Fieldhouse allows B-W to sponsor a fine invitational tournament such as today's Summa.

The Higgins Center also features the 200-meter Harrison Dillard Track which surrounds the Fieldhouse area, both a natilus and free weight room, a state-of-the-art dance studio, the B-W Natatorium and six-lane 25-yard pool, seven racquetball courts, two athletic training rooms complete with rehabilitative equipment and numerous locker rooms.

In addition to the Ursprung Gym and the Fieldhouse, the Higgins Center features offices for the Division of Health and Physical Education, Sport Management and Sports Medicine as well as Athletic Department staff, personnel and coaches and the Higgins Center staff.

## Yellow Jacket Winter Sports Report

### Women's Basketball

The Yellow Jackets, 16-4 overall and in first place in the Ohio Athletic Conference at 12-1, hosts arch rival Capital University this afternoon at 3:00 p.m. B-W is looking to win its 12th straight game. Fans can listen to that game **LIVE** on the Internet at [www.wbwc.com](http://www.wbwc.com).

To date, junior All-OAC forward **Amanda Schroeder (Columbus Grove)** tops the team in scoring at 13.6 points-per-game with 22 three-pointers. Senior All-OAC center **Ariel Brough (Powell/Olentangy)** is averaging 10.7 ppg. and 7.0 rebounds-per-game and leads the OAC with 48 blocked shots.

### Men's Basketball

The Yellow Jackets, 12-8 overall and 7-6 in the OAC, is at Capital today for a 3:00 p.m. game. Fans can listen to that game **LIVE** on campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, and via the Internet at [www.wbwc.com](http://www.wbwc.com).

To date, B-W is led by sophomore guard **Promis Cabbil (Elyria/Senior)** at 11.5 ppg. and 4.7 assists-per-game. Junior guard Zane Meeder (Erie, Pa./ Fairview) is second on the team in scoring at 11.3 ppg.

### Indoor Track

The indoor track teams competed last night at the Oberlin College Invitational Meet in Oberlin. This was the third meet of the season for the Yellow Jackets.

Last weekend, the B-W women placed fourth and the men were sixth at the annual OAC Relay Meet in Berea on the Harrison Dillard Track in the Lou Higgins Center. For the men, All-OAC throwers senior **Greg Patrick (Collins/Western Reserve)** and junior **Kevin Phipps (Reynoldsburg/Watkins Memorial)** combined to set meet records in the shot put and weight throw relay en route to being named OAC *Field Athletes of the Week*. For the women, junior All-OAC runner **Kim Chinn (Zanesville/West Muskingum)** and sophomore **Julie Kotesovec (Litchfield/Medina Buckeye)** were a part of two first-place relay squads.

### Swimming and Diving

The swimming and diving teams will next compete at the 2010 OAC Championship Meet on Thursday-Saturday, February 18-20, at the University of Akron's Ocacek Natatorium.

Two weekends ago, the teams lost to both Allegheny (Pa.) College and OAC-rival John Carroll University despite the outstanding performances by four-time NCAA Division III All-American diver **Todd Richert (North Royalton)** and freshman diver **Julie Pinter (Broadview Heights/Brecksville-Broadview Heights)**. Each won all four diving events and **Pinter** was named the OAC *Swimming & Diving Athlete of the Week* for her performance.

## Yellow Jacket Head Coach Rich Fleming



**BEREA, OHIO** -- Rich Fleming is in his 22nd season of coaching the wrestlers at Baldwin-Wallace College.

Coach Fleming is committed to having championship wrestling at the College and keeping the Yellow Jackets a power in the Ohio Athletic Conference and at the NCAA Division III level. During his B-W coaching career, Coach Fleming has tutored 34 wrestlers to the Division III National Tournament, including 1989 NCAA Division

III 177-pound national champion Kevin Higgins and two national runners-up, including current assistant coach Bryan Kmetz.

During the past nine years, B-W has placed second at the OAC Championship Tournament three times, been nationally ranked during five seasons and produced six Division III All-Americans. Three seasons ago (2006-2007), Fleming's team peaked at the right time as it placed second at the 21st Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament, second at the OAC Tournament with three individual

champions and was the top Ohio college team at the Division III National Tournament.

Coach Fleming is the second winningest wrestling coach in school history and trails only B-W, Greater Cleveland and Ohio wrestling coaching legend John Summa. Coach Fleming has been a winner his entire life.

As a wrestler, Coach Fleming learned that it takes hard work to become a champion. His 123-pound Mid-American Conference title while at Miami of Ohio is evidence of that work ethic. That same work ethic governs B-W wrestling.

Coach Fleming is a 1963 graduate of Miami of Ohio and earned his master's degree from Cleveland State University in 1985. Prior to coming to B-W, he spent 18 years building a powerful program at nearby Parma Senior High School. Coach Fleming is retired as a teacher and has dedicated his time to building the Yellow Jacket program into one of the best in Division III.

Coach Fleming and his wife Linda reside in Sagamore Hills and have two grown daughters.
