

How B-W's Other 2002-2003 Winter Sports Teams Are Doing



Men's Basketball

The Yellow Jacket men's basketball team, 7-4 overall and 3-1 in the OAC, will host conference rival Ohio Northern University tomorrow in Ursprung Gymnasium. This will be the men's first game since its trip to Phoenix, Arizona, where B-W competed in the annual Cactus Hoop Jam Tournament. The men went 1-2 on the trip, including an 83-59 win against Edgewood (Wisc.). For the three-game tournament, senior three-time All-OAC forward **Shawn McCormick (Massillon Jackson)** scored 85 points and led all players in scoring. During **McCormick's** 85 point outburst at the Cactus Hoop Jam, he scored 30 points in the consolation game against Ramapo, which now gives him 1,569 for his career. Up next for **McCormick** is Shelley Waters (1978-82) with 1,627 career points. The men are also home this Saturday when they play Capital University at 3:00 p.m.

Women's Basketball

The 10th-ranked Yellow Jackets women's basketball team, 10-1 overall and 3-1 in the OAC, will travel to Ada to play OAC rival Ohio Northern University. This will be the women's first game since they won the championship at the 2002 Surf & Slam Tournament in San Diego, California. The women defeated host Point Loma Nazarene University, 55-47, to claim the tournament title. Senior two-time All-OAC forward **Holly Koepp (Lorain Catholic)** was the tournament *Most Valuable Player* and senior All-OAC guard **Natalie Winkelfoos (Bucyrus)** was also named to the all-tournament team.

Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving

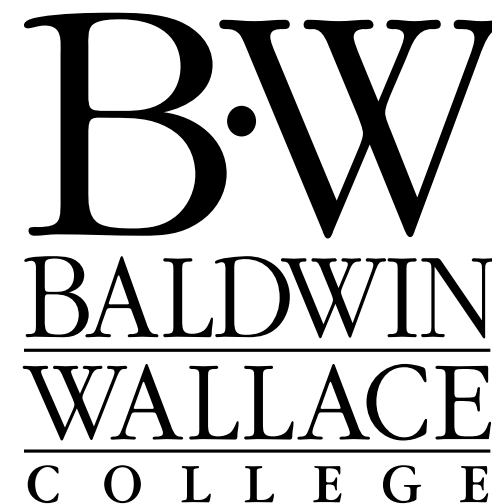
The Yellow Jacket's swimming teams will The men's and women's swimming and diving team traveled to West Palm Beach, Florida for their annual winter training. The team will remain in Florida from January 1-8. The women are off to a solid start with a 5-4 overall record and are 2-1 in the Ohio Athletic Conference. Both teams will then return home to host Bethany (W. Va.) at the B-W Natatorium in the Recreation Center on Saturday, January 11, at 1:00 p.m.

Men's and Women's Indoor Track and Field

The indoor track and field teams do not open the 2003 season until January 24. The Yellow Jacket women are seeking a 16th OAC title and the men are expected to battle for OAC honors as well. Individual champions **Lynn Katanik (Parma/ Padua)** in the 1500 meters, **Nicole Drouhard (Austintown Fitch)** in the 5000 meters and **Tatum Gruskiewicz (Pymatuning Valley)** in the 500 meter dash all return. B-W hosts the 2003 OAC Championship Meet on February 28-March 1.

Fall Sports Honors & Awards

The Yellow Jackets had an outstanding fall sports season. Headlining the list of fall honorees are OAC *Cross Country Coach of the Year* **Dr. Bill Taraschke** and OAC *Runner of the Year* **Jessica Textoris (Akron/ Medina Highland)**. **Taraschke** was also named Ohio Intercollegiate *Coach of the Year* and **Textoris** as the *Women's Runner of the Year*. In volleyball, senior **Kate Kost (Fairview Park)** was named as the OAC *Libero of the Year*. In women's soccer, junior **Amanda Avram (Kirtland/ Villa Angela - St. Joseph)** was named as the OAC *Goalie of the Year* for the second straight season. In football, **Head Coach John Snell** was the OAC *Co-Coach of the Year*, junior safety **Greg Koch (Olmsted Falls)** earned second-team *Football Gazette* and honorable mention Hewlett-Packard All-American honors and senior center **Matt Kish (Brook Park/ Midpark)** and junior guard **Joe Harbour (Upper Sandusky)** were *Verizon Academic All-America* first and second-team picks, respectively.

18th-Ranked Baldwin-Wallace College Hosts Wilmington in the first OAC Match Since Winter Break

BEREA, OHIO -- The 18th-ranked Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team will look to continue its strong early performance when it hosts Ohio Athletic Conference rival Wilmington College tonight. B-W's overall dual record is 4-0 overall and 1-0 in the OAC.

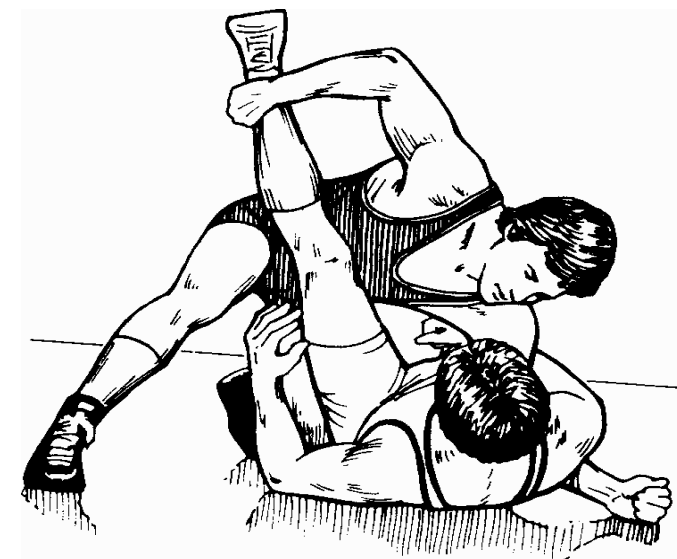
The Yellow Jackets are coming off an impressive team title at last Saturday's Heidelberg College Invitational Tournament. Highlighting the meet was freshman **Jared Selover** who was named as the tournament's *Most Valuable Wrestler*. **Selover** had a 3-0 record, including a 10-2 win against Heidelberg's Dustin McClintock in the championship match.

In addition to **Selover**, the other two individual champion were freshman 197-pounder **Devin Carman**, who also had a 3-0 mark, and senior heavyweight **Greg Hartlaub**, who had a 4-0 record. Placing second were junior 141-pounder **Sayre Wuhr** and junior 165-pounder **Joe Heiland**. Finishing third were sophomore 149-pounder **Scott Conrath**, freshman 184-pounder **T. Terry** and backup 197-pounder **Brian Tipka**. Also placing fourth were senior 133-pounder **Jeff Varney** and junior 174-pounder **Dan DiSalvo**.

After four weeks of competition, **Selover** tops the team with 17 victories, a 17-1 record and a .944 winning percentage. **Hartlaub** is second with 14 wins and a 14-4 overall record. His .778 winning percentage ranks third. The duo of **Wuhr** and **Heiland** are tied for third with 13 victories. **Carman** is fifth with 12 wins and has the second-best winning percentage at .857. Other solid records include sophomore 174-pounder **Sterling Sebek** at 10-4, **Varney** at 11-7, **Tipka** at 8-3, **Conrath** at 7-4 and **T. Terry** at 9-6 overall. Individually, **Heiland** has the most takedowns with 39 and **Selover** is second with 34. **T. Terry** has the most escapes with 22. Freshman 133-pounder **Mike Munroe** has the most reversals with eight and **Selover** is second with six. **Wuhr** has the most near falls with 18 and is followed by **Tipka** with 17. **Hartlaub** has the most pins with seven and both **Selover** and **Carman** have four each.
