Men's and Women's Cross Country

The men's and women's cross country teams have completed the regular season and are back in action next Saturday, Nov. 14 when they travel to Rose-Hulman Ind.

to compete at the 2009 NCAA Division III Great Lakes Regional Meet at Terre Haute Ind. Fans also are reminded that B-W is the host school for the 2009 NCAA Division III National Championship Meet on Saturday, Nov. 21 at the Highland Hills Golf Course in Highland Heights, Ohio. The women race at 11:00 a.m. and the men run at 12:00 noon.

Last Saturday, B-W competed at the OAC Championship Meet in Wilmington with the women placing first with 37 points and the men placing fifth with 122 points. With the win, the women captured the 16th OAC Championship in program history (since the OAC began women's championships in 1985).

Individually, the women placed six runners in the Top-13 and each one earned All-OAC honors. Leading the way was senior 2008 OAC *Co-Runner of the Year* **D'Arcy Hlavin (Berea)** who placed third. She was followed in the top-nine and on the All-OAC team by junior **Kim Chinn (Zanesville/ West Muskingum)** in fifth place and freshman **Sarah Rospert (Milan/ Edison)** in eighth place. In addition, junior **Karin Coyne (Columbia Station/ Columbia)**, who placed 10th, junior **Katie White (Berea)**, who placed 11th, and junior **Krysten Kovach (North Royalton/ Parma Padua)**, who placed 13th), all received honorable mention All-OAC honors.

Men's Soccer

The men's soccer team had a 13-6-1 overall record and finished tied for second during the OAC regular season at 7-1-1 prior to playing an OAC Tournament semifinal match at Capital University on Thursday (Nov. 5). The results of the B-W vs. Capital match were not available at the time this program was printed, but they can be found on the OAC website at www.oac.org.

The Yellow Jackets won their first-ever home OAC playoff game on Tuesday (Nov. 3) with a 1-0 win against cross-town rival John Carroll University. Freshman forward **Justin Peterson (Rochester Hills.Mich./ Adams)** scored his first career goal on a header via a fine pass/ cross from senior sweeper **Nate Smith (Ashland/ Senior)**. The winner of Thursday's semifinal match advanced to today's OAC Championship Game versus the winner of the Ohio Northern University

The men's soccer team has had four players receive OAC *Player of the Week* honors, including senior goalie **Russ Mika (Medina/ Senior)**, junior forward **Tyler Leister (Stow/ Stow-Munroe Falls)**, sophomore forward **Carlin Vandendriessche (Medina/ Senior)** and freshman midfielder **Pat Brennan (Akron/ Walsh Jesuit)**, and two, **Mika** and junior midfielder **Jeff Grater (Stow/ Stow-Munroe Falls)**, earn *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-District IV accolades.

In addition, B-W entered the Capital match ranked fifth in the NCAA Division III Great Lakes Region. It is believed that a win at Capital may lead to an NCAA Division III National Tournament At-Large berth. It would be B-W's first-ever NCAA tourney appearance....

Football

The football team, 2-6 overall and 2-5 in the Ohio Athletic Conference, hosts Wilmington College today at 1:30 across the street in The George Finnie Stadium. It is Seniors' Day and 17 Yellow Jacket senior football student-athletes and their parents will be acknowledged prior to the game. The four senior captains are quarterback **Anthony Gardner (Rocky River/ Lakewood St. Edward)**, cornerback/ safety **Ryan Clokey (Massillon/ Perry)**, middle linebacker **Paul Burger (Mentor)** and offensive tackle **Brett Scarl (North Olmsted)**.

Fans can listen to that game locally on campus radio station WBWC, 88.3 FM, and via the WBWC web site at www.wbwc.com. Last Saturday, the Yellow Jackets lost at Ohio Northern University in Ada.

Today's football game also is being taped and will air tomorrow on SportsTime Ohio (www.sportstimeohio.com) at 12:00 noon and again on Monday at 6:00 a.m.

The Brown & Gold close out the football season at Capital University next Saturday at 1:30.

Women's Soccer

The women's soccer team finished its season at 6-12-2 overall and 2-7 in the Ohio Athletic Conference. Offensively, the women were led by senior two-time All-OAC first-team sweeper **Stephanie Geiger (Berea)** with five goals and one assist for 11 points.

Two Yellow Jackets received *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-District IV honors. The two awards went to **Geiger** and senior defender **Tyler Fridley (Niles/ McKinley)**. **Geiger**, who also was a second-team All-Region selection and is a two-time Academic All-OAC choice, also received an OAC *Player of the Week* honors earlier this fall.

Women's Volleyball

The volleyball team finished its season at 5-24 overall and 2-7 in the OAC and ended on a strong note by winning two of its final three matches, including a 3-0 shutout of Wilmington in its final match. This is a very young team that was without a senior on its roster.

Offensively, the women were lead in kills by **Abby Thompson (Lorain/ Clearview)** with 206 and **Casey Passen (Ashville/ Teays Valley)** was this season's assist leader with 559. Defensively, the Yellow Jackets were lead by **Natalie Emmons (Ashland/ Senior)**

with 427 digs.

Men's Golf

The men's golf team ended its fall season with a 27-11 record and was led by five players who averaged less than 80 strokes per 18-hole round. Senior two-time All-OAC player **Nick Bryan (Zanesville/ Rosecrans)** led the way with a 76.25 stroke average in four tournaments and eight total rounds. He was followed by junior **Matt Weiss (Concord/ Mentor)** at 76.50, senior All-OAC player **Mike Falk (Strongsville)** at 76.63, freshman **Stephen Spalding (Stow/ Walsh Jesuit)** at 76.83 and junior **Cory Swaisgood (Fremont/ St. Joseph Central Catholic)** at 79.63.

The Yellow Jacket golfers will resume their schedule this spring when they travel to Florida in March during the annual sprng break.

Women's Golf

The women's golf team ended its fall season on October fourth at the Gannon University Fall Invitational at Lakeshore C.C. in Erie, Pa. and finished the fall with an overall record of 8-19. This is another extremely young team that does not boast a senior on its roster. In fact the top two stroke average leaders for the fall are freshmen.

Leading the way was **Brooke Hamilton (Cleveland/ St. Joseph Academy)** with a 91.56 average for five tournaments and nine rounds of 18 holes. She was followed by **Rebecca Kapusta (Independence)** at 97.11, junior **Nicole Carlone (Canton/ St. Thomas Aquinas)** at 100.89 and junior **Sam Migaski (Manahawkin, N.J. (Southern Regional))** at 105.0.

The women will resume play with their spring season when they also travel south for spring break.

Men's and Women's Tennis

The women's tennis team, 12-7 overall last year and OAC runner-up, has won two of the last three OAC crowns and qualified for the NCAA Division III National Tournament in both 2007 and 2008.

This fall, the ladies competed in two tournaments and were led by senior **Andrea Essig (Ashtabula/ Edgewood)** and juniors **Emily Pelosi (Uniontown/ Lake)** and **Katy Marshall (Medina/ Senior)** all with 2-1 marks.

The men's team, 19-5 overall last season and an OAC semifinalist, taveled to Oberlin, Ohio this fall to compete at the Oberlin Invitational Tournament.

Both teams wil resume their schedules on ther annual sprng break trip to Hilton Head, South Carolina.

Men's and Women's Swimming and Diving

The men's (1-1 overall and 1-0 in the OAC) and women's (0-2 overall, 0-1 OAC) swimming and diving teams compete today at the Penn State Behrend tri meet at 1:00 p.m. This is the fourth week of competition for the swimmers and divers.

This Monday (Nov. 2), junior **Ryan Musille (Canton/ GlenOak)** was named as the OAC *Men's Swimmer of the Week* for his performance last Saturday when he won two events and swam on a winning relay team in a dual meet win versus Wilmington in Berea.

The swimmers and divers are home next Saturday, Nov. 14 to compete against Washington & Jefferson (Pa.) College at 1:00 p.m.

Men's Basketball

The men's basketball team opens the 2009-2010 season on Monday, Nov. 16 when it hosts cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University at 6:30 p.m. in the Ursprung Gymnasium of the Lou Higgins Center.

Look for returning All-OAC forward **Kyle Brown (Strongsville)** to lead the way. He averaged 11.3 points and 5.0 rebounds per game desite missing fve games with injury and playing many others while being hampered.

BW also is home on Nov. 23 to play Division II Geneva (Pa.) at 7:30 p.m. Both the Dec. 2 game versus John Carroll and the February 20, 2010 contest versus Otterbein College will be broadcast on SportsTimeOhio.

Women's Basketball

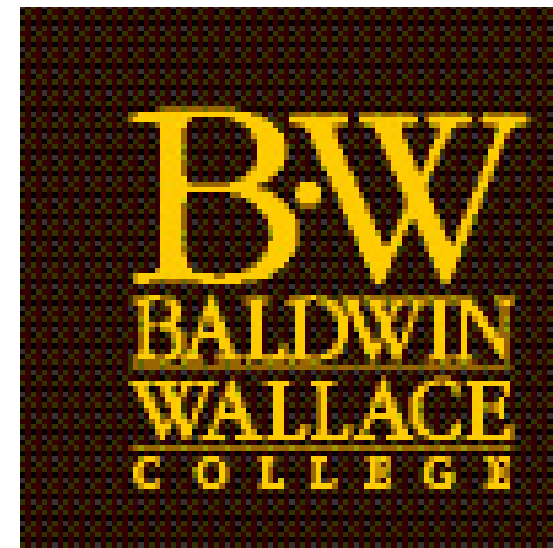
The women's basketball team is coming off a 22-8 record and advancing to the second round of the NCAA Division III National Tournament. The women open the season at the University of Rochester (N.Y.) Tournament versus Williams (Mass.) College and play home games on Nov. 24 versus CWRU and Wilmington on Nov. 26.

Look for junior All-OAC forward **Amanda Schroeder (Columbus Grove)** and senior two-time Academic All-OAC center **Ariel Brough (Olentangy-Liberty)** to lead the way. **Schroeder** scored 13.1 ppg. and grabbed 3.8 rpg. **Brough** scored 8.9 ppg., grabbed 7.6 rpg. and set a single-season school-record with 80 blocked shots.

Indoor Track & Field

The 2010 indoor track season begins on Friday, January 23 when B-W hosts the Mid-January Meet on the Harrison Dillard Track in the Higgins Center. It is one of four home meets this winter.

The Yellow Jackets Open the 2009-2010 Season By Hosting the B-W Quad Meet Today at the Lou Higgins Center

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team will seek to both build depth and momentum during the 2009-2010 season. Veteran Head Coach Rich Fleming, who begins his 21st season at B-W, welcomes back 10 lettermen and six starters from his team of a year ago. The Yellow Jackets enter the season picked fifth in the Ohio Athletic Conference Wrestling Coaches poll for both the OAC dual match format and at the 2010 OAC Championship Tournament on February 20 at Mount Union College.

In addition to today's B-W Quad Meet, the Yellow Jackets will host OAC foe Wilmington College on January 5 at 7:30 p.m., perennial Division III national power Central College of Iowa on Jan. 7 at 1:00 p.m., Mt. Union on Jan. 26 at 7:30 p.m., the 24th Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament on Feb. 6 at 10:00 a.m. and cross-town rival John Carroll University on Feb. 9 at 7:30 p.m.

The returning starters are sophomore Jeremy Dombrady at 125 pounds, junior Phil Payne at 133 pounds, senior Eric Schubert at 141 pounds, junior Korey Leonhard at 157 pounds, junior 2009 Ohio Athletic Conference champion and NCAA Division III national qualifier Andrew Scavuzzo at 174 pounds and senior 285-pounder Terence Haynes. The other returning lettermen, all who started a year ago at one point or another, include sophomore 141-pounder Grant Steward, sophomore 157-pounder Tim Levitsky, sophomore 165-pounder Mike Hosta and junior 197-pounder Cody Quick.

Dombrady, who didn't join the team until after the winter break period, posted five wins as a freshman. He had 13 takedowns. He looks to improve this winter as an experienced sophomore at 125.

Payne, who was injured much of last season, returns after wrestling at 141 pounds and posting three wins as sophomore. This year, he will compete in the 133-weight class and compete with freshman Danny Huffman for mat time. Today, Payne will get the start as Huffman is currently injured.

At 141 pounds, both Schubert and Steward have experience and will battle each other for a starting position. Schubert had a 6-12 mark a year ago and 6-17 overall and Steward was 2-9. Steward will not wrestle today due to an injury.

The 149-weight class is held by freshman Zander Habash and either Schubert or Steward can step up a weight class if necessary.

Levitsky moves up to 157 pounds this winter and Leonhard moves down to face off to earn starting rights. As a freshman, Levitsky competed at 141 pounds and posted three takedowns. Leonhard competed at 184 and 174 as a junior with an overall record of 7-15. He should be much better suited to compete at 157.

Freshman Joe Georgian will compete with Hosta at 165 pounds. In addition, Hosta can compete up at either 174 and 184. A year ago, he had a 2-8 slate, splitting time between 165 and 174.

Scavuzzo will compete at 174 pounds and is still extremely competitive at 184. He won the 174-pound title at the OAC Tournament and earned the right to compete at the 2009 NCAA Division III National Championships. He posted an overall record of 24-11 and was 6-0 in OAC duals. The Yellow Jackets will look to Scavuzzo for leadership and experience on the mats this winter.

Look for junior Cody Quick to be the 197-pounder. A year ago, moved around the lineup and wrestled at 165, 197 and 285. He had an overall mark of 1-10.

At 285 pounds, sophomore Ryan Jones, who did not wrestle a year ago but played football, will seek mat time with Haynes.

Haynes competed in his first season of wrestling as a junior at the age of 46 after returning to finish his college degree. His story was much-celebrated a year ago by ESPN on its show E:60 and can be viewed on-line at www.bw.edu/athletics/wr/features/08_09/haynes_e60/. He finished the season 2-13 overall with three takedowns. Haynes will not compete today as he is still recovering from a preseason injury that required surgery. Jones will start.

Head Wrestling Coach Rich Fleming

Rich Fleming is in his 22nd season of coaching the wrestlers at Baldwin-Wallace College in 2009-2010. Coach Fleming is committed to having championship wrestling at the College and keeping the Yellow Jackets a power in the Ohio Athletic Conference and at the NCAA Division III level.

During his B-W coaching career, Coach Fleming has tutored 35 wrestlers to the Division III National Tournament, including 1989 NCAA Division III 177-pound national champion Kevin Higgins and two national runners-up, including current assistant coach Bryan Kmetz.

During the past eight years, B-W has placed second at the OAC Championship Tournament three times, been nationally ranked during five seasons and produced six Division III All-Americans. Three seasons ago (2006-2007), Fleming's team peaked at the right time as it placed second at the 21st Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament, second at the OAC Tournament with three individual champions and was the top Ohio College team at the Division III National Tournament

Coach Fleming is the second winningest wrestling coach in school history and trails only B-W, Greater Cleveland and Ohio wrestling coaching legend John Summa. Coach Fleming has been a winner his entire life. As a wrestler, Coach Fleming learned that it takes hard work to become a champion. His 123-pound Mid-American Conference title while at Miami of Ohio is evidence of that work ethic. That same work ethic governs B-W wrestling.

Coach Fleming is a 1963 graduate of Miami of Ohio and earned his master's degree from Cleveland State University in 1985. Prior to coming to B-W, he spent 18 years building a powerful program at nearby Parma Senior High School. Coach Fleming is retired as a teacher and has dedicated his time to building the Yellow Jacket program into one of the best in Division III.

Coach Fleming is assisted by former wrestlers Bryan Kmetz '07 and Joe Heiland '06.

Kmetz was a two-time OAC champion at 285 pounds, a Division III All-American and national runner-up in 2007 and a four-time All-OAC honoree who had a 90-16 mark as a collegian. He currently serves as a personal trainer.

Heiland also is a two-time OAC champion at 165 pounds (2003 and 2005), a two-time Div. III national qualifier and a three-time All-OAC honoree who had a 76-25 mark while at B-W. He currently is a professional Mixed Martial Arts performer who owns an undefeated record as a national welterweight.
