Yellow Jackets Host NAIA Foe Notre Dame Tonight

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College wrestling team, 5-4 overall, hosts Greater Cleveland cross-town foe Notre Dame College tonight, in the Ursprung Gymnasium. This is the final wrestling match of 2006 as the Yellow Jackets will be idle until January 3 when they travel to Ithaca, New York for the annual Ithaca College Tournament following Winter Break.

The Jackets' last competed on Tuesday (Dec. 5) when they defeated Ohio Athletic Conference rival Mount Union College, 21-18, in Alliance. Earning individual wins for B-W were **Eric Schubert** at 125 pounds, **Brian Bucher** at 133, **Joe Incorvaia** at 157, **Gino Russo** at 165, **Jeremy Feador** at 184 and **Mike Pelton** at 285 pounds. **Feador's** win was by pin, his team-leading third of the season.

After nine dual matches and one tournament, **Bucher** tops the team with 11 victories, 11 reversals and is tied with 149-pounder **Mo Salem** for the most near falls with 14 each. The trio of **Salem**, **Russo** and **Feador** are all tied for second with nine victories each and **Incorvaia** is next with six. **Russo** has the most takedowns with 24 and **Salem** is second in takedowns with 20 and first with 11 escapes. The quartet of **Bucher**, 141-pounder **RayShawn Eatmon**, **Salem** and 197-pounder **Tavis Sokolow** are all tied for second with two falls each. *The entire set of Yellow Jacket wrestling statistics is listed on the back outside cover of this program.*

To date, the Yellow Jackets have competed at the Case Western Reserve University Quad Meet, the Olivet (Mich.) College Duals, in OAC duals matches against preseason favorite Heidelberg College and versus Mt. Union and last weekend placed eighth of 15 teams at the annual Rochester Institute of Technology (N.Y.) Tournament. *Scores also are listed on the back outside cover of this program.*

Following Christmas and New Year's, B-W should be back at full strength as 285-pound national qualifier and 2006 OAC champion **Bryan Kmetz**, All-American 141-pounder **Jared Selover**, two-time high school all-american and 197-pounder **Paul Burger** and incoming 285-pounder **Kenny Jones** all will begin competition. For various reasons, all four will begin in January.

Fans are reminded that the 21st Annual John Summa Memorial Tournament is set for Saturday, February 3 in the Fieldhouse of The Lou Higgins Center. Yellow Jacket Winter Sports Notes

The Yellow Jacket Winter Overview

To date, every Yellow Jacket fall and winter team has had or currently owns a winning record. That is impressive. Following an outstanding fall season (see more below), the B-W winter sport teams also are playing well.

Women's Basketball Update

The third-ranked (WBCA poll) women's basketball team takes a 5-1 overall and 2-0 Ohio Athletic Conference record into its game tomorrow (Saturday, December 9) at home versus Ohio Northern University. The B-W women are the defending OAC regular season champs and advanced to the "Elite Eight" of the NCAA Division III National Tournament a year ago. They also were picked by the OAC Coaches to win the title again this winter.

The Men's Basketball Update

The men's basketball team is 3-2 overall and plays tomorrow at Ohio Northern University at 3:00 p.m. Fans can listen to that game on WBWC, 88.3 FM, or via the Internet at www.wbwc.com. A year ago, the B-W men won the OAC regular season and OAC Tournament titles for the first time in the same year in school history and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tourney. The Jackets' also were tabbed by the OAC Coaches to win the title again this winter.

The Swimming Update

The men's and women's swimming and diving teams are idle until each team travels to Florida for its annual training and meet against Florida International University. To date, both the men's and women's teams have compiled a 5-3 overall and perfect 2-0 OAC record.

The Indoor Track Update

The men's and women's track teams compete in their first meet of the season on January 20 when they host the annual Mid-January Meet on the Harrison Dillard Track in the fieldhouse of The Lou Higgins Center at 5:30 p.m. It is one four home meets this winter, including the OAC Relay Meet on January 27 at 11:00 a.m. and the Greater Cleveland College Indoor Championships on February 16 at 5:30 p.m.

B-W Enjoys Another Outstanding Fall Season in 2006

The volleyball team finished 26-7 overall and was the OAC regular season co-champion. Senior All-American setter **Angie Camp** (Norwalk/St. Paul) was B-W's first two-time All-American in volleyball and its first OAC *Player of the Year*. The men's soccer team finished 13-4-1 overall and was led by senior **Louie Rolko** (Hudson) who won his second straight OAC *Midfielder of the Year* award and *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-Americans in senior **Tommy Ehrnfelt** (Strongsville) and **Matt Pietro** (Canfield). The women's soccer team was 10-8 overall and had its third straight 10-win or more season. The football team was 7-3 overall and had its 39th winning season in the last 40 years and **Head Coach John Snell** was the OAC *Co-Coach of the Year* and junior punter **Kevin Solfkiancs** (Middleburg Hts./ Midpark) earned *ESPN THE MAGAZINE* Academic All-America honors. The men's cross country team had a winning record and placed fourth at the OAC Championships which was an improvement over 2005. The men's golf team had a 29-11 mark in the fall and won two invitational tournament titles and the women were 25-15-1 overall. Both teams have a great shot at winning OAC titles when their spring seasons resume in early March.
