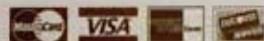

Fall Sports Report

BEREA, OHIO --The Baldwin-Wallace College fall sports teams are all of to a fantastic start with a 58-22 record and a .725 winning percentage so far.

The football team, 2-0 overall, returns to action this Saturday, September 24 when it hosts Ohio Athletic Conference rival Capital at 1:30 p.m. on Shriners Day. The Yellow Jackets are coming off a 35-20 victory against OAC-rival Heidelberg on Sept. 17.

The men's soccer team, 6-1 overall, plays host to Allegheny (Pa.) College tomorrow night at 7:00 p.m. The Yellow Jackets defeated Grove City (Pa.) College, 3-0, on Saturday for their sixth straight victory. Junior goalie **Ryan Hulings (Centerville)** recorded his seventh career shutout in the win. Senior forward **Carlin Vandendriessche (Medina)** needs one more goal to become the school's all-time leading goal scorer.

The volleyball team, 9-5 overall, opens OAC play as it hosts Capital University tomorrow night in the Ursprung Gymnasium of the Lou Higgins Center at 7:00 p.m. Last weekend, B-W played at DePauw (Ind.) University Invitational. Junior **Amanda Sawicki (Mentor/Lake Catholic)** leads the offense with 170 kills and junior **Natalie Emmons (Ashland)** anchors the defense with 294 digs. B-W is at the OAC-Heartland "Challenge" this weekend.

The men's golf team placed fifth at the OAC Fall Invitational last Friday in Ada. B-W was led by junior **Stephen Spalding (Stow/ Walsh Jesuit)** with a total score of 114 for 27 holes to place fourth place individually. The men's golf team plays again this upcoming Sunday and Monday (Sept. 25-26th) in the Mount Union Invitational.

The women's golf team placed second at the Wooster Invitational this past weekend. The Yellow Jackets were led by junior **Rebecca Kapusta (Independence)** who carded a round of 87. The women's golf team is back in action this Saturday-Sunday (Sept. 24-25th) when they will compete in the Heidelberg Fall Invitational at the Mohawk Golf and Country Club in Tiffin.

The men's and women's cross country teams competed in its third meet of the season at the Calvin (Mich.) College Invitational last Saturday. The men finished ninth of 18 schools and the women were fifth of 16 teams. Junior **Ken Janosko (Mentor)** led the men and placed seventh of 201 runners and junior **Sarah Rospert (Milan/Edison)** paced the women with a 22nd place finish. Both teams return to action on Saturday, Sept. 30 when they will compete in the All-Ohio Championships hosted by Cedarville University.

The men's tennis team, 2-0 overall, opened its fall season on Saturday as it posted, 8-1, victories over NAIA Division II Malone University and Franciscan University. The men's team is back in action this weekend as they will travel to St. Louis, Missouri to compete in the USTA/ITA Central Region Championships hosted by Washington University.

The women's tennis team, 0-1 overall, competed in the Oberlin Invitational Tournament this past weekend. The women's tennis team is back in action this Friday when they host cross-town rival Case Western Reserve on the Pop Collins Tennis Courts at 4:30 p.m.

Yellow Jacket Women's Soccer Team Hosts Case Western Reserve In Non-Conference Showdown

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College women's soccer team, 4-2 overall, plays host to Cleveland cross-town rival Case Western Reserve University, 4-1-1 overall, on Tressel Field at The George Finnie Stadium.

The Yellow Jackets come into the match with a two-match winning streak following non-conference wins last week against Hiram College and Grove City College of Pennsylvania. Last Tuesday, B-W defeated Hiram by a final score of 1-0 and closed the week with a 2-1 double overtime victory against Grove City (Pa.) on Saturday.

The Yellow Jackets are led by forward **Heather Keller** with a team-high-tying three goals and team-best three assists for nine points. Midfielder **Kayla Losco** has contributed a team-high-tying three goals for six points and forward **Brigitte Petrash** has tallied two goals for four points.

In net, B-W has used a trio of goalkeepers. Freshman **Gabrielle Bodo** has started in four games and has a record of 2-2. **Bodo** has recorded a team-best 16 saves while allowing five goals for a 1.43 goals-against-average. Sophomore **Kristina Mathur** and freshman **Claire LoPresti** have each appeared in two games with one start each. **Mathur** has a record of 1-0 with two saves and a 0.73 GAA and **LoPresti** is 1-0 and has tallied six saves and a 0.80 GAA.

Case Western Reserve comes into match after posting a record of 1-1 last week. The Spartans fell to Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll University by a score of 1-0 last Tuesday and defeated Otterbein University by a final of 2-0 last Saturday.

CWRU is led by Kendra Simmons with three goals and two assists for eight points and Rachel Bourque with two goals and one assist for five points.

Netminder Anna Kennedy anchors the defense. She has tallied 22 saves and allowed just one goal in six games for a 0.17 GAA.

The Yellow Jackets are back in action on Saturday, September 24 when they travel to New Wilmington, Pennsylvania to play the Titans of Westminster College in the second game of a men's and women's soccer doubleheader at 3:30 p.m. The men kickoff at 1:00 p.m.

The next home women's soccer match is on Tuesday, September 27 when it hosts St. Vincent (Pa.) College in the first game of a men's and women's soccer doubleheader at 4:30 p.m. The men host Mount St. Joseph at 7:00 p.m.
