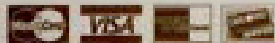

Yellow Jacket Sports Report

BEREA, OHIO --The Baldwin-Wallace College fall sports season is winding down. The 10 Yellow Jacket fall teams have a combined 158-77 record with a solid .672 winning percentage entering tonight's action. Nine of our 10 teams have winning record with four of the teams having completed fall action. They are the men's and women's tennis and men's and women's golf squads.

The men's soccer team, 14-2 overall and 5-1 in the OAC, is playing host to Wilmington College later tonight on the Tressel Field pitch. Action begins at 7:00 p.m.

The football team, 5-1 and 4-1 in the OAC played this afternoon at Wilmington College. The next home game is on Saturday, October 29 when B-W hosts the Fighting Muskies of Muskingum University on Professor Appreciation Day at 1:30 p.m.

The volleyball team was 14-12 overall and 2-4 in the OAC played this morning at Wilmington College. Junior outside hitter **Amanda Sawicki (Mentor/ Lake Catholic)** leads the offense and is second in the OAC with 315 kills. Junior setter **Natalie Emmons (Ashland)** anchors the defense and is third in the OAC with 503 digs. The next home match is on Tuesday, October 25 when the team hosts cross-town rival John Carroll University in its annual "Dig Pink" match in the Rudolph Ursprung Gymnasium in the Lou Higgins Center at 7:00 p.m.

The men's and women's cross country teams competed in its fifth meet of the season at the Oberlin College Inter-Regional last Saturday. The men finished 16th of 34 schools and the women were sixth of 33 teams. Junior **Ken Janosko (Mentor)** led the men and placed sixth of 315 runners. He has led the Yellow Jackets in each of their five meets this fall. Junior **Lauren McGaughey (Allison Park, Pa./ Hampton)** paced the women with a 22nd place finish. It was her first team top finish this season. Each team returns to action next Saturday, October 29 when they travel to Ada to compete in the 2011 OAC Championship Meet hosted by Ohio Northern at 11:00 a.m.

The men's and women's swimming and diving teams open its season next Saturday, October 29 when the teams play host to the Quakers of Wilmington College in an OAC dual meet at 4:00 p.m.

The Yellow Jacket wrestling team begins action under first-year Head Coach Jamie Gibbs with a dual match against Case Western Reserve University on November 11 at 7:30 p.m. in the Ursprung Gym.

The men's and women's basketball seasons kickoff on Tuesday, November 15 with a doubleheader in the Ursprung Gym at 6:00 (men's game) and 8:00 p.m. (women's game), respectively.

Yellow Jackets Host Wilmington College On Seniors' and Parents' Night

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College women's soccer team, 9-7 overall and 2-4 in the Ohio Athletic Conference plays host to the Wilmington College Quakers, 5-8-3 overall and 3-3 in the OAC, on Tressel Field at The George Finnie Stadium.

The Yellow Jackets come into the match after recording their fifth shutout of season after defeating the University of Mount Union by a final score of 2-0 on Tuesday night on the Tressel field pitch. With the win, B-W keep its OAC Tournament aspirations alive.

The Yellow Jackets are led by **Heather Keller** with four goals and a team-best five assists for 13 points. **Lindsey Cooper** is second on the team with 11 points on a team-high five goals and one assist. **Rachel Gokey**, who missed Tuesday night's match with an injury, has tallied three goals and three assists for nine points. **Kayla Losco** is fourth with a four goals and eight points.

In net, freshman **Gabrielle Bodo** has a record of 5-6 with 12 starts and three shutouts. **Bodo** has recorded 42 saves while allowing 16 goals for a 1.43 goals-against-average.

Wilmington comes into the match after being shutout by Ohio Northern on Tuesday night by a final score of 2-0. The Quakers surrendered two second half goals in the loss.

The Quakers are led by Lauren Price and Sarah Watters with 10 points. Price has tallied a team-high five goals while Watters has added four goals and two assists. Rachel Gutowski is third on the team with two goals and a team-high four assist for eight points.

Netminder Abbey Williamson anchors the defense. She has tallied 44 saves and has allowed just 18 goals in 11 games for a 1.71 GAA.

The Yellow Jackets are back in action on Wednesday, October 26 when they travel to Cleveland cross-town rival John Carroll University to take on the Blue Streaks at 4:00 p.m.

COACH AYERS APPROACHING 300 VICTORIES

Veteran Yellow Jacket Head Coach Reid Ayers enters tonight's doubleheader with 287 combined career victories (men's and women's) and needs 13 wins to capture his 300 career victory. On October 1, 2011, Ayers won his 200th career game as the Yellow Jacket head coach when the women defeated Marietta College 2-0 in the first game of a men's and women's doubleheader. In his nine seasons at B-W, Ayers has compiled an 89-84-21 women's record and an 118-59-15 men's record. Overall, he has a career record of 123-136-25 as a women's coach and 164-95-28 as a men's coach.
