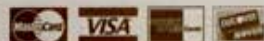

Fall Sports Report

BEREA, OHIO --The Baldwin-Wallace College fall sports teams are all of a fantastic start with a 41-12 record and a .774 winning percentage so far.

The football team (1-0) gets back to action this Saturday, September 17 when it hosts Ohio Athletic Conference rival Heidelberg at 6:30 p.m. on Community Night. The Yellow Jackets are coming off a 23-0 victory at Wooster on Sept. 1.

The men's soccer team (4-1) received a match-winning goal in the 105th-minute from senior **Carlin Vandendriessche (Medina)** to secure a 2-1 double-overtime victory at Centre College to capture the Centre tourney title. The men play at home tomorrow night against Case Western Reserve University at 7:00.

The volleyball team (8-1) is coming off a third place finish at the Marcia French Memorial Tournament last weekend and are off to the best start since 2006. B-W plays Hiram College tomorrow night at 7:00 in the Ursprung Gymnasium.

The men's golf team was third at the rain-shortened John Carroll University Pat Flowers Tournament that concluded yesterday. Junior Stephen Spalding (Stow/ Walsh Jesuit) led the way with a 109-stroke total for 27 holes. The men are at the OAC Invitational this Friday, hosted by Ohio Northern University, at the Colonial Players Club in Lima.

The women's golf team placed 10th at the prestigious O'Brien National Invitational, hosted by St. Mary's College on the campus of the University of Notre Dame in South Bend, Indiana. Eight of the Top-10 teams in the country competed. Sophomore Emilee Woolf (Ravenna) led the way as she fired consistent rounds of 86 and 85 for a 171-stroke total. The women are at the Wooster Invitational this Saturday.

The men's (13-3) and women's (13-4) cross country teams competed in their second meet of the season at the Ohio Wesleyan University last Saturday with the men placing fourth of 17 schools and the women fifth of 18 teams. Junior **Ken Janosko (Mentor)** led the men and placed third of 228 runners and junior **Sarah Rospert (Milan/Edison)** paced the women with a 10th place finish of 235 competitors. Both teams are back in action this weekend as they will compete at the Knight Invite at Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Michigan at 10:00 a.m.

The men's tennis team opens up its fall season this Saturday, September 17 when it travels to Canton to face NAIA Division II Malone University at 10:00 a.m. and then will take on Franciscan University at 4:00 p.m.

The women's tennis opened its fall season against a very strong NCAA Division II Mercyhurst (Pa.) College and competes again Friday-Sunday, Sept. 16-18 at the Oberlin Invitational Tournament.

The Yellow Jacket Women's Soccer Team Hosts Hiram College in its Home Opener in Berea

BEREA, OHIO -- The Baldwin-Wallace College women's soccer team, 2-2 overall, opens its 2011 home schedule tonight against traditional rival Hiram College on Tressel Field at The George Finnie Stadium.

The Yellow Jackets opened the season on Sept. 4 when they defeated host Penn State Behrend University, 3-2, and when junior forward Brigitte Petrash scored at the 88:32 mark to break a 2-2 deadlock. That win was followed by a 6-1 triumph at traditional rival Oberlin College and sophomore forward Heather Keller was the standout in that contest with a goal and a career-high three assists. Then came back-to-back shutout losses at the Transylvania University in Lexington, Kentucky to Centre (Ky.) College, 1-0, and Transylvania, 2-0. In each game, freshman goalie Gabrielle Bodo played well.

To date, the Yellow Jacket women are led offensively by sophomore midfielder Kayla Losco with three goals and six points, Keller with a goal and three assists for five markers and Petrash with two goals for four points. In goal, Bodo leads the way as has allowed five goals in 315 minutes of action for a 1.43 goal-against average with 16 saves.

Following tonight's contest, the Yellow Jackets are back in action this Saturday, Sept. 17 when they travel to Grove City, Pennsylvania and play Grove City College in the second game of a men's and women's doubleheader at 3:30 p.m. The men kickoff at 1:00 p.m.
