Major topics to be discussed include the great movements and protests of the era, the high tide of Liberalism with the New Frontier & Great Society, the counterculture, the Cold War & Vietnam and the resurgence of Conservatism. By focusing on political, social, cultural and economic developments from this defining period in American history, students will develop a deeper understanding of the most important decade in the second half of the twentieth century. Throughout the course, the important role and struggle of ordinary people to change the course of America will be highlighted.</p>
