Ohio License Exams:

Recommend completion of Ohio licensure exams prior to graduation. Eligible candidates must successfully complete Ohio license exam(s) in order to apply for initial licensure.

Minimum Credits Required: 135.5

Minimum Music Credits Required: 93.5

No more than four credits of D grades may be earned in MUC courses. Students must earn a C or better in courses marked with ^, a 3.000 in the Music Education core, and 3.000 overall to student teach. Students are also required to adhere to the standards and expectations of the teacher education program in the Division of Education as outlined in the Student Handbook (Education).

¹Three credits per semester for seven semesters.

²Secondary instrument is piano until Proficiency 4 is achieved. Depending upon placement results, piano study may occur in classes, lessons, or a combination. If the requisite proficiency is achieved in fewer than 4 semesters, continued piano study or study on another instrument is required. Secondary study beyond four semesters requires an additional fee.
